Scott Brooker, a former runner and 1982 graduate of Iowa City High School, is in his second year as a member of the Cedarville (OH) College cross country team. Scott is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Brooker of 3006 Stanford Street in Iowa City. A sophomore at the college, Brooker is majoring in business administration.

Brooker is running in the number five position for the Yellow Jacket varsity this year. Coach Elvin King stated, "Scott has been performing very well and I have a lot of confidence that he is going to bring his time down even lower. I look for him to be quite competitive in the meets where we'll need him towards the end of the season."

The Yellow Jackets possess the best cross country team in the school's history this year. Cedarville has already won two invitationals and finished second in two others. For the sixth straight year, the Jackets will host the national meet for the National Christian College Athletic Association on November 12. The team is also expected to qualify for the NAIA Nationals which will be run a week later in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

Cedarville is a Baptist, liberal arts college located in southwestern Ohio, 25 miles east of Dayton. The school has an enrollment of approximately 1800 students.
