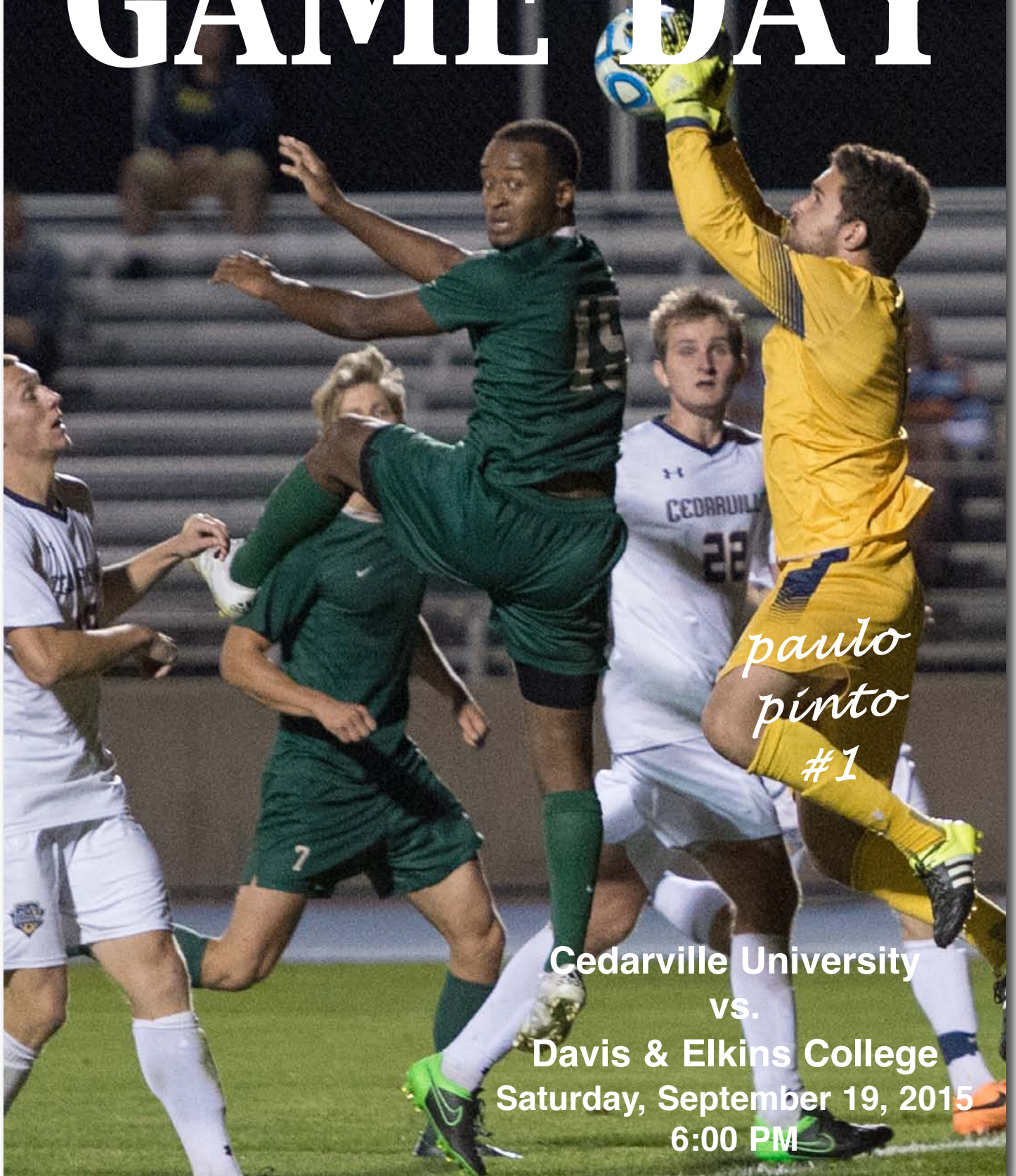

The Blog, "A tradition unlike any other."

Where to Begin.

We started this week off at Malone (most of us missing the second day of Tuesday/Thursday classes in a row). We came off to another less-than-perfect start in this game, but dominated the game with the clear majority of scoring chances and possession. Chance after chance either missed the frame or was saved by Malone's keeper, who turned aside quite a few very good chances including one from Paul "Marshmallow" Messerly from the top of the six-yard box. Granted, Paul's shot had all the venom and power of a shot coming from the foot of one of the 3-5 year old "little dribblers" that we coach, but from that proximity any save is a good one. We played the first 90 minutes out to a 0-0 score so it went to Golden Goal overtime. We ended up scoring in a spectacular fashion as Connor "Did You Lock My Fridge?" Gilmour nodded home yet another goal with less than five seconds remaining on the clock. It was a frustrating game to be sure, but we got our result and improved our record to 2-1.

The following day we spent recuperating from our efforts at Malone and preparing to head to Vienna, West Virginia to play Ohio Valley (where we missed our third consecutive day of Tuesday/Thursday classes). Next, and still before we had even arrived at our locker room, we were greeted by a photo from our game against Ohio Valley in 2013 that featured none other than the late, great, legendary Spencer "The General" Petersheim. Then, in an effort to preserve the rather muddy surface of the game field for the game itself, we warmed up behind one of the goals in an area that could be charitably called "rough terrain." Somehow our ankles made it out of there safely though and we came off to a strong start, putting away two unanswered goals before Salem, thanks to a tremendous individual effort, snatched one before halftime. We went into half up 2-1, but there was still a lot of room for improvement so we came out after halftime guns blazing. We ended up coming away with a dominant 5-1 victory and reasonably few bumps and bruises. We learned from this game that, as conference championship favorites, we will get every team's best effort...

But wait. There's more.

One of our five goals was scored by Joe "Drop the Gloves" Davison, who netted his first goal for the Jackets by the very tip of his flaming red locks off a beautiful service from Jon Schwien. This was a big deal folks. The last notable moment of the game came, of course, from the one and only Derek

"Wrong Book" Braak. From the vantage point of the sideline, it seemed that while he was dribbling the ball, he suddenly forgot how to run so he chased after it on hands and knees for a good five yards only to be beaten to it by a Salem player that still knew how to use his legs. He claims that there was a shove and a pothole involved in the incident, which, given the nature of the venue and the opponent would make a certain degree of sense, but we all know the truth.

And that was all just the start of the day for us. On the way home we ended up getting our charter bus into a corner of a town that wasn't made for charter buses so our poor bus driver tried to find somewhere to turn around. An innocent enough beginning, I grant you. However, our attempt to find a spot to turn around somehow took us down a road that was just barely as wide as the bus itself (we still don't know why he thought this was our best option). It has to be said that our lovely bus driver, Lori, was so gracious as to stop at the first convenience store to be found and foot the bill for our entire team, which is no small thing.

In the end, we made it back in one piece and with the entire original Bourne Trilogy under our belts, but none of us were particularly sad to kiss West Virginia goodbye for the time being.

TONIGHT'S GAME

The Cedarville University men's soccer team hosts the Davis & Elkins College Senators in a Great Midwest Conference game at Yellow Jacket Field.

The Jackets are currently 4-1-1 overall (2-0 G-MAC) and are picked to three-peat as champions of the Great Midwest Athletic Conference. CU recorded a 1-1 tie with NSCAA #16 Tiffin on Tuesday night at Yellow Jacket Field.

The Senators are 1-2-1 in the early going with an 0-1-1 mark in the G-MAC. D&E dropped a 2-1 decision to league foe Trevecca last Saturday in Elkins.

The Yellow Jackets, under the direction of third-year Head Coach Brett Faro, return a solid nucleus from last year's G-MAC championship squad. Three of the team's top four scorers return led by G-MAC Offensive Player of the Year Connor Gilmour who finished with 14 goals and 4 assists for 32 points.

Also back are Christian Alexander (10-6-26) and Joel Twinem (5-2-12). Paulo Pinto returns between the pipes where he set a school record last fall with a 0.51 goals against average.

Gilmour, the current G-MAC Player of the Week (Sept. 6-12), has totaled seven goals and an assist for 15 points to lead the offense in 2015. Others to find the net are Zachary Harris, Michael Auld, Paul Messerly, Aaron Plummer and Joe Davison. John Schwien and Jon Brown have been credited with two assists each to pace the squad.

Davis & Elkins is led by Head Coach Dr. Greg Myers who found his way back to Elkins, WV in 2009 when he was named the athletic director and head men's soccer coach. Myers began his career at D&E in 1964.

The Senators have scored just three goals in their first four contests - Simon Hestad, Friedrich Peters and Niklas Rasch-Hegelund have found the back of the net.

Daniel Nock, a senior keeper, has allowed four goals while making 15 saves.

The all-time series between the schools is tied at 2-2-1 including last year's G-MAC Championship - a 1-0 Yellow Jacket victory in Cedarville.

LAST TIME ON THE PITCH - 9/15/15

CEDARVILLE, Ohio - The Yellow Jackets and NSCAA Division II #16 Tiffin skirmished for 110 minutes before settling for a 1-1 double overtime draw in CU's home opener.

After playing its first five contests on the road, Cedarville is 4-1-1 following the result. The Dragons are 3-0-2.

The Jackets got on the board first in the 28th minute. Joe Davison slotted a ball into left side of the box to Connor Gilmour, who alertly tucked in a low, left-footed 15-yarder just inside the far post.

It was Gilmour's seventh goal of the season,

Tiffin ramped up the pressure throughout the second half and finally got the equalizer in the 82nd minute. The Dragons controlled the first overtime, CU dominated the second, and each side could look back to chances it had throughout the match that could have produced a victory.

Cedarville banged two shots off of the post while Tiffin hit the crossbar and the post.

The Dragons held a slim 16-15 edge in shots overall while the Jackets had more on goal, 7-5. Paulo Pinto was credited with four saves.

Numbers Game:

- Gilmour has scored in five-of-six games this year including the last four in a row.
- After not registering a point in the first 53 games of his career, Davison has tallied a goal and an assist in his last two outings.
- Pinto has logged every second in goal this season with a 0.63 goals against average.
- The outcome was just the second draw ever between the two schools. Tiffin leads the all-time series, 19-9-2.

HEAD COACH BRETT FARO



Brett Faro has been the head men's soccer coach at Cedarville University since the 2013 season after serving as the program's top assistant for two years. He's guided the Yellow Jackets to back-to-back Great Midwest Athletic Conference championships.

CU finished 14-4-2 overall and 7-0-1 during the 2014 campaign. The Jackets hosted the G-MAC Tournament and defeated Davis & Elkins, 1-0, in the title match.

Faro was named the program's interim head coach in July, 2013 and later had the interim tag removed in November just before the G-MAC Tournament. Cedarville played host and #1 seed D&E to a 0-0 draw in the final and then claimed the trophy on penalty kicks. The Jackets ended up 13-3-4 overall and 6-1-1 G-MAC.

CU has gone 58-17-10 since Faro's arrival including a school-record 17 victories in 2012. The Jackets won the 2011 NCCAA Midwest Region banner and placed third at the national tournament.

Faro came to Cedarville after serving as an assistant coach at the United States Naval Academy during the 2010 campaign. He helped guide the Midshipmen to a 7-5-4 record.

Faro has been involved in multiple levels of soccer in coaching and administration. He coached the U17 Maryland Nike Rush '93 in 2010-11 and helped lead the NCSL Division I squad to three tournament championships.

Faro was team manager of Sky Blue FC of Women's

Professional Soccer in 2010. He also coached and trained players in the Hershey Youth Soccer Club in 2007 and 2008.

Faro was a four-year standout during his playing career at perennial NCAA Division III powerhouse Messiah College from 2005-09. He was a member of four national championship teams, was a two-time team captain, and tied the school record for the most games played in a career with 99.

Faro is a 2009 graduate of Messiah with a degree in sports management. He was a Dean's List student at the school and was recognized as an NSCAA Academic All-Region Scholar-Athlete.

Faro earned a master's degree in coaching and athletic administration from Concordia University Irvine (Calif.) in 2014. He also possesses an NSCAA national diploma.

Brett and his wife, Shelley, were married on May 31, 2014. They reside in Xenia.

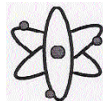

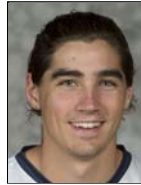

Cedarville senior forward Connor Gilmour was named the second Great Midwest Athletic Conference Men's Soccer Athlete of the Week for the fall on Monday.

Gilmour is off to the races while leading the G-MAC in a handful of offensive categories this fall, including goals (6), points (13) and game-winning goals (2). He was the 2014 G-MAC Offensive Player of the Year.

The Yellow Jackets enjoyed an unblemished week by reeling off three consecutive road wins, including one against future 2016 G-MAC member Malone in Canton.

GREAT MIDWEST ATHLETIC CONFERENCE - MEN'S SOCCER

The Great Midwest Athletic Conference (G-MAC), was approved by the NCAA Division II Membership Committee in February of 2012 as a member conference and earned active status in July of 2013, after completing an educational assessment program in 2012-13. The conference began competition as the 24th active NCAA Division II conference in 2013-14.

The G-MAC features both active and reclassifying members from Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee, and West Virginia. Charter members of the G-MAC included Cedarville University, Kentucky Wesleyan College, Trevecca Nazarene University, and Ursuline College.

The G-MAC expanded with the inclusion of Alderson Broaddus University, Davis & Elkins College, Ohio Valley University, and Salem International University as active DII members. Recently, Malone University has announced it will be joining the G-MAC in 2016-17 as a full member, and then the University of Findlay, Hillsdale College, Lake Erie College, Ohio Dominican University, and Walsh University will join in 2017-18.

The G-MAC, headquartered in the Indianapolis metro area, will sponsor 18 championships in 2015-16 as an active NCAA Division II conference.
