HOMECOMING

The 1964 Homecoming was the best attended alumni function in the current history of the school. The weather, if not quite ideal, was fine. The Homecoming banquet was attended by 121 persons, and many more alumni were present on the campus at various times during the day. The Homecoming parade featured six floats and three bands. Numerous displays by various school organizations were situated around the main campus. This year, for the first time, the Senior Class elected a Homecoming Queen, Miss Nancy Buerer, daughter of missionary parents. Among the highlights of the day was Cedarville's win over Central State College in a seesaw soccer match. The final score was 4-2. Coach Moody's team's hustle and continued pressuring of the Central State goal accounted for the margin of victory. The weekend was climaxed on Sunday morning by Marvin Troyer's penetrating analysis and comparison of the descriptions of the churches of Ephesus in Revelation 2 and Thessalonica in I Thessalonians 1.

The primary matter transacted at the business meeting was the changing of the current project to the underwriting of the expenses for a sound color film which will be used for promoting the College and, chiefly, for serving as the main element in the College's drive for building funds. The former project, that of salarying a full-time alumni contract man, was discarded in that the newly created office of Director of Public Relations encompasses many of the responsibilities which the alumni representative would normally fulfill. The amount of the new project is \$4,000. In that the number of alumni is presently around the 400 mark, the per capita share is \$10.
