Cedarville University vs. Trevecca University

"We are what we repeatedly do. Excellence, then, is not an act, but a habit." When I first heard this oft-quoted line, my dad was casting pearls before nine-year-olds and trying to use Aristotle to make me keep my room clean. TONIGHT'S GAME

The Cedarville University women's soccer team hosts the Trevecca University Trojans in the opening game of Great Midwest Athletic Conference action for both teams tonight at Yellow Jacket Field. The contest is the fourth of a five-game homestand for the Lady Jackets.

The Jackets, 3-1, posted a 2-1 win on Tuesday over visiting Ashland University as sophomore Grace Miorelli fired in her first two goals of the 2014 campaign.

The Trojans are 1-2 with their most recent action a 2-1 setback at Campbellsville last Saturday.

The Lady Jackets are led by Jacoby Ziegler, a junior forward, who repeated as the G-MAC Offensive Player of the Year. She tops the 2014 squad in the early going with four goals and eight points. Ziegler ranked third last season in Division II nationally in scoring with 20 goals and 10 assists for 50 points.

Senior forward Kristie Wolff is CU's second-leading scorer with six assists. Wolff has tied the Cedarville school record on two occasions with three assists in a single game and is tied for second in the latest NCAA II statistics with her six assists.

Carly Gregory, a junior, was the G-MAC Defensive Player of the Year. She and Ziegler were joined on the all-conference first team by sophomore midfielder Grace Miorelli and junior defender Kaleigh Rowlands.

Sophomore keeper Hanna Harris has allowed five goals while making 20 saves en route to a 1.25 goals against average.

Trevecca is under the leadership of second-year Head Coach Mark Foster who is a former all-conference performer and the Trojans' all-time leading scorer.

Trevecca's junior midfielder Anna Hoffman has two goals for four points to lead the offense after three games. She was an All-G-MAC Second Team selection last season.


Rookie keeper Liz Denton has allowed four goals in the first three contests this season.

Trevecca leads the all-time series with CU by a 2-1 tally including 6-5 in goals scored. The squads split last season with the road team winning on both occasions.





HEAD COACH JOHN MCGILLIVRAY



John McGillivray is one of the most well-respected soccer coaches in the state of Ohio and has been coaching soccer at Cedarville University since 1974.

McGillivray has been the head coach of the Lady Jackets since 1998. He served as the Cedarville men's head coach from 1974 through 1997.

Coupled with the 137 wins with the women, McGillivray has 352 total soccer victories at CU. His 300th overall win came in a 5-0 decision over Grace on Aug. 28, 2008. He picked up his 100th

victory with the Lady Jackets in a 2-1 result at Point Park on Oct. 17, 2009.

McGillivray has enjoyed seven winning seasons with the Lady Jackets including a best-ever 15-7 mark in 2013. CU led the Great Midwest Athletic Conference with a 9-1 regular season mark and McGillivray was voted G-MAC Coach of the Year.

Cedarville finished 13-8-2 in 2004, won NCCAA Midwest Region championship, and secured an automatic berth in the NCCAA National Tournament. The 2000 club had a 12-7-2 record and made the school's first-ever NCCAA championship appearance in women's soccer.

McGillivray and his teams have long been recognized for their sportsmanlike behavior. His Lady Jackets twice received the Fair Play Team Award from the American Midwest Conference for their exemplary conduct on the field. He was presented the first-ever Distinguished Merit Award in 1990 by the Ohio Collegiate Soccer Officials Association. The National Intercollegiate Soccer Officials Association honored him in 1992 with their National Merit Award.

The Springfield, Ohio native led his men's teams to eight Mid-Ohio Conference titles, five NCCAA District III banners, three NAIA District 22 championships, and one NAIA Area IV crown which carried with it a trip to the NAIA Nationals in 1974. He guided his squad to five NCCAA National

Tournament appearances, a pair of NCCAA National Runner-Up finishes and he was chosen NCCAA National Coach of the Year in 1981.

McGillivray served at all levels of NAIA soccer including president of the NAIA Soccer Coaches Association from 1983 through 1985. He was inducted into the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1991 and the NAIA Hall of Fame in 1993.

McGillivray, who is an associate professor in the Department of Kinesiology and Allied Health, is a 1970 graduate of Cedarville College, and he earned his master's degree in 1976 from the University of Dayton. John and his wife, Bonnie, reside in Cedarville and have five children and 15 grandchildren.



The G-MAC expanded with the inclusion of Alderson Broaddus University, Davis & Elkins College, Ohio Valley University, and Salem International University as active DII members. Georgetown College was added as a Provisional Member in 2012, while Cumberland University was added as a Provisional Member in 2013.

The G-MAC, headquartered in the Indianapolis metro area, sponsored 17 championships in 2013-14 as an active NCAA Division II conference.
