

October 20, 2015

The Blog, "A tradition unlike any other."

It was another week to remember for your Yellow Jacket men's soccer team. It saw us in four states, at three different schools (including the land of the free and the home of the Jackets), missing two much-loved freshmen and with one shiny new ACL.

Tonight's Game


The Cedarville University men's soccer team hosts the Ohio Valley University Fighting Scots in a Great Midwest Athletic Conference game tonight at Yellow Jacket Field.

The Jackets are currently 12-3-1 overall (9-2 G-MAC) and are ranked #4 in the first NCAA II Midwest Regional Rankings of 2015. The Yellow Jackets most recent contest was a 3-2 league win over visiting Salem International on Thursday which clinched the G-MAC regular season title and the right to host the conference semifinals and finals.

The Fighting Scots are 8-5-1 in 2015 with a 6-3-1 conference record. Their most recent contest was a 4-0 non-league loss to NSCAA NCAA II #20 Urbana on Wednesday in Vienna, West Virginia.

The Yellow Jackets, under the direction of thirdyear Head Coach Brett Faro (39-10-7), have won four straight G-MAC contests and are led on the offensive side by senior forward Connor Gilmour with 14 goals and an assist for 29 points. Gilmour is tied for sixth all-time at CU with 40 goals scored in three seasons.

Senior midfielder Zachary Harris is the secondleading scorer with five goals - including Thursday's game-winner - and an assist for 11 points. Junior forward Jon Brown leads the team with seven assists to go with one goal for a third-best nine points.



Junior keeper Paulo Pinto is seeing the majority of action in the nets for the Jackets. He has posted five shutouts and is allowing a G-MAC leading 0.92 goals per game.

Luis Rincon, a former standout keeper and Assistant Coach at Texas A&M International, is in his first season as Head Coach at Ohio Vallev.

The Fighting Scots are led by Ignacio Gonzalez, a freshman forward, with four goals and a teamhigh six assists for 14 points. Angel Riano, a junior forward, is OVU's second-leading scorer with four goals and two assists for 10 points. Junior midfielder Christian Galindo has added two goals and five assists for a third-best nine points.

Sophomore keeper Carlos Rubio has logged every minute in the nets this season for OVU. He has posted six shutouts with a 1.24 goals against

Last Time On The Pitch -

CEDARVILLE, Ohio - Zachary Harris' strike in the 89th minute gave the Yellow Jackets a 3-2 verdict over Salem International to clinch the top seed in the upcoming G-MAC Tournament.

Two-time defending champion Cedarville, 12-3-1 overall and 9-2 G-MAC, earns a first round bye and will host the conference semifinals and final on Nov. 5 and 7.

It will be the second year in a row and the third time in four years for the Yellow Jackets to serve as

The outcome was in jeopardy until Harris, who started CU on its fourgame winning streak with a 96th-minute winner at Alderson Broaddus on Oct. 10, rose to the occasion with 1:51 remaining.

Jon Brown tapped a short pass at the top of the box to the senior midfielder, who in turn poked a high shot into the net from 12 yards out. It was his fifth goal of the season and third game winner.

The Yellow Jackets took a 2-0 lead in the first half. Joel Fullmer finished off a through ball from Jared Newman in the 6th minute for his first collegiate goal. Paul Messerly's restart 50 yards out was headed in by the SIU defense for an own goal in the 24th minute.

The Tigers crawled back into the contest with scores in the 35th and 57th minutes which eventually led to Harris' heroics

HEAD COACH BRETT FARO



Brett Faro has been the head men's soccer coach at Cedarville University since the 2013 season after serving as the program's top assistant for two years. He's guided the Yellow Jackets to back-to-back Great Midwest Athletic Conference championships.

CU finished 14-4-2 overall and 7-0-1 during the 2014 campaign. The Jackets hosted the G-MAC Tournament and defeated Davis & Elkins, 1-0, in the title match.

Faro was named the program's interim head coach in July, 2013 and later had the interim tag removed in November just before the G-MAC Tournament. Cedarville played host and #1 seed D&E to a 0-0 draw in the final and then claimed the trophy on penalty kicks. The Jackets ended up 13-3-4 overall and 6-1-1 G-MAC.

CU has gone 58-17-10 since Faro's arrival including a schoolrecord 17 victories in 2012. The Jackets won the 2011 NCCAA Midwest Region banner and placed third at the national tournament

Faro came to Cedarville after serving as an assistant coach at the United States Naval Academy during the 2010 campaign. He helped guide the Midshipmen to a 7-5-4 record.

Faro has been involved in multiple levels of soccer in coaching and administration. He coached the U17 Maryland Nike Rush '93 in 2010-11 and helped lead the NCSL Division I squad to three tournament championships.

Faro was team manager of Sky Blue FC of Women's

Professional Soccer in 2010. He also coached and trained players in the Hershey Youth Soccer Club in 2007 and 2008.

Faro was a four-year standout during his playing career at perennial NCAA Division III powerhouse Messiah College from 2005-09. He was a member of four national championship teams, was a two-time team captain, and tied the school record for the most games played in a career with 99.

Faro is a 2009 graduate of Messiah with a degree in sports management. He was a Dean's List student at the school and was recognized as an NSCAA Academic All-Region Scholar-Athlete.

Faro earned a master's degree in coaching and athletic administration from Concordia University Irvine (Calif.) in 2014. He also possesses an NSCAA national diploma.

Brett and his wife, Shelley, were married on May 31, 2014. They reside in Xenia.



Recently, Malone University has announced it will be joining the G-MAC in 2016-17 as a full member, and then the University of Findlay, Hillsdale College, Lake Erie College, Ohio Dominican University, and Walsh University will join in 2017-18.






