B.B.I. COMMENCEMENT

Our seventh annual Commencement Exercises will be held May 29th in the Hough Avenue Baptist Church at 7:45 p.m. The Speaker of the evening who will bring the message to the 1952 graduates and friends of the Baptist Bible Institute will be Rev. Edward C. Bomm, associate treasurer of the Association of Baptists for World Evangelism.

The Rev. Mr. Bomm is a veteran missionary having given many years of faithful service in the Philippine Islands. He served as director of the Bible Institute in Manila. During World War II, he was chief negotiator between the Christian missionaries and the Japanese. He and Mrs. Bomm, along with others, suffered severe deprivations and near death at Sana Tomas Prison. After their liberation, Mr. Bomm remained in the Philippine Islands to supervise the reconstruction work after the war. His experiences of God's presence and power during missionary service will thrill the hearts of all in attendance.
