Cedarville University vs. Ashland University

"We are what we repeatedly do. Excellence, then, is not an act, but a habit." When I first heard this oft-quoted line, my dad was casting pearls before nine-year-olds and trying to use Aristotle to make me keep my room clean. That's just one of many examples of my dad's instruction ever-so-slightly overshooting my level of understanding. TONIGHT'S GAME

The Cedarville University women's soccer team hosts the Ashland University Eagles in a non-conference game tonight at Yellow Jacket Field. The contest is the third of a five-game home-stand for the Lady Jackets.

The Jackets, 2-1, posted a 3-0 win on Saturday over visiting Tiffin University - the first-ever victory over the Dragons in 16 meetings.

The Eagles, NCAA II members of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC), are 3-0 with wins versus Southern Indiana, Tusculum and G-MAC member Alderson Broaddus.

The Lady Jackets are led by Jacoby Ziegler, a junior forward, who repeated as the G-MAC Offensive Player of the Year. She tops the 2014 squad in the early going with four goals and eight points. Ziegler ranked third in Division II nationally in scoring with 20 goals and 10 assists for 50 points.

Senior forward Kristie Wolff is CU's second-leading scorer with six assists. Wolff has tied the Cedarville school record on two occasions with three assists in a single game.

Carly Gregory, a junior, was the G-MAC Defensive Player of the Year. She and Ziegler were joined on the all-conference first team by sophomore midfielder Grace Miorelli and junior defender Kaleigh Rowlands.

Sophomore keeper Hanna Harris has allowed three goals while making 14 saves en route to a 1.33 goals against average.

Ashland is under the leadership of second-year Head Coach Danny Krispinsky who is a former All-GLIAC performer for the Eagles. He directed AU to the league semifinals last fall.

Ashland's senior forward Kathleen Demaree has a goal and an assist for three points. Rookie midfielder Morgan Bittengle also has a goal and an assist in 2014.

Senior keeper Karly Beuck has allowed three goals in the first three contests this season.

Tonight's game is the first-ever meeting between the two schools in women's soccer. Ashland is the third straight opponent for CU from the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

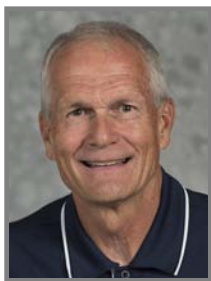

HEAD COACH JOHN MCGILLIVRAY



John McGillivray is one of the most well-respected soccer coaches in the state of Ohio and has been coaching soccer at Cedarville University since 1974.

McGillivray has been the head coach of the Lady Jackets since 1998. He served as the Cedarville men's head coach from 1974 through 1997.

Coupled with the 137 wins with the women, McGillivray has 352 total soccer victories at CU. His 300th overall win came in a 5-0 decision over Grace on Aug. 28, 2008. He picked up his 100th victory with the Lady Jackets in a 2-1 result at Point Park on Oct. 17, 2009.

McGillivray has enjoyed seven winning seasons with the Lady Jackets including a best-ever 15-7 mark in 2013. CU led the Great Midwest Athletic Conference with a 9-1 regular season mark and McGillivray was voted G-MAC Coach of the Year.

Cedarville finished 13-8-2 in 2004, won NCCAA Midwest Region championship, and secured an automatic berth in the NCCAA National Tournament. The 2000 club had a 12-7-2 record and made the school's first-ever NCCAA championship appearance in women's soccer.

McGillivray and his teams have long been recognized for their sportsmanlike behavior. His Lady Jackets twice received the Fair Play Team Award from the American Midwest Conference for their exemplary conduct on the field. He was presented the first-ever Distinguished Merit Award in 1990 by the Ohio Collegiate Soccer Officials Association. The National Intercollegiate Soccer Officials Association honored him in 1992 with their National Merit Award.

The Springfield, Ohio native led his men's teams to eight Mid-Ohio Conference titles, five NCCAA District III banners, three NAIA District 22 championships, and one NAIA Area IV crown which carried with it a trip to the NAIA Nationals in 1974. He guided his squad to five NCCAA National

Tournament appearances, a pair of NCCAA National Runner-Up finishes and he was chosen NCCAA National Coach of the Year in 1981.

McGillivray served at all levels of NAIA soccer including president of the NAIA Soccer Coaches Association from 1983 through 1985. He was inducted into the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1991 and the NAIA Hall of Fame in 1993.

McGillivray, who is an associate professor in the Department of Kinesiology and Allied Health, is a 1970 graduate of Cedarville College, and he earned his master's degree in 1976 from the University of Dayton. John and his wife, Bonnie, reside in Cedarville and have five children and 15 grandchildren.

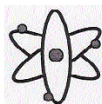

The G-MAC, headquartered in the Indianapolis metro area, sponsored 17 championships in 2013-14 as an active NCAA Division II conference.
