### **The President's Letter**

Dear Friends of Cedarville College:

The Word of God says that "the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever" (I John 2:17). Throughout the Bible this truth is emphasized. Abel did the will of God, and he "being dead yet speaketh." Cain, on the other hand, died in disgrace because of disobedience. Abram by faith went out "not knowing whither he went," while Lot lifted up his eyes, saw the well-watered plains of Sodom, and lost all his possessions in a conflagration from Heaven.

The will of God for our lives is surely the most important thing, second only to the salvation of our souls. Though this is true, doing the will of God does not always result in a peaceful experience. ## **Young People! You Can Major In Music At Cedarville!**

God has ordained music as a medium of praise unto Himself. David, in Psalm 108:3, said: "I will praise thee, O Lord, among the people: and I will sing praises unto thee among the nations." Paul, writing to the Colossians, was led by the Spirit to record, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord."

Cedarville College, in an effort designed to help the churches realize more fully their potential of "Spirit-filled song" has initiated a program leading to a Bachelor of Music Degree with a church music major. The course is designed to train students for the position of Church Music Director. The degree includes at least 64 hours of music, 62 hours of academic work including Bible study, and four hours of physical education.

For those students desiring less musical instruction, a major of 40 hours, or a minor of 20 hours in music is provided under the Bachelor of Arts Degree, with limited electives in either church music or music education.

The music curriculum is divided into six departments of study: Music Theory (Harmony); Music History; Church Music; Music Education; Applied Music; and Ensembles, both vocal and instrumental. Applied music lessons are offered in voice, piano, and organ, or on the brass, woodwind, string, or percussion instruments.

The college furnishes music in many Baptist churches throughout Ohio and several other states. Some small groups or soloists from the school are using their talents for the Lord almost every Sunday. Excellent opportunity is given for Christian service.

The Chapel Choir tours annually through several states. This April the choir will sing in Ohio; Michigan; Ontario, Canada; New York; Massachusetts; Connecticut; and Pennsylvania. The tour schedule is as follows:
