Friday, April 1, was the date for the annual day for entertaining prospective students. This year the program was held for one day only. There were 340 registrations for this conference. The morning hours were given over to campus tours and viewing of departmental displays and interviews with faculty members. The chapel period provided a well-rounded musical program, with selections from the Cedarville College Choir, and many of the musical groups which have been developed in our music department. The afternoon was given over to recreation. The evening was climaxed by the presentation of a well-received comedy play, Professor, How Could You?, under the direction of Mr. Dale Thomson.

The current rate of new student applications foreshadows another record enrollment. It is exceeding anything we had ever hoped for. This unprecedented interest in Cedarville has necessitated the addition of a number of faculty members in several areas. It is expected now that the enrollment will reach well above 325 for the fall semester.

Mr. John Brumbaugh, instructor in our science department, has been awarded an assistantship in the genetics department of Iowa State University of the '60-'61 school year. He will leave Cedarville in June in order to take up residence at Ames for the summer session.

Miss Ruth Yost, alumna of '59, was a recent visitor on campus. She spoke to the Women's Missionary Society of Grace Baptist Church of Cedarville, and to various groups at the college. Ruth plans to leave for Belgium for language school before June of this year, hoping to complete this training in one year, then go to serve with Missions in the western sector of the Belgium Congo.

Reverend Jerrold Root, formerly of Beaver Dams, New York, and a graduate of Cedarville College in the class of 1959, was ordained into the Baptist ministry January 29, during the evening service of the Baptist Church of Monterey, New York. Following the ordination service, Rev. Root and the former Miss Mary Short were united in marriage, and are now residing in their new home at Corinth, Vermont, where he pastors the Congregational Church.

This leaves \$76,000 to be raised by the sale of bonds before we can complete the building program so necessary for the increased enrollment of next fall.
