LADY JACKET SOCCER BLOG

Oct. 19, 2015

TONIGHT'S GAME

The Cedarville University women's soccer team hosts the Ohio Valley University Fighting Scots in a Great Midwest Athletic Conference contest tonight at Yellow Jacket Field.

The Lady Jackets are 9-4-3 (6-3-3 G-MAC) on the year after a 12-0 blanking of visiting league foe Salem International on Thursday.

The Fighting Scots enter tonight's encounter with a 1-13 mark (1-11 G-MAC) with their most recent action a 7-0 conference loss at Ursuline on Thursday in Pepper Pike, Ohio.

Head Coach John McGillivray is in his 43rd season coaching soccer at CU - 18th with the women (156-153-31).

Senior forward Jacoby Ziegler is CU's leading scorer with 17 goals and five assists for 39 points. Ziegler is now 2nd all-time in scoring at CU with 57 goals and 18 assists for 132 points.

The Lady Jackets second-best scorer is junior midfielder Grace Miorelli with 10 goals and a team-best 11 assists for 31 points.

Senior forward Kaitlyn Stiles is CU's third-leading scorer with eight goals and six assists for 22 points.

Rookie forward Alyssa Maillefer has tallied six goals to go with four assists and a fourth-best 16 points. Freshman Hannah Whicker and junior Olivia Moore have each scored five goals.

Junior keeper Hanna Harris, with six clean slates this season, is now the all-time leader in career shutouts at Cedarville with 22. She is allowing 0.61 goals per game this fall which is second-best in the Great Midwest Athletic Conference.

OVU is under the direction of fifth-year Head Coach Jack Flynn.

Freshman forward Andrea Borray-Ortiz tops the Ohio Valley attack with 11 goals for 22 points. Junior midfielder Naschena Richards leads OVU with four assists. Rookie keeper Precious McIntosh has allowed 53 goals in 13 games with a 4.99 goals against average.

Cedarville leads the all-time series with OVU by a 4-0 margin that includes a 21-1 tally in goals scored. The Lady Jackets posted an 8-1 decision over the Fighting Scots on Sept. 10 in Vienna, West Virginia.

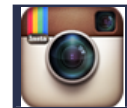

LAST TIME ON THE PITCH - 10/22/15

CEDARVILLE, Ohio - Eleven different players contributed to the scoring as the Lady Jackets overwhelmed Salem International, 12-0, in a G-MAC women's soccer contest.

Kaitlyn Stiles racked up two goals and three assists to lead the onslaught for Cedarville, 9-4-3 overall and 6-3-3 G-MAC.

It was 3-0 at the intermission. The hosts buried eight goals in a span of 12 minutes early in the second half and added the final tally in the 70th minute.

Jacoby Ziegler and Grace Miorelli each recorded two goals and an assist.

Alyssa Maillefer had a goal and three assists while Hannah Whicker added a goal and two assists.

Carly Gregory, Carla Halvorson, Danielle Mahek, and Katie Wormald scored one goal apiece. Carissa Van Dyck chipped in two assists and Rachel Hooper had one.

Despite getting just two touches of the ball during the contest, Hanna Harris is credited with her 22nd career shutout and league-leading sixth of the season.

HEAD COACH JOHN MCGILLIVRAY



John McGillivray is one of the most well-respected soccer coaches in the state of Ohio and has been coaching soccer at Cedarville University since 1974.

McGillivray has been the head coach of the Lady Jackets since 1998. He served as the Cedarville men's head coach from 1974 through 1997.

Coupled with the 147 wins with the women, McGillivray has 362 total soccer victories at CU. His 300th overall win came in a 5-0 decision over Grace on Aug. 28, 2008. He picked up his 100th victory with the Lady Jackets in a 2-1 result at Point Park on Oct. 17, 2009.

McGillivray has enjoyed eight winning seasons with the Lady Jackets including a best-ever 15-7 mark in 2013. CU led the Great Midwest Athletic Conference with a 9-1 regular season mark and McGillivray was voted G-MAC Coach of the Year.

Cedarville finished 13-8-2 in 2004, won NCCAA Midwest Region championship, and secured an automatic berth in the NCCAA National Tournament. The 2000 club had a 12-7-2 record and made the school's first-ever NCCAA championship appearance in women's soccer.

McGillivray and his teams have long been recognized for their sportsmanlike behavior. His Lady Jackets twice received the Fair Play Team Award from the American Midwest Conference for their exemplary conduct on the field.

He was presented the first-ever Distinguished Merit Award in 1990 by the Ohio Collegiate Soccer Officials Association. The National Intercollegiate Soccer Officials Association honored him in 1992 with their National Merit Award.

The Springfield, Ohio native led his men's teams to eight Mid-Ohio Conference titles, five NCCAA District III banners, three NAIA District 22 championships, and one NAIA Area IV crown which carried with it a trip to the NAIA Nationals in 1974. He guided his squad to five NCCAA National Tournament appearances, a pair of NCCAA National Runner-Up finishes and he was chosen NCCAA National Coach of the Year in 1981.

McGillivray served at all levels of NAIA soccer including president of the NAIA Soccer Coaches Association from 1983 through 1985. He was inducted into the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1991 and the NAIA Hall of Fame in 1993.

McGillivray, who is an associate professor in the Department of Kinesiology and Allied Health, is a 1970 graduate of Cedarville College, and he earned his master's degree in 1976 from the University of Dayton. John and his wife, Bonnie, reside in Cedarville and have five children and 16 grandchildren.

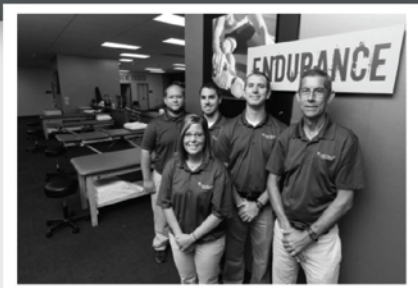

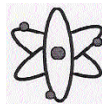

Duke and the Panthers have surged through the second half of the conference schedule, taking down Cedarville and Ursuline with two impressive wins in Owensboro.

Versus Cedarville, she snapped a scoreless game in the 51st minute as the Panthers eventually blanked the Yellow Jackets, 2-0.

On Saturday, Duke scored the game-tying goal against Ursuline and assisted on the game winner, feeding Breigh Haase for the decisive score late in the second half.

The Great Midwest Athletic Conference (G-MAC), was approved by the NCAA Division II Membership Committee in February of 2012 as a member conference and earned active status in July of 2013, after completing an educational assessment program in 2012-13. The conference began competition as the 24th active NCAA Division II conference in 2013-14.

The G-MAC features both active and reclassifying members from Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee, and West Virginia. Charter members of the G-MAC included Cedarville University, Kentucky Wesleyan College, Trevecca Nazarene University, and Ursuline College.

The G-MAC expanded with the inclusion of Alderson Broaddus University, Davis & Elkins College, Ohio Valley University, and Salem International University as active DII members. Recently, Malone University has announced it will be joining the G-MAC in 2016-17 as a full member, and then the University of Findlay, Hillsdale College, Lake Erie College, Ohio Dominican University, and Walsh University will join in 2017-18.

The G-MAC, headquartered in the Indianapolis metro area, will sponsor 18 championships in 2015-16 as an active NCAA Division II conference.
