SO YOU WANT TO WORK

The statement "I'm working my way through college" has been made to sound so easy. May we take a moment to think what sacrifices are made when one works to finance his college education.

College life comprises four short years. These years are an important phase in one's life. In going to college one institutes a purpose of obtaining an education with evidences shown through grades and a thorough preparation for one's vocation or profession.

There are instances in a person's life when he is financially unprepared for expenses of a college education. Each year a number of students find themselves in the foregoing situation. In such cases, the college undertakes to furnish a limited number of student-labor jobs on the campus, in the dormitories, in the library, and in the dining hall. These jobs are granted to deserving students who need to supplement their income. Employment may also be found in the homes, stores, and plants in Cedarville and surrounding cities.

However, the hours a person spends working while in college take away from the time he can spend in extra-curricular activities that are so necessary in the full development of a personality. Also the work robs one of the time needed to study to make those higher grades. So, students who work are asked to take a reduced course load.

On the other hand, some types of jobs provide a person with valuable experience. This job experience aids in developing a person's ability to be self-sufficient and to be able to get along with other people.

The ideal situation would call for parental and student financial planning long before entering college. Of course, there are circumstances which compel a student to work in order to gain a higher education, at which time the college will give assistance in obtaining a job that provides the necessary monetary help.

Christian testimony is being tried in all that we do. Students who go out to work are encouraged to do the best job that they can so that, in all things Jesus Christ may be honored and glorified.
