Today's Games Preview

The Cedarville University baseball team hosts the Oakland City University Mighty Oaks in a non-conference doubleheader at Yellow Jacket Field. The twinbill is scheduled for two seven-inning contests.

Cedarville is 14-12 on the year including dropping two G-MAC games to Kentucky Wesleyan this past Tuesday by scores of 3-2 and 6-4.

Oakland City, independent members of the NCAA II, brings a 3-13 record into today's action. The Mighty Oaks were on the short end of a 5-4 decision at Bellarmine this past Wednesday.

Junior shortstop Sam Summerlin is hitting a team-leading .402 while also pacing the Jackets in hits (39), doubles (7) and total bases (50).

Cedarville's David Lenhardt, a sophomore catcher/DH, is second on the squad in hitting with a .367 mark (29-for-79). Lenhardt has produced team-best numbers in doubles (7), home runs (3), RBI's (21), slugging percentage (.595) and walks (25).



Freshmen Nathan Bancroft and Jaden Cleland have made significant contributions to the squad in recent games. Bancroft is hitting .366 on 15-for-41 while Cleland is at .333 with a third-best 16 RBI's on 17 base hits in 51 at bats.

Rookie third sacker Drew Johnson has a .303 batting average with a second-best 48 total bases. Johnson is tied with Summerlin and Lenhardt for the team lead in doubles (7) while pacing CU with four three-baggers.

Senior Cam McWilliams leads the Yellow Jackets in runs scored (24) and stolen bases (7). He ranks sixth all-time at CU with 119 runs and is tied for ninth all-time with 146 hits.



Junior right-hander Jordan Ammon tops the Jacket pitching corps with four wins, 39 innings pitched and 35 strikeouts.

Sophomore Tyler Hurt has registered four saves on the mound while rookie reliever Connor Hamilton leads the staff with 12 appearances.

The top hitter for the Mighty Oaks is junior Chaz Ferguson with a .300 batting mark as of April 1, 2014. He also tops the squad with 15 hits, two homers and 10 runs batted in. Classmate Kingsley Alarcon is hitting .245 but has also knocked in 10 runs on the year.

Freshman hurler Craig Peters is 1-1 on the year with a team-best 2.00 ERA in 18 innings of action. Classmate Alec Sandefer tops the Mighty Oaks staff with 19 K's.

The Yellow Jackets defeated Oakland City earlier this season on March 7 at the Clearwater Invitational in Florida. Jordan Ammon struck out a career-high nine batters in the 8-1 verdict.

Last Time Up

CEDARVILLE, Ohio - Kentucky Wesleyan rolled into Cedarville to make up a Great Midwest Athletic Conference doubleheader that was rained out on their field last Saturday and promptly left town with two victories, 3-2 and 6-4 this past Tuesday afternoon.

The Yellow Jackets, who played as the visitors in both games, had plenty of opportunities. They stranded a total of 21 runners on base for the day including leaving the bases loaded to end the second game.

Cedarville got on the board first in the opener. Cam McWilliams led off with a double and scored one out later on a Sam Summerlin double.

Trailing 3-1 entering the fifth, Drew Johnson doubled in David Lenhardt to cut the deficit to one. Despite having runners at second and third with one out, CU never scored again.

Johnson, McWilliams, and Summerlin had two hits apiece. Cedarville outhit the Panthers, 8-7, and each side had four batters hit by pitch.

The Yellow Jackets scored twice in the seventh inning to tie the night-cap, 3-3. KWC responded with two runs, one unearned, in its half of the inning and added a key insurance run on a two-out balk in the eighth.

Marshall Johnson tallied two hits and two RBI's for Cedarville, 14-12 overall and 4-4 G-MAC. McWilliams tacked on two more hits including a triple.

Kentucky Wesleyan is 13-8 and 5-3 G-MAC.



Head Coach Mike Manes



Mike Manes (pronounced MAN-us) has been the head baseball coach at Cedarville University since 2008. He has guided the Yellow Jackets to the six winningest seasons in school history and five trips to the NCCAA National Tournament.

Manes has won more games than any previous baseball coach that CU has ever had. The Jackets, who are coming off of a 29-19 campaign while winning their third straight NCCAA Midwest Region banner, have enjoyed five consecutive winning seasons - the longest streak in the modern era of Cedarville's 100-plus year baseball history.

CU set the school record for the most victories in a season in 2012 with a 38-13 record. The Yellow Jackets won their third NCCAA Midwest Region banner in the past four years and advanced to the national tournament as the No. 1 seed.

Cedarville was 33-18-2 in 2011 and had a best-ever five NCCAA All-Americans on the roster. The Jackets copped the NCCAA Midwest Region banner for the second time in three years and returned to the NCCAA National Tournament. Manes was named the Region Coach of the Year.

Cedarville finished with a 28-27 record in 2010. The Jackets were also the NCCAA Midwest Region runner-up.

Manes was named the 2009 NCCAA Midwest Region Coach of the Year after leading Cedarville to the region title. The Yellow Jackets won over 30 games for the first time in school history with their 32-28 record and split four games at the NCCAA Nationals.

Cedarville was the Midwest Region runner-up in Manes' first season in 2008. The Jackets set a then school record for the most victories in season with 23. They also won eight games in the tough American Midwest Conference which equaled their league win total from the previous three seasons combined.

Manes came to the Yellow Jackets following a four-year stay as head coach at Trinity International University near Chicago. He was able to turn the TIU program around after inheriting a team that won just four games in his first season in 2004 and the school had never qualified for the conference tournament.

Manes then guided the Trojans to 85 victories over the next three seasons by winning 25, 28, and 32 games, respectively, which set school records for the most victories in a season each time. The 2006 squad put together TIU's first-ever winning season and the 2007 team finished 32-22.

In his short tenure, Manes guided the Trojans to their first-ever conference tournament appearance, two NCCAA North Central Region championships, and TIU played in the NCCAA National Tournament in each of his last three seasons. He was tabbed the 2005 NCCAA North Central Region Coach of the Year.

The Nebraska native previously founded and coached the Lincoln Crusaders which is an American Legion baseball club. In his 11 years at the helm, the team made nine trips to the state tournament winning one championship and finishing as the runner-up on two other occasions.

Manes is actively involved in baseball administration. He is currently the NCCAA baseball chair as well as the chair of the new Great Midwest Athletic Conference.

Manes is a 1989 graduate of Liberty University and he earned a master's degree in 2005 from Alameda University. Mike and his wife, Connie, reside in Springfield and have four married children and seven grandchildren.
