## THREE QUESTIONS FOR BAPTISTS TO CONSIDER

Baptists are a very democratic body. Every Baptist church is free to support such worthy causes as it will. It remains for each Baptist church to determine for itself what schools and missionary agencies merit their financial aid.

In consequence of this democratic freedom, our Baptist institutions often suffer while agencies and institutions which are not committed to the propagation of Baptist principles and convictions find much of their support from within our Baptist constituency. In view of this fact, there are certain questions which Baptists should consider, especially with reference to the matter of training our young people today for places of leadership in our churches tomorrow. First

#### DO WE NEED OUR OWN INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING?

Dear Reader, may we ask you to consider this question seriously. As we see it, there are only two alternate conclusions: either Baptists have no distinctives which are worth the sacrifice involved in maintaining our own schools, or we must expect schools other than Baptist to inculcate them. It is not true that many churches today are Baptist only in name, and that very largely due to the fact that its leadership has had so little appreciation for those truths

held in combination which have distinguished Baptists throughout their long history. Has it ever occurred to you that the compromise involved in "interdenominationalism" is preparing a generation of conservatives today for co-operation with the encumenical movement tomorrow? Are you really a Baptist, or is that merely a name which for you has lost all historical significance? If our Baptist cause is to survive in this day of compromise, we must train our own leadership, not only for the ministry, but for other positions of responsibility in our churches. This leads us to ask

#### WHAT ARE THE POSSIBILITIES OF CEDARVILLE MEETING THIS NEED?

To this question we want to state the facts fairly and honestly. Cedarville College was granted a charter to grant degrees by the State of Ohio in 1887. From that date until this, Cedarville has had an unbroken history of annual graduations. This institution came under Baptist administration in 1953. Our physical assets include a beautiful campus of 16 acres, a three-story administration building, a three-story science building, a splendid library building (a gift of the late Andrew Carnegie), a very good gymnasium, a music building, a chapel seating 200 persons, a dining hall, and five dormitories. Our academic assets include a full-time faculty of eleven consecrated men and two Godly women in addition to the President, plus a library of approximately 20,000 volumes. A board of trustees numbering twenty-seven, of

Baptist brethren with a deep concern for the perpetuation of our precious Baptist heritage, together with an increasing number of churches which share our convictions; these, under God, constitute our financial resources.

Cedarville is not a member of a regional accrediting association, but in this it is not alone. There are a number of small colleges in Ohio which are not accredited. Efforts are being put forth in that direction, but this goal cannot be attained until we can improve our academic status. Several of our faculty members are pursuing graduate work toward doctorate degrees, but with limited salaries the program is retarded. Accreditation is not dependent upon a \$500,000 endowment, but it is upon academic rating. The law in Ohio requires that a college granting degrees on the undergraduate level must have an endowment in the amount of \$500,000 before they will be certified for teacher training. Our graduates have been certified to teach in Michigan and in Pennsylvania, and we believe that all our students who do creditable work will find many open doors awaiting them. However, we do want our constituency to know the facts without exaggeration. God has given us much, for which we are profoundly thankful, but we do have needs which He must supply if this college is to fully meet the needs of our Baptist young people. The final question which we ask you to consider is this —

**WHAT ARE YOU WILLING TO DO TO MAKE CEDARVILLE THE COLLEGE YOU WANT IT TO BE?**

To operate a college economically we need more students. You can help direct them this way. If we are to improve our facilities and our academic standing, we must have your financial help. Small gifts sent regularly from a large number of people is more to be desired than large gifts from a few. Above all we need a host of men and women upon whose hearts God can lay the burden of prayer for His blessing upon this institution. Are you willing to do what you can? Will you help us build a stronger, better college — one that is fully prepared to meet the need of our young people who want the advantage of a college education without the risk of losing their faith?

Miss Bernice Mick, manager of our college book store reports that she has books, plaques, Christmas cards and other items of interest for Christmas shoppers.

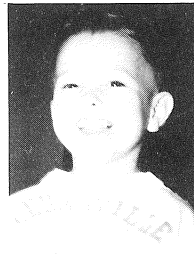


Not only is our college family served by this accomodation but a number of our friends from off the campus are sending orders for various items.

## A FUTURE STUDENT



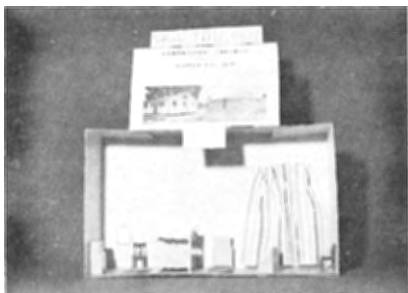

When we began the construction, we obtained a loan from the local bank to cover this building expense. Later on, however, it was suggested that some of the people in our churches may wish to lend the money to the college.

To date \$11,000 has been loaned to us by our friends. We pay 5% interest and give a cognovit note signed by the chairman and secretary of our board. If you are interested in helping in this manner, please write to the president today.
