



Last Time Out



Defending G-MAC champion Alderson Broaddus took its only lead of the game on a tip-in with five seconds remaining to pull out a 76-74 verdict over the Yellow Jackets in the Callan Athletic Center on Thursday night.

A potential game-tying jumper bounced off the rim at the buzzer for Cedarville, 8-14 overall and 4-4 G-MAC.

The Battlers, 15-6 and 8-2 G-MAC, finished the contest on an 8-0 run. They held the Jackets scoreless for the final 3:36 and to just one field goal in the last five minutes.

Cedarville scored the first basket of the night, AB tied it 2-2, and the hosts held the upper hand for the next 39-plus minutes. They enjoyed leads of 16-4 and 19-7 before settling in for a 36-29 difference at the intermission.

The last double digit lead for the Yellow Jackets was 49-38 at the 16:22 mark. Alderson Broaddus finally equalized with two minutes left before eventually getting the game winner.

Marcus Reineke led the way with 19 points. Easton Bazzoli finished with 17 points and Leighton Smith added 12.

AB shot 62 percent from the field in the second half and 52 percent for the game. The visitors controlled the boards, 39-22, including 19 offensive rebounds.

Numbers Game:

- Reineke, who entered the game 6th in Division II free throw accuracy, went 6-for-6 to up his percentage to .921.
- Bazzoli is averaging 16.3 points in his last three games while shooting .677 (21-for-31) from the field.
- · Smith scored in double figures for the sixth time in the last eight games.
- Alderson Broaddus attempted only four free throws the lowest by any CU opponent this season.

Alderson Broaddus senior Tobias Dowdell averaged a double-double to help carry the athletic forward to Great Midwest Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Athlete of the Week accolades.

Dowdell helped steer the G-MAC-leading Battlers to a pair of conference wins against Ohio Valley and Salem International, Alderson

Broaddus is now 14-6 overall this year with a 7-2 record in the G-MAC.

Dowdell averaged 17.5 points per game and 14.5 rebounds per contest to help control the paint in the two home contests. Additionally, he shot 70 percent from the field (14-of-20) and his peripheral averages were strong at 3.0 assists, 4.0 steals and 2.0 blocks per

The product from Birmingham, Ala., also pulled in 10 rebounds on the offensive glass and sank seven of his nine free throw attempts. He also played 34.5 minutes against OVU

Against Salem International, Dowdell scored 21 points and was a menace on the boards with 15. His double-double was complemented by four assists, three blocks and three steals.

Dowdell's strong shooting effort helped the Battlers shooting nearly 46 percent from the field during the game, as AB eventually pulled away from the Tigers in the second half.

Saturday produced another impressive double-double with a 14/14 effort from Dowdell. He was near-perfect shooting again at a 6-for-8 clip and was pesky on the defensive end with five steals.

Alderson Broaddus entered the week in a stalemate at the top of the conference standings with Kentucky Wesleyan. With the Panthers idle, AB was able to take advantage with

On the season through 20 games, Dowdell is averaging 8.5 points and 6.2 rebounds per game. He ranks second in the G-MAC in field goal percentage (.613) and is 10th in rebounding.





Head Coach Pat Estepp

Pat Estepp has been the head men's basketball coach at Cedarville University since the 2008-09 campaign. He has guided his alma mater to an average of 21 victories per season and five national tournament appearances.

The Yellow Jackets' first active season in NCAA Division II resulted in a 22-9 mark in 2012-13. Estepp was voted the Great Midwest Athletic Conference Coach of the Year as his team claimed the G-MAC regular season title, the G-MAC Tournament trophy, and placed third in the NCCAA Championship.

Cedarville was 23-9 during its NCAA provisional year in 2011-12. They won the school's first NCCAA Championship banner in convincing fashion after entering the 2012 tournament as the No. 1 seed and winning their three games by an average of 18 points. Estepp was tabbed NCCAA National Coach of the Year.

Cedarville finished strong again in 2010-11 by winning eight of their last nine regular season games including the last five in a row. The Jackets were ranked as high as 14th in the NAIA Division II poll and finished at 20-13.

Cedarville won 16 of its last 18 games in 2009-10 to finish 26-9 and 14-2 in the American Mideast Conference as the league runner-up. The Yellow Jackets, who were rated as high as 8th in the national poll, later won the AMC Tournament and advanced to the second round of the national tournament.

Estepp's inaugural campaign at the helm was full of memorable accomplishments. He guided the Yellow Jackets to a 27-4 overall record and a share of the AMC title with a 12-1 league mark. Cedarville was ranked as high as No. 1 in the country, finished in a tie for the No. 2 spot in the final poll, and advanced to the national tournament.

The Jackets assembled a number of school records which included a 14-game winning streak. They also wiped out all of the previous marks for defense.

Cedarville led the country in field goal percentage defense with opponents shooting just 37.9 percent. They also ranked second nationally by allowing a stingy 60 points per contest which was 10 points per game lower than the old school record.

Estepp's leadership did not go unnoticed. He was voted the AMC Coach of the Year as well as the NCCAA Midwest Region Coach of the Year.

Estepp took on his current position after serving as an assistant coach for eight years under former head coach Ray Slagle. He played a key role during Slagle's successful tenure with the Yellow Jackets from 2000 to 2008.

Cedarville won 177 games during that timespan, averaged 24.1 wins over the last seven seasons, won three American Mideast Conference titles, and two AMC Tournament championships.



The Yellow Jackets made five trips to the NAIA Division II National Tournament where they never lost in the first round. They advanced to the semifinals once, the quarterfinals twice, and to the second round twice.

This is the first head coaching position for Estepp. A 1997 graduate of Cedarville College with a degree in physical education, he was a student assistant at the school during his senior year and went on to acquire coaching experience at all levels of basketball.

Estepp was the 8th grade coach at Cedarville Junior High School in 1996-97. He spent the next year at Clark County Christian High School in Kentucky where he was the varsity assistant boys basketball coach and the head coach in golf and tennis.

Estepp spent the 1998-99 season as the junior varsity coach at Oak Hill (Ohio) High School. He held the same position in 1999-2000 at South Webster (Ohio) High School which is where he graduated from in 1993.

Estepp comes from a rich basketball coaching heritage. His father, Dale, spent 27 years in the profession at Fairfield Union and South Webster high schools.

Estepp also has a master's degree in education from Cedarville University that he earned in 2008. Pat and his wife, Melanie, reside in Cedarville with their three children: sons Isaiah, 13, and Grant, 10, as well as daughter, Merynn, 4.

Former soccer standout Kristen DeVinney Geyer, basketball All-American Julie Nourse Hudson, and distance running champion Sergio Reyes are the newest members of the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame.

The three were inducted during the 2015 $\acute{\text{H}}$ all of Fame Brunch on Saturday morning, January 31 in the Stevens Student Center.

GEYER, a product of Perry, N.Y. who currently resides in Cary, N.C., was a member of the first Lady Jacket varsity soccer team. She produced an outstanding four-year career from 1997-2000 in which she was a two-time NCCAA All-American as one of CU's first two players to ever earn the honor her freshman season.

Geyer was a three-time NCCAA Midwest Region performer and was twice voted to the American Mideast Conference team. She still ranks among the Lady Jackets' top five all-time leaders in goals, assists, and points.

HUDSON, who still resides in her hometown of Springfield, Ohio, was a four-time NCCAA All-American during her career from 1997-2001. She was a four-time NCCAA Midwest Region First Team choice and four-time all-conference honoree.

Hudson was the 1998 Mid-Ohio Conference Freshman of the Year. She currently ranks 8th all-time in scoring (1,706) and 8th in rebounding (118)

REYES, a California native who lives in Palmdale, developed a long list of accomplishments during his brief two-year Yellow Jacket career from 2000-02. In cross country, he was a two-time NAIA and NCCAA All-American to go along with the 2002 NCCAA individual title.

On the track, Reyes was the 2002 NAIA outdoor 10,000 meter champion and was a six-time NAIA All-American. He was honored in 2002 as the NCCAA Outdoor Outstanding Performer of the Meet.

Jackets Succeed in Classroom



CEDARVILLE, Ohio - Cedarville University student-athletes continue to be just as impressive in the classroom as they are in the field of competition.

The Yellow Jackets remain among the best in Division II according to the recently released NCAA Academic Success Rate data.

CU tied for 12th nationally among 313 Division II schools in Federal Graduation Rate at 78 percent. The FGR computes the percentage of student-athletes, who earned their degree in the six-year window from the 2007-08 academic year through 2012-13.

The Academic Success Rate (ASR) calculates how studentathletes are making satisfactory progress toward a degree. Cedarville, at 91 percent, tied for 21st in the country in that category.

Fran Campbell, Assistant Academic Vice President for Student Success & University Registrar, proclaimed, "We are pleased to confirm that the academic success and graduation rates for our student-athletes remain very strong, and even improved in comparison with last year's commendable percentages.

"Although the graduation rate for our overall student body decreased slightly to 70% for this reporting cycle, this rate for our student-athletes increased to 78%. This is a notable comparison which reflects very positively on the quality and achievements of our student-athletes!"

According to the NCAA report, the FGR for all Division II student-athletes across the country is 55 percent, an improvement of one percent over last year, while the rate for the overall student body remained the same at 48 percent. The DII national ASR average is 71 percent.

Athletic Director Dr. Alan Geist added, "This is a great achievement. God continually blesses Cedarville University with tremendous student-athletes who take all aspects of their education seriously.

"As always, I want to say thanks to our coaching staff and to each member of our faculty, staff, and administration for all they have done to help our student-athletes be successful in the classroom."
