LADY JACKET SOCCER BLOG

Oct. 19, 2015

Hi everyone! I am writing this blog as I am recovering from a wonderful Thursday to Saturday Fall Break soccer road trip. TONIGHT'S GAME

The Cedarville University women's soccer team hosts the Salem International University Tigers in a Great Midwest Athletic Conference contest tonight at Yellow Jacket Field.

The Lady Jackets are 8-4-3 (5-3-3 G-MAC) on the year after a 1-1 double-overtime verdict at Trevecca University on Saturday in Nashville, Tennessee.

The Tigers enter tonight's encounter with an 0-11 mark (0-11 G-MAC) with their most recent action an 18-1 setback to visiting Davis & Elkins - the top team in the G-MAC - on Saturday.

Head Coach John McGillivray is in his 43rd season coaching soccer at CU - 18th with the women (155-153-31).

Senior forward Jacoby Ziegler is CU's leading scorer with 15 goals and four assists for 34 points. Ziegler is now 2nd all-time in scoring at CU with 55 goals and 17 assists for 127 points.

The Lady Jackets second-best scorer is junior midfielder Grace Miorelli with eight goals and a team-best 10 assists for 26 points.

Senior forward Kaitlyn Stiles is CU's third-leading scorer with six goals and three assists for 15 points.

Junior Olivia Moore and rookie Alyssa Maillefer have each scored five goals in the 2015 campaign.

Junior keeper Hanna Harris, with five clean slates this season, is now the all-time leader in career shutouts at Cedarville with 21. She is allowing 0.66 goals per game this fall.

Salem International is under the direction of first-year Head Coach Whitney Brydge

Junior midfielder Jesse Browne has the lone goal of the year for the Tigers as SIU has been outscored 139-1 in their 11 games. Five of the 12 shots by Salem have been on goal. Keepers Bre'Ana Felix and Natalia Rodriguez have split time in the nets.

Cedarville leads the all-time series with SIU by a 4-0 margin that includes a 38-0 tally in goals scored. The Lady Jackets posted a 13-0 decision over the Tigers on Oct. 6 in Salem, West Virginia as CU set a new school record for most goals in a single game. Freshman Hannah Whicker led the way with a hat trick and an assist. Senior Jacoby Ziegler tallied twice to become Cedarville's all-time leader in career goals scored.

LAST TIME ON THE PITCH - 10/17/15

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Cedarville and Trevecca played to a 1-1 draw for the second time this season in a Great Midwest Athletic Conference rematch.

Just like the first meeting, a 1-1 deadlock on the Lady Jackets' home turf on Sept. 24, the Trojans scored first and it was up to CU to answer.

TNU got on the board in the 25th minute. Jacoby Ziegler headed in the equalizer just nine minutes later for the visitors, 8-4-3 overall and 5-3-3 G-MAC.

Ziegler got the play started with a long ball up the right side. Kylie Faxon laid it back to Stephanie Craddock whose cross into the box was timed perfectly by the senior forward for her 15th goal of the season.

Hanna Harris made four saves in goal. Trevecca had the slight edge in shots overall, 12-10, but Cedarville had more on goal, 6-5.

Numbers Game:

- The Jackets finished the road portion of the schedule with a 4-2-2 record.
- They were outshot for the first time since Trevecca did it eight games ago in Cedarville.
- Ziegler's goal was the 55th of her career.
- Cedarville has outscored the opposition 53-12 this fall and has allowed two goals in a match only twice.
- The Lady Jackets are 1-4-2 all-time vs. the Trojans.

HEAD COACH JOHN MCGILLIVRAY



John McGillivray is one of the most well-respected soccer coaches in the state of Ohio and has been coaching soccer at Cedarville University since 1974.

McGillivray has been the head coach of the Lady Jackets since 1998. He served as the Cedarville men's head coach from 1974 through 1997.

Coupled with the 147 wins with the women, McGillivray has 362 total soccer victories at CU. His 300th overall win came in a 5-0 decision over Grace on Aug. 28, 2008. He picked up his 100th victory with the Lady Jackets in a 2-1 result at Point Park on Oct. 17, 2009.

McGillivray has enjoyed eight winning seasons with the Lady Jackets including a best-ever 15-7 mark in 2013. CU led the Great Midwest Athletic Conference with a 9-1 regular season mark and McGillivray was voted G-MAC Coach of the Year.

Cedarville finished 13-8-2 in 2004, won NCCAA Midwest Region championship, and secured an automatic berth in the NCCAA National Tournament. The 2000 club had a 12-7-2 record and made the school's first-ever NCCAA championship appearance in women's soccer.

McGillivray and his teams have long been recognized for their sportsmanlike behavior. His Lady Jackets twice received the Fair Play Team Award from the American Midwest Conference for their exemplary conduct on the field.

He was presented the first-ever Distinguished Merit Award in 1990 by the Ohio Collegiate Soccer Officials Association. The National Intercollegiate Soccer Officials Association honored him in 1992 with their National Merit Award.

The Springfield, Ohio native led his men's teams to eight Mid-Ohio Conference titles, five NCCAA District III banners, three NAIA District 22 championships, and one NAIA Area IV crown which carried with it a trip to the NAIA Nationals in 1974. He guided his squad to five NCCAA National Tournament appearances, a pair of NCCAA National Runner-Up finishes and he was chosen NCCAA National Coach of the Year in 1981.

McGillivray served at all levels of NAIA soccer including president of the NAIA Soccer Coaches Association from 1983 through 1985. He was inducted into the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1991 and the NAIA Hall of Fame in 1993.

McGillivray, who is an associate professor in the Department of Kinesiology and Allied Health, is a 1970 graduate of Cedarville College, and he earned his master's degree in 1976 from the University of Dayton. John and his wife, Bonnie, reside in Cedarville and have five children and 16 grandchildren.

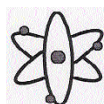

Kentucky Wesleyan senior forward Katlyn Duke is the seventh Great Midwest Athletic Conference Women's Soccer Athlete of the Week for the fall on Monday.

Duke and the Panthers have surged through the second half of the conference schedule, taking down Cedarville and Ursuline with two impressive wins in Owensboro.

Versus Cedarville, she snapped a scoreless game in the 51st minute as the Panthers eventually blanked the Yellow Jackets, 2-0.

On Saturday, Duke scored the game-tying goal against Ursuline and assisted on the game winner, feeding Breigh Haase for the decisive score late in the second half.

Kentucky Wesleyan (9-3-0, 8-3-0 G-MAC) has won six straight and climbed to second in the conference standings.

The Panthers also avenged losses earlier in the year against both Cedarville and Ursuline to help their playoff positioning with the G-MAC Championship approaching quickly.

In all 12 games played this year, Duke has tallied 14 goals and a pair of assists. Her team-high 30 points ranks fourth in the conference this fall.

The Great Midwest Athletic Conference (G-MAC), was approved by the NCAA Division II Membership Committee in February of 2012 as a member conference and earned active status in July of 2013, after completing an educational assessment program in 2012-13. The conference began competition as the 24th active NCAA Division II conference in 2013-14.

The G-MAC features both active and reclassifying members from Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee, and West Virginia. Charter members of the G-MAC included Cedarville University, Kentucky Wesleyan College, Trevecca Nazarene University, and Ursuline College.

The G-MAC expanded with the inclusion of Alderson Broaddus University, Davis & Elkins College, Ohio Valley University, and Salem International University as active DII members. Recently, Malone University has announced it will be joining the G-MAC in 2016-17 as a full member, and then the University of Findlay, Hillsdale College, Lake Erie College, Ohio Dominican University, and Walsh University will join in 2017-18.

The G-MAC, headquartered in the Indianapolis metro area, will sponsor 18 championships in 2015-16 as an active NCAA Division II conference.

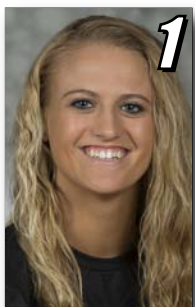
