TONIGHT'S GAME

The Cedarville University women's soccer team hosts the Ursuline College Arrows in an important Great Midwest Athletic Conference contest tonight at Yellow Jacket Field. It is the final regular season game of the 2015 schedule for CU.

The Lady Jackets are 10-4-3 (7-3-3 G-MAC) on the year after a 6-0 shutout over visiting league foe Ohio Valley on Saturday.

The Arrows enter tonight's encounter with a 9-6-1 mark (8-4-1 G-MAC) with their most recent action a 14-0 conference win against Salem International on Saturday in Pepper Pike, Ohio.

Head Coach John McGillivray is in his 42nd season coaching soccer at CU - 18th with the women (157-153-31).

Senior forward Jacoby Ziegler is CU's leading scorer with 18 goals and six assists for 42 points. Ziegler is now 2nd all-time in scoring at CU with 58 goals and 19 assists for 135 points.

The Lady Jackets second-best scorer is junior midfielder Grace Miorelli with 10 goals and a team-best 11 assists for 31 points. Miorelli is doubtful for action in the near future after suffering a shoulder injury versus OVU.



Jacoby Ziegler

Senior forward Kaitlyn Stiles is CU's third-leading scorer with 10 goals and six assists for 26 points.

Rookie forward Alyssa Maillefer has tallied six goals to go with four assists and a fourth-best 16 points.

Junior keeper Hanna Harris, with six clean slates this season, is the all-time leader in career shutouts at Cedarville with 22. She is allowing 0.61 goals per game this fall which is second-best in the Great Midwest Athletic Conference.

Ursuline is under the direction of Head Coach Jason Kubbins. He is in his tenth season with the program (94-77-6).

Senior forward Vanessa Consiglio tops the Arrows attack with 15 goals and eight assists for 38 points - third-best in the G-MAC. Junior midfielder/forward Cassie Cripe adds eight goals and eight assists for a second-best 24 points. Freshman keeper Sam Hudson has been filling in for injured starter Helen Jazzar.

Ursuline leads the all-time series with CU by a 6-5-2 margin. The teams tied 1-1 in double overtime earlier this season on October 1 in Pepper Pike, Ohio.

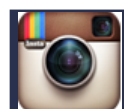

LAST TIME ON THE PITCH - 10/24/15

CEDARVILLE, Ohio - Cedarville honored its 11 graduating seniors and then four of them accounted for all of the scoring in a 6-0 G-MAC decision over Ohio Valley.

The Lady Jackets, who netted all six goals in the second half, improved to 10-4-3 overall and 7-3-3 G-MAC. It's the program's third straight 10-win season.

A stiff head wind left CU scoreless at the break. Once Kaitlyn Stiles headed in a cross from Jacoby Ziegler in the 52nd minute, the outcome was never in question.

A steal by Stiles and a strike from 10 yards out in the 58th minute made it 2-0.

Ziegler headed in a cross from Chandra Swiech before Carly Gregory struck for back-to-back headers. The first was set up by Kylie Faxon and Sam Newman with Swiech assisting on the second.

Katie Wormald finished off a lofted pass from Lyndsey Smith in the 85th minute to close the scoring. The Jackets outshot the visitors 34-5 overall and 19-1 on goal.

HEAD COACH JOHN MCGILLIVRAY



John McGillivray is one of the most well-respected soccer coaches in the state of Ohio and has been coaching soccer at Cedarville University since 1974.

McGillivray has been the head coach of the Lady Jackets since 1998. He served as the Cedarville men's head coach from 1974 through 1997.

Coupled with the 147 wins with the women, McGillivray has 362 total soccer victories at CU. His 300th overall win came in a 5-0 decision over Grace on Aug. 28, 2008. He picked up his 100th victory with the Lady Jackets in a 2-1 result at Point Park on Oct. 17, 2009.

McGillivray has enjoyed eight winning seasons with the Lady Jackets including a best-ever 15-7 mark in 2013. CU led the Great Midwest Athletic Conference with a 9-1 regular season mark and McGillivray was voted G-MAC Coach of the Year.

Cedarville finished 13-8-2 in 2004, won NCCAA Midwest Region championship, and secured an automatic berth in the NCCAA National Tournament. The 2000 club had a 12-7-2 record and made the school's first-ever NCCAA championship appearance in women's soccer.

McGillivray and his teams have long been recognized for their sportsmanlike behavior. His Lady Jackets twice received the Fair Play Team Award from the American Midwest Conference for their exemplary conduct on the field.

He was presented the first-ever Distinguished Merit Award in 1990 by the Ohio Collegiate Soccer Officials Association. The National Intercollegiate Soccer Officials Association honored him in 1992 with their National Merit Award.

The Springfield, Ohio native led his men's teams to eight Mid-Ohio Conference titles, five NCCAA District III banners, three NAIA District 22 championships, and one NAIA Area IV crown which carried with it a trip to the NAIA Nationals in 1974. He guided his squad to five NCCAA National Tournament appearances, a pair of NCCAA National Runner-Up finishes and he was chosen NCCAA National Coach of the Year in 1981.

McGillivray served at all levels of NAIA soccer including president of the NAIA Soccer Coaches Association from 1983 through 1985. He was inducted into the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1991 and the NAIA Hall of Fame in 1993.

McGillivray, who is an associate professor in the Department of Kinesiology and Allied Health, is a 1970 graduate of Cedarville College, and he earned his master's degree in 1976 from the University of Dayton. John and his wife, Bonnie, reside in Cedarville and have five children and 16 grandchildren.

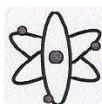

The Trojans sustained their second-half surge through the conference schedule with the help of Hoffman, who found her way on the scoresheet in critical wins vs. G-MAC-leading Davis & Elkins and Alderson Broaddus.

Hoffman scored one goal in each game -- effectively tying her for the program's single-season goals record -- as TNU has won seven of its last eight (7-0-1).

Her goal against Davis & Elkins was No. 11 on the fall and the Trojans handed the Senators just their second league loss.

Hoffman broke a scoreless contest open in the 58th minute after finding a crease in the D&E defense with the help of a pass from Courtney Dyer.

The Trojans picked up their second shutout of the week as Hoffman gave her team a 3-0 lead after a goal early in the first half against Alderson Broaddus. TNU would win that contest, 4-0.

Hoffman, from Chattanooga, Tenn., now has 29 goals in her career -- just two away from matching the school's all-time record of 31 held by Brooke Gann.

The Great Midwest Athletic Conference (G-MAC), was approved by the NCAA Division II Membership Committee in February of 2012 as a member conference and earned active status in July of 2013, after completing an educational assessment program in 2012-13. The conference began competition as the 24th active NCAA Division II conference in 2013-14.

The G-MAC features both active and reclassifying members from Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee, and West Virginia. Charter members of the G-MAC included Cedarville University, Kentucky Wesleyan College, Trevecca Nazarene University, and Ursuline College.

The G-MAC expanded with the inclusion of Alderson Broaddus University, Davis & Elkins College, Ohio Valley University, and Salem International University as active DII members. Recently, Malone University has announced it will be joining the G-MAC in 2016-17 as a full member, and then the University of Findlay, Hillsdale College, Lake Erie College, Ohio Dominican University, and Walsh University will join in 2017-18.

The G-MAC, headquartered in the Indianapolis metro area, will sponsor 18 championships in 2015-16 as an active NCAA Division II conference.

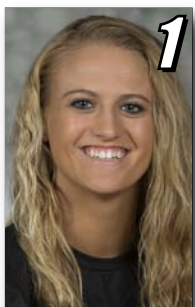
