Loud warm-up music. Coach dancing to that music. Five more matches. Dairy Queen. Bus rides. Hot gym. West Virginia. UNDEFEATED. That's right - nine matches into the season, five of them this past week, and the Lady Jackets are still contenders with the CU mens' soccer team to see who can remain undefeated the longest.

We started off this week with our home opener against Malone University on Tuesday! It is always a good day when we beat Malone especially on our home court. Last year we beat them at their place, and then they came to ours and beat us. We were not going to let that happen again. We started the first set against them very strong and led 75% of the time, but just couldn't quite finish it. In the second set we flipped the switch and beat them handily. 

Today's Matches

The Cedarville University women's volleyball team hosts the Kentucky State University Thorobrettes and the West Liberty University Hilltoppers in a tri-match today in the Callan Athletic Center.

The Lady Jackets, under the leadership of fifth-year Head Coach Doug Walters, enter today's action with a 9-1 record and a #1 ranking in this week's National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) Division LPoll

CU had their season-opening nine-match winning streak snapped by the University of Southern Indiana on Tuesday night in Evansville, Indiana by scores of 25-20, 25-10, 22-25, 30-28.

Sophomore outside hitter Hannah Wagner, the reigning G-MAC Player of the Week, leads the offensive attack for Cedarville with 2.83 kills per set.

Junior middle hitter Stephanie Rogers, 2011 NCCAA All-American, is second with 2.47 kills per set while pacing the squad with a .268 attack percentage.

Setters senior Erica Bartholomew and sophomore Maddie Anderson direct CU's offense. Anderson leads the team with 237 assists Bartholomew has handed out 172 assists and ranks fourth all-time at CU with 3,630.

The Thorobrettes of Kentucky State enter today's tri-match with a 4-6 record in 2012. KSU is an NCAA II member of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) and is located in Frankfort, Kentucky. This will be the first-ever meeting on the volleyball court between Cedarville and Kentucky State.

The Hilltoppers of West Liberty University are 4-5 in the early going of the 2012 campaign. West Liberty is an NCAA II member of the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC) and is located in West Liberty, West Virginia. Cedarville has won both previous volleyball meetings with the Hilltoppers.



Meet Coach Doug Walters



Doug Walters has been the head volleyball coach at Cedarville University since 2008. He is the sixth head coach in the program's history and the first male to serve in the capacity.

The Lady Jackets have posted 82 victories during Walters' four-year tenure. CU finished with a 22-18 mark in 2011 during the school's NCAA Division II provisional year and was the No. 1 seed in the Ohio Independent Championship Tournament.

Walters' first season with the Lady Jackets was a memorable one as he guided the program to its third National Christian College Athletic Association title in four years. He was tabbed the 2008 NCCAA National Coach of the Year.

Cedarville finished with a 27-12 record overall and tied for fourth place out of 15 teams in the American Mideast Conference with a 10-4 mark. The Lady Jackets qualified for the AMC Tournament and advanced to the semifinals.

Cedarville was 15-23 overall in 2009. However, the Lady Jackets were the #2 seed in the AMC Tournament after going 8-4 in the league. CU was 18-20 and 6-4 AMC in 2010 while advancing to the semifinals of the conference tournament.

Walters came to Cedarville after assembling a 128-73 record in nine years of high school coaching in southern Ohio. He spent his last two seasons at the prep level at Milford High School, a Division I program near Cincinnati.

Walters previously spent seven years building Eastern High School in Sardinia into one of the top Division III programs in Ohio. The Warriors, who were ranked in the state's Top 10 in three different seasons, won four conference titles, two sectional championships, and were the district runner-up once. He was a fourtime conference Coach of the Year and saw eight players continue their careers at the collegiate level.

Walters is the founder and former director of the Greater Miami Volleyball Club. The GMVC was started in 2003 and is a Junior Olympic organization that has quickly built a reputation as one of the top regional clubs in Cincinnati.

Walters continues to be involved at the club level. He is the Elevation Volleyball Club 17's National Team Coach based out of Mason, Ohio.

Additionally, Walters is the volleyball chair of the Great Midwest Athletic Conference. He serves as the G-MAC rep to the AVCA Division II Head Coaches Committee and is a member of the AVCA National Poll Committee.

Walters is a 1997 graduate of Northern Kentucky University and he earned his master's degree from the University of Dayton in 2003. Doug and his wife, Angela, reside in Hamersville, Ohio with their daughter Caitlyn, 10.

The Great Midwest Athletic Conference (G-MAC), which was approved by the NCAA Division II Membership Committee in February of 2012 as a member conference effective September 1, 2012, will be working through an educational assessment program with the goal of beginning competition as the 24th active NCAA Division II conference by 2013-14.

The G-MAC features active and reclassifying members from Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia. Charter members of the G-MAC include Cedarville University, Central State University, Kentucky Wesleyan College, Trevecca Nazarene University, Urbana University and Ursuline College. The G-MAC expanded with the inclusion of Alderson-Broaddus College, Davis & Elkins College, and Ohio Valley University as active DII members in 2012.

The University of Virginia's College at Wise was approved as a Full Member, while Georgetown College was added as a Provisional Member in 2012 as well.

The G-MAC, headquartered in the Indianapolis metro area, will sponsor 12 championships in 2012-13 as a NCAA Division II member conference.



The annual popular Fair was again held in the Dixon Ministry Center parking lot. Despite the hot and humid conditions, the members of the women's soccer team were there to assist.


