PROGRESS OF COLLEGE

Dr. Lloyd Ramseyer, President of Bluffton College, and a representative of the Ohio College Association, visited the Cedarville College campus April 20, 1960. After his visit, Dr. Ramseyer wrote a letter telling of his reactions. He had many favorable comments regarding the progress of Cedarville College. In his letter he stated:

"The state and your church need Cedarville College. All of our institutions must do everything possible to do their work better from year to year.

"The study of campus problems which goes on throughout the year is also helpful, as well as a visit from a co-ordinator. This has nothing to do with accreditation, but it does help a college improve itself, ultimately leading to accreditation."

It is in this spirit that self-evaluation study is now being performed by the administration and faculty of Cedarville College.

Several committees were appointed by President Jeremiah to gather the information for the study. Among the committees, there was an Alumni Committee appointed, and those serving on this committee are Dr. Williams, Chairman; Mr. Bartholomew '57; Mr. Gromacki; and Miss White '56.

The Alumni Committee were to report on the following:

1. Aid in placement of graduates.
2. Occupation of graduates in light of purpose of college.
3. Success of graduates in work.
 - a. Advanced training.
 - b. Job situation.
4. Keeping alumni informed about the college.
5. General alumni records.

The purpose of this self-study is to help the administration, faculty and trustees of Cedarville College assess the strengths and weaknesses of the school, so that Cedarville College might continue to improve and develop through prayerful consideration and God's leading.

Also, we are trusting that the findings of this Alumni Committee will be very beneficial to us in showing us just what we can do to make it a strong association.
