

WILBERFORCE, Ohio - Cedarville rallied in the final minutes at Central State to pull out a 68-65 non-conference victory before 1,318 Greene County Appreciation Night fans.

The Yellow Jackets won their third straight game to improve to 8-9. They've also won the last five contests played between the two schools on the Marauders' home court.

CSU led from the opening tip until the waning moments. It was a 59-52 difference with 6:10 remaining when Cedarville made its move.

Patrick Bain's three-pointer at the 4:50 mark created the game's first tie, 59-59. After the Marauders answered with a three-point play, the visitors scored the next seven points to take the lead for good.

With the Jackets leading 67-65, Central State called timeout in the forecourt with five seconds left. Easton Bazzoli stole the inbounds pass, was fouled, and hit one-of-two free throws with three seconds to go. CSU's desperation shot at the buzzer was wide.

Bain and J.C. Faubion scored 17 points apiece. Bazzoli finished with 12 points, Robert Okoro grabbed a career-high 12 rebounds for the second straight game, and Justice Montgomery dished out five

Numbers Game:

- · Okoro has 35 rebounds in his last three games.
- Faubion scored in double figures for the 9th time in the last 10 contests.
- The Yellow Jackets had the rebounding edge, 40-25, which included 16 offensive boards.
- · Cedarville's five-game winning streak at CSU has been by an average winning margin of 5.4 points.
- Central State leads the all-time series, 30-16, which began during the 1960-61 season.

GREENWOOD, Ind. - Alderson Broaddus senior forward Richard Lemon was named the 10th Great Midwest Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Athlete of the Week for 2015-

The Battlers came out of a weather-ravaged week with a record of 2-0 in the conference schedule with wins against Ohio Valley and Salem International.

Lemon averaged a double-double with 16 points and 10.5 rebounds per game. He also shot nearly 53 percent from the field on 17 shot attempts.

Alderson Broaddus defeated Ohio Valley by a 27-point margin last week as Lemon collected 12 rebounds (five offensive) and scored 17 points, resulting in his fifth double-double of the season.

Lemon also made a floating jumper to score the 1,000th point of his career at AB. He was 6-11 from the field and made a three-point basket

Lemon ranks sixth all-time in G-MAC career scoring with 869 points, just 30 behind current teammate Thylas Perkins (899) to rank in the top five.

Once again, Lemon was a double-double threat for the Battlers vs. Salem International. He was one rebound away from a double-double with 15 points and nine boards against the Tigers.

He went 9-of-12 from the free-throw line and shot 50 percent from the field. He also dished out three assists.

Lemon currently ranks third in the conference in rebounding (133). He is additionally seventh in field-goal percentage (48.4) and is tied for second in assists (4.1). He is averaging 13.1 points per game.

Head Coach Pat Estepp

Pat Estepp has been the head men's basketball coach at Cedarville University since the 2008-09 campaign. He has guided his alma mater to an average of 20 victories per season and five national tournament appearances.

The Yellow Jackets' first active season in NCAA Division II resulted in a 22-9 mark in 2012-13. Estepp was voted the Great Midwest Athletic Conference Coach of the Year as his team claimed the G-MAC regular season title, the G-MAC Tournament trophy, and placed third in the NCCAA Championship.

Cedarville was 23-9 during its NCAA provisional year in 2011-12. They won the school's first NCCAA Championship banner in convincing fashion after entering the 2012 tournament as the No. 1 seed and winning their three games by an average of 18 points. Estepp was tabbed NCCAA National Coach of the Year.

Cedarville finished strong again in 2010-11 by winning eight of their last nine regular season games including the last five in a row. The Jackets were ranked as high as 14th in the NAIA Division II poll and finished at 20-13.

Cedarville won 16 of its last 18 games in 2009-10 to finish 26-9 and 14-2 in the American Mideast Conference as the league runner-up. The Yellow Jackets, who were rated as high as 8th in the national poll, later won the AMC Tournament and advanced to the second round of the national tournament.

Estepp's inaugural campaign at the helm was full of memorable accomplishments. He guided the Yellow Jackets to a 27-4 overall record and a share of the AMC title with a 12-1 league mark. Cedarville was ranked as high as No. 1 in the country, finished in a tie for the No. 2 spot in the final poll, and advanced to the national tournament.

The Jackets assembled a number of school records which included a 14-game winning streak. They also wiped out all of the previous marks for defense.

Cedarville led the country in field goal percentage defense with opponents shooting just 37.9 percent. They also ranked second nationally by allowing a stingy 60 points per contest which was 10 points per game lower than the old school record.

Estepp's leadership did not go unnoticed. He was voted the AMC Coach of the Year as well as the NCCAA Midwest Region Coach of the Year.

Estepp took on his current position after serving as an assistant coach for eight years under former head coach Ray Slagle. He played a key role during Slagle's successful tenure with the Yellow Jackets from 2000 to 2008.

Cedarville won 177 games during that timespan, averaged 24.1 wins over the last seven seasons, won three American Mideast Conference titles, and two AMC Tournament championships.



The Yellow Jackets made five trips to the NAIA Division II National Tournament where they never lost in the first round. They advanced to the semifinals once, the quarterfinals twice, and to the second round twice.

This is the first head coaching position for Estepp. A 1997 graduate of Cedarville College with a degree in physical education, he was a student assistant at the school during his senior year and went on to acquire coaching experience at all levels of basketball.

Estepp was the 8th grade coach at Cedarville Junior High School in 1996-97. He spent the next year at Clark County Christian High School in Kentucky where he was the varsity assistant boys basketball coach and the head coach in golf and tennis.

Estepp spent the 1998-99 season as the junior varsity coach at Oak Hill (Ohio) High School. He held the same position in 1999-2000 at South Webster (Ohio) High School which is where he graduated from in 1993.

Estepp comes from a rich basketball coaching heritage. His father, Dale, spent 27 years in the profession at Fairfield Union and South Webster high schools.

Estepp also has a master's degree in education from Cedarville University that he earned in 2008. Pat and his wife, Melanie, reside in Cedarville with their three children: sons Isaiah, 14, and Grant, 11, as well as daughter, Merynn, 5.

GREENWOOD, Ind. – The Great Midwest Athletic Conference announces that the basketball games between Cedarville and Trevecca Nazarene on Saturday, Feb. 6, 2016, will air on the American Sports Network as part of the NCAA Division II Game of the Week package.

The men's and women's games between the Yellow Jackets and Trojans in Nashville will represent the G-MAC's first American Sports Network broadcast in any sport.

"First, we are honored to be the first G-MAC institution selected to host a Division II National Showcase broadcast," said Trevecca Nazarene Director of Athletics Mark Elliott. "It is an opportunity to represent our community, Trevecca and Nashville, but we realize along with that comes responsibility.

"Similar to when we made the move to NCAA Division II, we will lean on support from the greater Trevecca and Nashville community," Elliott added. The Cedarville and Trevecca Nazarene women's programs have battled it out and finished first and second in the G-MAC standings, respectively, in each of the past two years.

TNU has assembled back-to-back 14-2 league records in 2013-14 and 2014-15 while the Yellow Jackets marched to the conference's first NCAA Championship Midwest Regional at-large selection in 2014-15 with a 27-4 overall record.

After beating then-No. 19 Alabama-Huntsville, the Trojans' men made a name for themselves on a national level early this year. Cedarville's men have won three straight at the time of release and are quickly developing rising young talent.

Additional information will be made available at a later time about which markets will carry the games. For those outside the regional market, both games will also be streamed live on NCAA.com.

The American Sports Network has reached agreements to distribute its broadcasts to regional cable networks that will make it available in 94 million of the nation's 113 million TV homes.

Cedarville, Davis & Elkins Honored **Again for Academic Success Rates**



INDIANAPOLIS - Cedarville University and Davis & Elkins College headlined the Great Midwest Athletic Conference with Academic Success Rates of 90 percent or higher as released by the NCAA on Wednesday.

Cedarville and Davis & Elkins are among 27 NCAA Division II schools to be honored part of the Presidents' Award for Academic Excellence, now in its fifth year.

This is the third consecutive year that both Cedarville and D&E have received the Presidents' Award for Academic Excellence.

D&E had a reported ASR of 94 with UC-San Diego, Assumption and Seattle Pacific, while Cedarville's ASR of 91 tied four other schools.

For the first time, the University of the Sciences in Philadelphia led Division II with an Academic Success Rate of 99 percent, followed closely by Saint Michael's College, Point Loma Nazarene University and Bentley University, all of which achieved a 98 percent ASR.

For the second straight year, the Northeast-10 led Division II's 24 conferences in ASR rates, with five athletics programs posting scores of 90 percent or more.

The G-MAC ranked fifth among all 24 Division II conferences with ASR's of 90 percent or more.

"We are pleased by the increasing number of Division II schools whose student-athletes are earning Academic Success Rates of 90 percent or higher," said Judy Bense, president of the University of West Florida and chair of the Division II Presidents Council. "These schools and their students demonstrate the utmost dedication to success in the classroom and on the field, and we are proud of their efforts."

The Academic Success Rate is the percentage of student-athletes who graduate within six years of initial enrollment in college and includes virtually all Division II student-athletes, including transfers and those not receiving athletics scholarships.

The Division II ASR also captures about 51 percent more college athletes than the federal graduation rate. Unlike the federal graduation rate, the ASR also counts student-athletes who transfer to a school after initial enrollment elsewhere and removes from the rate student-athletes who leave school while academically eligible. The national ASR is 71 percent for student-athletes who entered college from 2005 through 2008.

Regardless of which measure is used, Division II college athletes graduate at a higher rate than the general student body. The federal rate for the 2008 entering class of student-athletes was 55 percent, compared to 49 percent for the general student body.
