Sometimes I like to think of our (the team's) lives as a TV show. And, if there was ever a time that our lives deserved to be filmed, it was this past week. TONIGHT'S GAME

The Cedarville University women's soccer team hosts the Tiffin University Dragons in a non-conference game tonight at Yellow Jacket Field. The contest is the second of a five-game homestand for the Lady Jackets.

The Jackets, 1-1, dropped a 3-0 decision to Ohio Dominican this past Wednesday night.

The Dragons, NCAA II members of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC), are 0-3 having dropped three straight home matches to begin the 2014 season.

The Jackets set a school mark for victories in 2013 by rolling to a 15-7 record. They also topped the Great Midwest Athletic Conference at 9-1 before stumbling in the league semifinals.

John McGillivray, who begins his 41st season coaching soccer at CU - 17 with the women (138-142-27), is excited about the 2014 squad. "Obviously, we have good players up and down the line. Jacoby Ziegler works really hard and not only scores goals, but creates chances as well. When you look in the back, Carly Gregory stands out with what she accomplished."



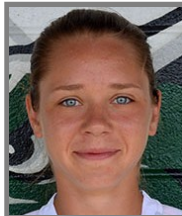

Ziegler, a junior forward, repeated as the G-MAC Offensive Player of the Year. She ranked third in Division II nationally in scoring with 20 goals and 10 assists for 50 points.

Gregory, a junior, was the G-MAC Defensive Player of the Year. She and Ziegler were joined on the all-conference first team by sophomore midfielder Grace Miorelli and junior defender Kaleigh Rowlands.

Tiffin is under the leadership of first-year Head Coach Melissa Bigg who served previously for three years as an assistant with the program.

Junior Emorie Milford has added two goals. Rookie keeper Samantha Orteni is seeing most of the action in the nets for Tiffin.

The Dragons lead the all-time series with CU by a 12-0-3 margin including 49-12 in goals scored. Tiffin posted a 1-0 win over visiting Cedarville last Oct. 8 as the Dragons scored the game's only goal in the second minute.

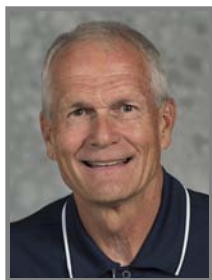

HEAD COACH JOHN MCGILLIVRAY



John McGillivray is one of the most well-respected soccer coaches in the state of Ohio and has been coaching soccer at Cedarville University since 1974.

McGillivray has been the head coach of the Lady Jackets since 1998. He served as the Cedarville men's head coach from 1974 through 1997.

Coupled with the 137 wins with the women, McGillivray has 352 total soccer victories at CU. His 300th overall win came in a 5-0 decision over Grace on Aug. 28, 2008. He picked up his 100th victory with the Lady Jackets in a 2-1 result at

Point Park on Oct. 17, 2009.

McGillivray has enjoyed seven winning seasons with the Lady Jackets including a best-ever 15-7 mark in 2013. CU led the Great Midwest Athletic Conference with a 9-1 regular season mark and McGillivray was voted G-MAC Coach of the Year.

Cedarville finished 13-8-2 in 2004, won NCCAA Midwest Region championship, and secured an automatic berth in the NCCAA National Tournament. The 2000 club had a 12-7-2 record and made the school's first-ever NCCAA championship appearance in women's soccer.

McGillivray and his teams have long been recognized for their sportsmanlike behavior. His Lady Jackets twice received the Fair Play Team Award from the American Mideast Conference for their exemplary conduct on the field. He was presented the first-ever Distinguished Merit Award in 1990 by the Ohio Collegiate Soccer Officials Association. The National Intercollegiate Soccer Officials Association honored him in 1992 with their National Merit Award.

The Springfield, Ohio native led his men's teams to eight Mid-Ohio Conference titles, five NCCAA District III banners, three NAIA District 22 championships, and one NAIA Area IV crown which carried with it a trip to

the NAIA Nationals in 1974. He guided his squad to five NCCAA National Tournament appearances, a pair of NCCAA National Runner-Up finishes and he was chosen NCCAA National Coach of the Year in 1981.

McGillivray served at all levels of NAIA soccer including president of the NAIA Soccer Coaches Association from 1983 through 1985. He was inducted into the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1991 and the NAIA Hall of Fame in 1993.

McGillivray, who is an associate professor in the Department of Kinesiology and Allied Health, is a 1970 graduate of Cedarville College, and he earned his master's degree in 1976 from the University of Dayton. John and his wife, Bonnie, reside in Cedarville and have five children and 15 grandchildren.

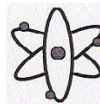
