WELCOME: DR. WILLIAM T. HOPEWELL

The newest member of the Cedarville College Alumni Association is Dr. William T. Hopewell, newly-appointed executive secretary of the Association of Baptists for World Evangelism. Dr. Hopewell received his honorary doctor of divinity degree at commencement June 8th and is the seventh honorary alumnus to be so recognized by the college since 1953.

The others are: Dr. George S. Milner (1961); Dr. Hall Dautel (1963); Dr. J. Irving Reese (1963); Dr. Kenneth W. Masteller (1964); Dr. Ruth Hege (1965); and Dr. Roy G. Hamman (1966).

Dr. Hopewell was accorded honor by the Board of Trustees of Cedarville College for notable achievement in the varied fields of seminary teaching, chaplaincy, authorship, and missionary service.

Cedarville College is rejoicing in the tremendous upsurge in alumni financial support over the last two years. AAG I netted \$2728.18 over a four-month period. The stress of each annual drive is from November-February. The summer backlog or interim giving by alumni counts toward the following AAG drive.

AAG II covered the giving from March, 1967 through March, 1968. The grand total was \$7373.93 for which God is to be praised and alumni of Cedarville College are to be commended.

The best news is that AAG III concentration from November, 1968-February, 1969 already has a backlog of accumulated contributions amounting to \$6050.54 as of July 10, 1968. Class agents are responsible for much of this success. Alumni support is especially vital to Cedarville College with its convictions.

ALUMNI AWARDS

Homecoming 1968 will mark the first distribution of alumni awards sponsored by the Cedarville College Alumni Association. Included in the banquet presentations will be the Class Agent of the Year Award and the Annual Alumni Giving Class Award.

Of special significance are the Honorary Alumni Award and the Alumni of the Year Award. Potential recipients of the latter award are being studied carefully by the Executive Committee. Nominations were received at the unofficial association business meeting in June.

A special mailing to voting members containing the names, photographs, and resumes of three qualified individuals for the Honorary Alumni Award will be distributed in August. The three persons will be placed on the ballot from the nominations received at the June business meeting.

The association constitution should be consulted for vindication of award procedure. The deadline for the reception of ballots will be announced.
