Rusty King, a former standout runner and 1983 graduate of Cedarville High School, is in his rookie year as a member of the Cedarville College cross country team. A freshman music major at the college, Rusty is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Elvin King of 58 Center Street in Cedarville.

King has been running solidly in the number three position for the Yellow Jackets this fall under the tutelage of his father. Coach King mentioned, "Rusty has really been the one to make the team go. The main reason is because he is running better position wise than what we expected him to." King is a consistent runner which is supported by the fact that he has placed in the top six in each one of the team's first five meets. He earlier made the NCCAA District III team when he finished second in the district meet to help lead C.C. to the team title. King could be a worthy contender to make the NCCAA All-American squad which would be a great accomplishment for a freshman.

The Yellow Jackets possess the best cross country team in the school's history this year. Cedarville has already won two invitationals and finished second in two others. For the sixth straight year, the Jackets will host the national meet for the National Christian College Athletic Association on November 12 at John Bryan State Park. The team is also expected to qualify for the NAIA Nationals which will be run a week later in Kenosha, Wisconsin.
