CEDARVILLE BAPTIST COLLEGE AND BIBLE INSTITUTE

Perhaps many of you have heard a little bit about B.B.I. acquiring the property of Cedarville College and have been wondering about some of the details. Portions of a lotter sent cut by Allan E. Lewis, president of B.B.I., to the pastors of Chio Regular Baptist Churches is printed below and will supply some additional information.

"I wish that you could have been with us as our committee recently visited Cedarville College at Cedarville, Ohio. You would have seen a pleasant, little college on a fifteen acre campus, with nine well-kept buildings; administration building, science building, library, gymnasium, three dormitories, biological laboratory, and recreation building. This fully equipped college is carried on their books at a conservative value of over \$250,000. It has been offered to the Baptist Bible Institute for the amount of its current operating deficit of \$25,000 or less.

With no cash in the bank, but with faith in the power and provision of God, the B.B.I. trustees moved to present our offer to the Cedarville College trustees. Other groups were also interested in obtaining the property, but through a miracle of God's grace, the offer of B.B.I. was accepted. With an additional \$25,000, or a grand total of \$50,000, we can transfer the B.B.I. day school to Cedarville this fall."
