Gary Anderson, a former runner and 1980 graduate of Lakeland Regional High School, is in his senior year as a member of the Cedarville (OH) College cross country team. A chemistry major at the college, Gary is the son of Mrs. Ellen Keene of 42 Smokey Ridge Road in Ringwood.

Anderson has been running solidly in the number four position for the Yellow Jackets this fall. He is also seen as a leader on the team by being a co-captain. Even though Anderson is still coming back from a broken hand he suffered last spring, Coach Elvin King said, "Gary has been very consistent and he could be a contender to make the NCCAA All-American squad." Anderson earlier made the NCCAA District III team when he placed fifth in the district meet to help lead C.C. to the team title.

The Yellow Jackets possess the best cross country team in the school's history this year. Cedarville has already won two invitationals and finished second in two others. For the sixth straight year, the Jackets will host the national meet for the National Christian College Athletic Association on November 12. The team is also expected to qualify for the NAIA Nationals which will be run a week later in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

Cedarville is a Baptist, liberal arts college located in southwestern Ohio, 25 miles east of Dayton. The school has an enrollment of approximately 1800 students.
