"I earned my first nickel," said white-haired George Milner, "running an errand for a lady."

He bought stick candy for his brothers and sisters that day 75 years ago, and the experience was so heady, "I've worked ever since," Milner recalls.

On his 80th birthday, seated in his cramped president-treasurer's office and peering over his eye-glasses, he continues steering the firm he founded on a pre-depression days shoe-string, Milner Electric Co., 1320 St. Clair Ave.

He runs it with shirt-sleeve friendliness.

Busy as Ever

Business hasn't interfered with George Milner's service to his community. Nor will being 80.

He's president of the Home & Flower Show, a Rotarian and a member of the Chamber of Commerce.

He's a past president and current member of Electrical League, Builders Exchange and Baptist Home of Ohio.

"Hard work, young man," Milner says earnestly. "It never hurt anyone. Why, I never hire a man without first asking him how he feels about getting up in the morning."

Enrollment High At Cedarville College

RETURNING CLASSMEN ARE OUTNUMBERED ON CAMPUS

Rev. James T. Jeremiah, president of Cedarville College, Cedarville, Ohio, has reported the largest enrollment of students for the fall term in the 72 year history of the college.

The enrollment includes 130 new students and 120 returning students. College officials are making plans to handle 300 students for the 1960-61 school year. Last year's enrollment reached a high of 189.

Cedarville College is one of six schools approved by the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches, and is the only liberal arts college.

A new two-story dormitory for girls was built this summer, and the basement of the administration building was remodeled to make room for two classrooms, a postoffice and a printing room. Other improvements have been made. Plans have also been made for future improvement and enlargement.

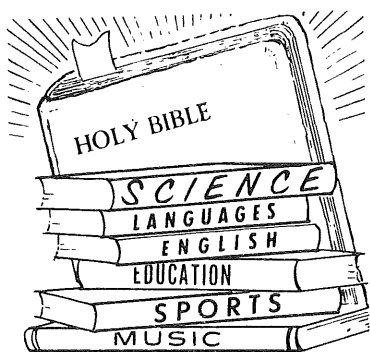
Cedarville College was host to 57 missionary candidates and staff workers attending the annual Seminar of the Baptist Mid-Missions, August 3-15.
