Cedarville College is set in a small rural community of 2500 residents in the southwestern part of Ohio and is also conveniently located near large metropolitan cities such as Dayton, Columbus, Cincinnati, and Springfield which provide students with employment, opportunities to worship, and participation in practical Christian service. ## ACCREDITATION

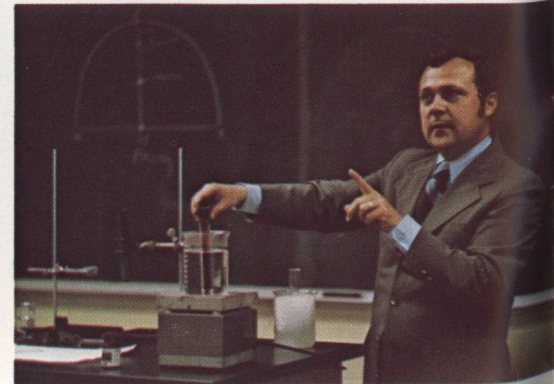
Chartered by the State of Ohio in 1887, Cedarville College has been approved by the State Department of Education for the education, training, and certification of both elementary and secondary school teachers. On April 9, 1975, the College was given full regional accreditation by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. The College is also approved for listing in the Higher Education Directory published by the Office of Education, United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare.

Credits from accredited colleges are fully transferable as long as they apply to the student's course of study and the grade is at least a "C".



## FACULTY

With a sincere desire to assist young people in the preparation of their chosen vocation, the Cedarville faculty numbers over 60 dedicated men and women who teach the course content in light of Scriptural truth. With a 1-19 faculty to student ratio, there is "...a closeness that exists not only among students, but among students and faculty-staff." At this time, 46% of Cedarville's professors hold doctorate degrees, while 4 others only have their dissertation remaining before they also receive the same degree.









## LIVING ACCOMMODATIONS



"... The fellowship with others that comes with dorm life is great. South Hall is special. The girls are super. They all love the Lord." As students establish a residence here they also establish friendships which are as one student put it, "... for a lifetime." Each section or unit of a dorm has a student personnel assistant who leads weekly devotional and prayer meetings within the dorm and assists the resident advisor with any counseling duties. Shared goals and activities bring students and staff together for valuable learning experiences.



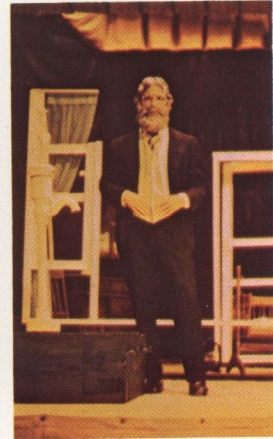
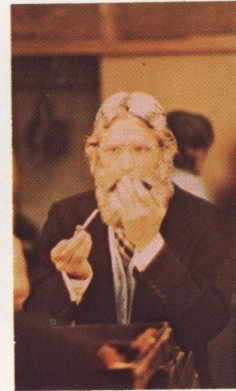
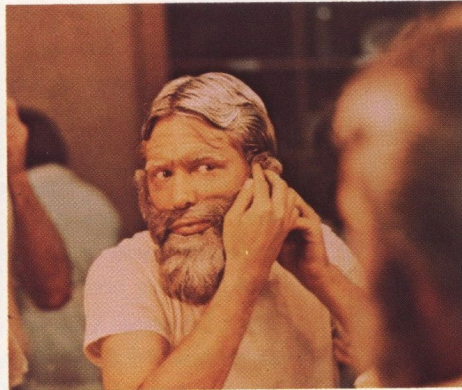


## CULTURAL AND SPIRITUAL ENRICHMENT

Concerts, lectures, plays, banquets, all-school parties, interest trips, retreats, and a strong intramurals program are a part of Cedarville students' activities schedule. On the average, 7 major weekend events are sponsored each quarter with nationally and internationally known speakers and performers. There is "something happening" every weekend on the Cedarville campus.

Students can develop a personal ministry during their college years through Christian service opportunities that are as varied as the students themselves.

Statewide and locally, students may choose to put their faith into action through ministries with various musical groups, campus evangelism, jails, rest homes, orphanages, detention homes, and homes for the mentally retarded. Swordbearers and Beach Evangelism teams travel nationwide during spring quarter break, and a Swordbearers team is chosen to serve every summer. The Missionary Internship Service program sends students to several nations as well as to Alaska and other states for yearly summer terms.







## ACADEMIC FACILITIES



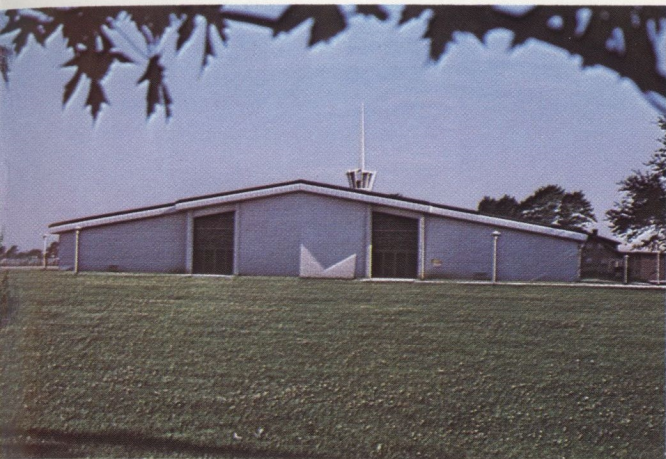
Through many prayerful and sacrificial gifts, Cedarville now has 8 academic buildings including a fine library, new chapel, and an excellent science facility.

The library is a focal point of any college education. Cedarville's library, with more than 73,000 volumes, provides educational aids such as microfilm, tapes, films, and slides together with instructional aids and audio-visual equipment. As a new service to the students and faculty, the Media Production Center provides efficient working areas and equipment to be used in the production of instructional materials such as overhead transparencies, charts, posters, slides, and films.

The newest building on Cedarville's campus is the chapel, completed in May 1976. The beautiful 30,850 square foot facility seats 2,000 and is used for daily chapel services, Wednesday evening and Sunday services, and contains the offices of the Christian service department and campus pastor.

The Science Center was opened for classes in the fall of 1973 and provides 24,000 square feet of space for lecture rooms, laboratories, observatory, faculty offices and auxiliary facilities.







## ATHLETICS

Athletics at Cedarville College are designed to fill a basic physical and spiritual need. The divine command is “. . . to be strong in the Lord.” This command shows us the need of spiritual stamina and fearlessness that is possible with the indwelling of the Spirit of God. We are also to be strong in body and in Christian character. Athletics, both varsity and intramural, are designed to promote that strength through vigorous exercise by development of skills and by rugged competition.

Cedarville women compete on an intercollegiate level in tennis, field hockey, volleyball, and basketball. They hold membership in the Ohio Valley League, the Miami Valley Field Hockey Association, The Ohio Association of Intercollegiate Sports for Women (OAIWS), the Midwest Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (MAIAW), and the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW).

Intercollegiate competition for men is provided in soccer, cross country, wrestling, basketball, indoor track, baseball, golf, tennis, and outdoor track and field. Cedarville maintains membership in the Mid-Ohio Conference, the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics, and the National Christian College Athletic Association. Each of our men's athletic teams has competed in national championships, indicating the excellence we strive for as Christians in athletics.





## DEGREES AND MAJORS

Cedarville College grants two baccalaureate degrees: Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) and Bachelor of Music Education (B.M.E.). A degree candidate must complete at least 192 quarter hours, 60 hours of which must be of upper division work, (200-400 courses). Minors may be declared, but are optional.

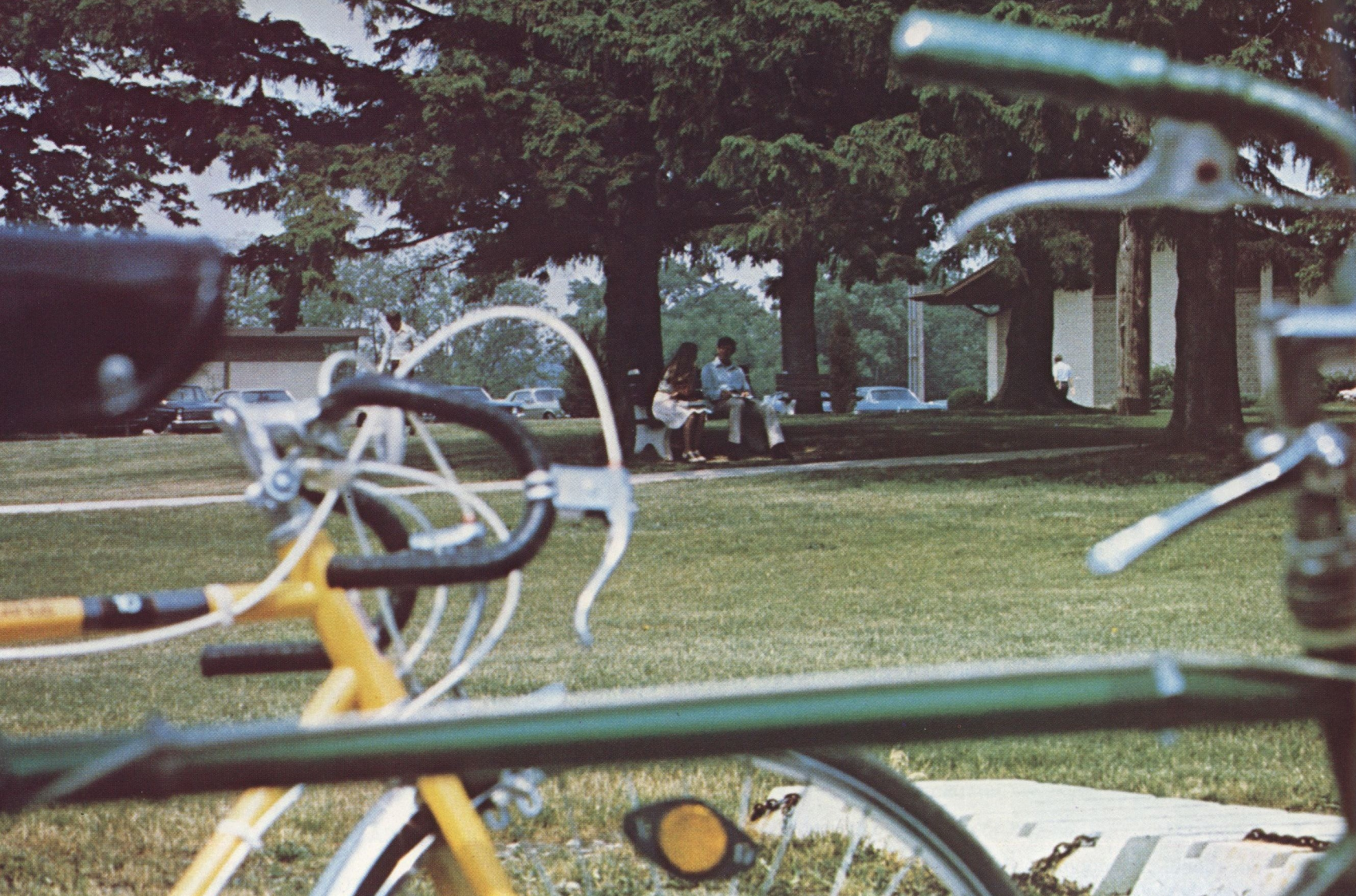

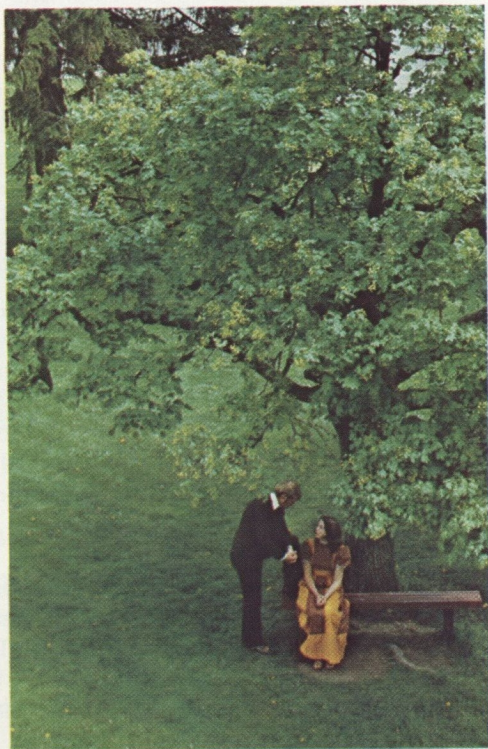

## **ADMISSIONS PROCEDURE**

— Write to the Director of Admissions for application and reference forms.

— Have reference forms completed and sent in by appropriate persons.

— Complete and return the application for Fall admission at the earliest opportunity attaching a photograph and nonrefundable fee of \$15.00. All application forms for the winter quarter must be in the admission's office by December 1 and by March 1 for the spring quarter.

— Request a transcript of credits and grades from the high school and/or college attended to be mailed to the Registrar.

— Take the American College Test or the Scholastic Aptitude Test either in the junior or senior year. If possible, the ACT or SAT should be taken in the junior year so that the application may be submitted early in the senior year.
