Another year is starting and how I do Praise the Lord for the privilege of serving Him here in Montana. This past year has been a time of rejoicing for the souls saved and for evidence of growth in some of the young Christians. Other things have given much cause for heartache and many sleepless nights. How I praise God that He alone has the answer. Our responsibility is to faithfully give out the Word and trust Him for the results.

Need I tell you that the days and nights too are very full here? I work part time, then there are two Bible Clubs during the week and the Sunday School, Morning Worship and Youth Meetings, on Sundays. All require preparation.

During the summer we had two successful Vacation Bible Schools. Both were well attended and we rejoiced especially at the regularity of the boys and girls. Souls were saved and the youngsters gave evidence of real knowledge of the Word.

The work grows slowly here. Butte remains a town controlled by Catholicism. Other ungodly sects are active too. Right now, I am busy answering questions about the Hormon religion. Every one is meeting the Mormon missionaries and hearing their doctrines. They then ask my opinion. My aim is always to give them the Word of God, and show the falsehood in the other doctrines. Do pray that I may always be wise in what I say. Our greatest need here is for consecrated Christian workers, and a breakdown of the indifference on the part of the adults in the community. Will you pray with us for these things, that the Lord Jesus Christ Day in all things be exalted here?
