## THE PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Dear Friends of Cedarville College:

On Wednesday, September 12, classes began in the new fall semester at Cedarville College. As we look back over the summer months and look forward to the coming school year, we have many reasons to thank God for His faithfulness. "It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning: great is Thy faithfulness." Lamentations 3:22, 23. These words express our experience as individuals and as a school during the past days of this summer. Let me rehearse some of God's special blessings which have been showered upon us during these days.

By this time most of you know that we were able to liquidate our thirty thousand dollar indebtedness by July 15. You may be sure that this removes a great burden which was upon our hearts for such a long time. You have helped us by your prayers and gifts and we thank you sincerely for all you have done.

When it was our turn to visit the war surplus depot in Columbus, we were able to locate a Hammond organ for an unbelievably small sum. With our new Conn organ purchased a year ago, we are well able now to give organ lessons to our young people who are desirous of obtaining an A.B. degree with a major in music. With the coming of Professor Warren Webber and the continued help of Professor William Ambrose in the music department, we will be well qualified to give a thorough training in the field of music. For this, of course, we are very thankful to the Lord.

At the present time, about sixty-five new students have been enrolled in the college. This will bring our total enrollment to between 135 and 140. Our student body this year consists of young people from fifteen states plus Canada and Peru. The largest number of students comes to us from Ohio, Michigan, New York, and Pennsylvania; but there are also students from such faraway states as Vermont, Florida, Texas, and California.

As you probably know, we have added new faculty members to our staff, and our salary responsibilities have been increased. By the Lord's help we have won a great victory in liquidating our indebtedness. On the part of some there may be a tendency now to let up in giving to Cedarville. Let me impress upon your hearts, if I can, the necessity of not only giving to the general fund as we have during the past year, but increasing these gifts if at all possible. Actually, we

should receive in the general fund this year as much as we did last, plus the same amount of money which was given to the debt-retirement fund. Will you please pray about this need and give through your local church.

A number of churches have placed Cedarville College upon their regular missionary budgets. Others have preferred to use the Cedarville Day plan, which gives the people an opportunity each month to contribute to the cause of Cedarville College. For those of you who wish to follow this plan of giving, we will be more than glad to furnish a sufficient number of regular envelopes for this purpose. Write to our office today, and the envelopes will be sent out by return mail.

Our readers can be of great help to us if they will send us the names and addresses of individuals who may be interested in receiving our *College Bulletin*. We have discovered that the most fruitful way of telling the story of Cedarville is to present it by word and picture in our monthly school paper.

In this issue of our *Bulletin* you will read the testimonies of two of our new faculty members. We wish to welcome: Dr. C. R. Maddox as our Dean; Professor Warren Webber, who will teach music; Miss Ruth Kantzer, whose field will be English, and Miss Jean Fisher, who will teach Christian Education and be our school nurse. We trust that you will remember our faculty in prayer as together we seek to train these young people for a life of fruitfulness in the Lord's service.

## INTRODUCING OUR FACULTY



MISS RUTH KANTZER

Coming to us from the public high school in Ashland, Ohio, Miss Ruth Kantzer will be teaching our English courses. Miss Kantzer is a graduate of Ashland college and has taken graduate work in the field of English. She has had seven years experience as a teacher. She is a member of the new regular Baptist church in Ashland. She gives the following personal testimony:

Beginning classes with prayer is something entirely new for me. Although during the past eight years of teaching, I have had the habit of silently asking God's blessing upon the class work, the first that I ever prayed *with* my classes was this Wednesday, September 12. I count it a high privilege and I like it.

The joy of teaching in a Christian college was not what attracted me to Cedarville College; it was, rather, the joy of being in the will of the Lord which drew me here. In looking back over the past two or three years, I can simply praise God for the way He has directed my path.

From the earliest days that I can remember I have gone to the Lutheran church. Although I was born again when I was ten years old, it was not until very recently that I have known the happiness that belongs to those who separate themselves *unto* the fellowship of those who earnestly love the Lord Jesus Christ. The change took place two and a half years ago when a fundamental Baptist church was organized in Ashland, Ohio, my home town.

One year ago this past September 12, I was baptized by immersion. About this same time, the Lord led me to start graduate work at Oberlin College. In addition to these directings, I know that the Lord has been preparing me in my mind and heart for a change in location. Making this change was undoubtedly the hardest for me to understand, but even in this, the Holy Spirit had already prepared my heart so that

when the call to Cedarville came, the Lord had made the way, and the road ahead was clear.

Seeing then the great goodness of the Almighty God in guiding my life, I can only bow in submission for I know that "my times are in His hands" Who doeth all things well.

Miss Jean Fisher is a member of the Emmanuel Baptist Church of Dayton, Ohio. Last June she graduated from the Baptist Bible Seminary of Johnson City, N. Y., with the B.R.E. degree. Miss Fisher is also a trained nurse. Her responsibilities at Cedarville College will be three-fold: college nurse, girls' dorm supervisor and a teacher for our Christian education classes.
