Sept. 15, 2015

TONIGHT'S GAME

The Cedarville University women's soccer team hosts the Alderson Broaddus University Battlers in a Great Midwest Athletic Conference encounter tonight at Yellow Jacket Field. Cedarville was picked to finish third and AB was the fifth-place choice in the G-MAC Coaches Preseason Poll.

The Lady Jackets are 3-1 (1-0 G-MAC) on the year after a 4-1 non-league win last Saturday at Roberts Wesleyan in Rochester, New York.

The Battlers enter tonight's contest with a 1-3 mark including a 1-1 record in the G-MAC. AB dropped a 3-2 league decision to visiting Kentucky Wesleyan last Saturday.

Head Coach John McGillivray is in his 43rd season coaching soccer at CU - 18th with the women (150-150-28).

The Lady Jackets are led on the offensive side by junior midfielder Grace Miorelli with four goals and a team-high five assists for 13 points.

Senior forward Jacoby Ziegler, the G-MAC's Offensive Player of the Year in 2012 and 2013, is CU's second-leading scorer with five goals and an assist for 11 points. Ziegler ranks fourth in the NCAA II active career goals scored list with 45.

Senior forward Kaitlyn Stiles, coming off a hat-trick at Roberts Wesleyan, is CU's third-leading scorer with four goals and an assist for nine points.

Freshman midfielder Creslyn Van Dyck has added a secondbest three assists.

Junior keeper Hanna Harris is the all-time leader in career shutouts at Cedarville with 17. She has allowed three goals in the first four contests of the 2015 campaign.

Alderson Broaddus is under the direction of second-year Head Coach Cristian Materazzi (7-15-1). He previously served as an assistant with the Battlers for four seasons.

Sophomore defender/midfielder Lauren Small leads AB with three goals for six points. The only other two players to find the net this year are Shelby Riddle and Tia Kline.

Senior keeper Tayler Garcia is allowing 2.7 goals per game while making 28 saves.

Cedarville has won the previous two meetings with Alderson Broaddus - 1-0 and 2-0.

LAST TIME ON THE PITCH - 9/12/15

ROCHESTER, N.Y. - Kaitlyn Stiles scored three goals as Cedarville pulled away to surprise previously unbeaten Roberts Wesleyan, 4-1, in a non-conference contest.

The Lady Jackets wasted little time getting on the board. In the 4th minute, Stiles gathered in a long pass from Kaleigh Rowlands at the six-yard box and tapped it by the keeper for her second goal of the season.

Olivia Moore headed home a corner kick by Grace Miorelli in the 18th minute and it stayed 2-0 by halftime.

After the Raiders netted their tally in the 48th, Stiles iced the result with two quick strikes late in the contest.

The senior one-timed a restart from Miorelli in the 83rd minute. Just 82 seconds later, she looped a long left-footed strike just outside the box to complete the scoring.

Hanna Harris was credited with four saves in goal *Numbers Game:*

- Cedarville holds a 5-3-1 lead in the season series that dates back to 2000.
- RWC outshot the visitors 13-9 overall, but both sides placed five shots on goal.
- Stiles has 12 goals for her career. She is the 14th player in school history to score at least three goals in a game.
- Miorelli moved into a tie for fourth place all-time in assists at CU (19).

HEAD COACH JOHN MCGILLIVRAY



John McGillivray is one of the most wellrespected soccer coaches in the state of Ohio and has been coaching soccer at Cedarville University since 1974.

McGillivray has been the head coach of the Lady Jackets since 1998. He served as the Cedarville men's head coach from 1974 through 1997.

Coupled with the 147 wins with the women, McGillivray has 362 total soccer victories at CU. His 300th overall win came in a 5-0 decision

over Grace on Aug. 28, 2008. He picked up his 100th victory with the Lady Jackets in a 2-1 result at Point Park on Oct. 17, 2009.

McGillivray has enjoyed eight winning seasons with the Lady Jackets including a best-ever 15-7 mark in 2013. CU led the Great Midwest Athletic Conference with a 9-1 regular season mark and McGillivray was voted G-MAC Coach of the Year.

Cedarville finished 13-8-2 in 2004, won NCCAA Midwest Region championship, and secured an automatic berth in the NCCAA National Tournament. The 2000 club had a 12-7-2 record and made the school's first-ever NCCAA championship appearance in women's

McGillivray and his teams have long been recognized for their sportsmanlike behavior. His Lady Jackets twice received the Fair Play Team Award from the American Mideast Conference for their exemplary conduct on the field.

He was presented the first-ever Distinguished Merit Award in 1990 by the Ohio Collegiate Soccer Officials Association. The National Intercollegiate Soccer Officials Association honored him in 1992 with their National Merit Award.

The Springfield. Ohio native led his men's teams to eight Mid-Ohio Conference titles, five NCCAA District III banners, three NAIA District 22 championships, and one NAIA Area IV crown which carried with it a trip to the NAIA Nationals in 1974. He guided his squad to five NCCAA National Tournament appearances, a pair of NCCAA National Runner-Up finishes and he was chosen NCCAA National Coach of the Year in 1981.

McGillivray served at all levels of NAIA soccer including president of the NAIA Soccer Coaches Association from 1983 through 1985. He was inducted into the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1991 and the NAIA Hall of Fame in 1993.

McGillivray, who is an associate professor in the Department of Kinesiology and Allied Health, is a 1970 graduate of Cedarville College, and he earned his master's degree in 1976 from the University of Dayton. John and his wife, Bonnie, reside in Cedarville and have five children and 16 grandchildren.


