## ANOTHER STEP, ANOTHER CHALLENGE

By now most of our readers no doubt have become aware of the fact that Cedarville College has been reauthorized to confer the B.S. in Education degree beginning in June, 1967. The original authorization by the State of Ohio was revoked at the close of the '52-'53 academic year just prior to the change of Administration. Since that time there has been a constant effort to improve the college in all respects. Taking cognizance of the many improvements, the State Department of Education on June 10, 1963 voted the reauthorization.

This step forward is an encouragement to the Alumni, especially to those in the field of education. The various ways of becoming certified now employed by the students will soon be a thing of the past.

As always, however, with privilege comes responsibility. The actual granting of the first certificate under the reauthorization will not be realized for four years hence, and then only upon evidence of compliance with several stipulations. These stipulations are all reasonable and the Administration is confident that they will all be met.

The very first of these conditions states, "The annual financial support be substantially increased." This is the perennial problem of any institution of higher learning, especially in this day and age. Naturally, and rightfully, such an institution turns to its Alumni as one source of income. That which we have been able to do as an Association has been greatly appreciated by the Administration. Our realization, however, is yet much below our potential.

One means to increase annual income is simply by direct giving. This many Alumni are now doing. Another is to encourage other individuals to give of their means. There is yet another way which may be even a greater challenge, the local church. Is the church of which you are a member a regular, periodical contributor to Cedarville College? If it is, have you tried to use your influence properly to have the contribution increased? If it is not, what attempts have you made to have the College placed on the budget? This is a worthy, God-honoring cause. It is your obligation to promote it.

The challenge is before us. It has taken ten years to realize this latest goal. With the help of the Lord, this approval must not be revoked again. Will you accept this challenge?

### ALUMNUS CITED IN JOURNALS

Though not certified to train teachers, Cedarville College has in recent years graduated some who have made their contributions to the field of education. According to a recent newspaper article, Mr. James S. Hartman (58), history instructor at Central High School in Martisburg, Penna., has been cited in two professional publications. "Social Studies News" and "Social Studies Notebook," recently published articles about the research projects of Mr. Hartman's tenth grade students.

Mr. Hartman expects to receive his M. Ed. in guidance this summer and may move into administration very soon.
