PICK A PROJECT

Periodically we are asked, "What can we do as a church or a young people's society to help Cedarville College? Some of us have given to the general fund, but we would enjoy working on a special project." To answer these requests we list a number of projects which may interest you.

Books for the library are always needed and most acceptable. We now have approximately 17,000 volumes, but there are many required books which must be added if we are to bring the library up to standard. Books in the fields of history, science, education, and literature, as well as theology, will be gratefully received. If you are interested in this project and intend to buy new books, please ask our librarian to send you a list of the most needed volumes. Send any available used books to the college library.

In order to give more of our students an opportunity to engage in sports we must provide tennis courts and a regulation track. We will need gravel, cinders, and cement to do this work. This project may appeal to some young people's group which now has future Cedarville College athletes in it. Let us hear from you and we will tell you how you can help.

We have permission from the Federal Communications Commission to build a campus radio station. We also have radio engineers in our student body who are anxious to begin construction of this station. With the equipment already in our possession it will take approximately \$500 to put our campus station "on the air." Perhaps you would like to provide a resistor, condenser, tube, or even a tape recorder! Our students will welcome your interest..

More and more, visual aids will play an important part in education. We have access to many films which

will greatly supplement the classroom lectures of our teachers. We need a new 16 mm. sound projector if we are to use this teaching tool at our disposal. Perhaps one of our churches may be able to purchase this equipment at a much better price than any offered to Cedarville College.

This list of projects is by no means complete, but it is presented in answer to your requests. Perhaps you can think of something else you would like to do for the college. If you have questions, please write to the college.

In his second letter to the church at Corinth, Paul said, "For we are not as many which corrupt the Word of God." (II Corinthians 2:17). Another translation states it thus: "For we are not like so many peddlers of God's Word." The word for corrupt has to do with trade or merchandising. Vincent says, "The term included dealers in victuals and all sorts of wares but was especially applied to

retailers of wine, with whom adulteration and short measure were matters of course."
