IT TAKES MORE THAN

A TROWEL

TO BUILD COLLEGE BUILDINGS

Without a craftsman to use it the trowel is a useless tool. Obviously many types of material must also be used. The building program of Cedarville College is dependent upon friends who will provide money for all of these essentials by the purchase of

## WHAT SHALL WE DO?

Cedarville College faces the greatest challenge in its entire history. More young people are interested in receiving a college education on our campus now, than at any time since the college was founded in 1887.

According to the report from the registrar's office, registrations are being received at a rate of two-to-one over last year. Last fall we enrolled one hundred seventy-six freshmen. Obviously, we cannot take three hundred fifty-two freshmen for next fall. We hope, however, to have at least four hundred and fifty in our student body by September of 1961.

It is impossible to estimate what our total enrollment could be by 1970, if we had the resources to provide housing, classrooms, and other facilities for our students. It may be 500, 800, 1000-- who knows?

This one thing sure, we cannot grow beyond our ability to care for the young people who come to us. We cannot house five hundred students in dormitories made to care for three hundred; we cannot seat five hundred students in a cafeteria which operates at capacity when 400 eat three meals a day in this small building.

Obviously, there is a limit. We shall be limited by the lack of funds which are needed for buildings and equipment. Bonds have been sold to build dormitories, but here there is a limit, too. We must have gifts from many sources if a great deal more building is to be done.

What shall we do? With the Lord's help, we intend to go forward and make as many preparations as possible for a larger student body. With this new year and a greater challenge than ever, we are "reaching forth unto those things which are before" knowing that we "can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth" us (Phil. 3:14; 4:13).

With your prayerful support, new buildings and equipment will be provided so that we shall not miss the opportunity of giving a Christian education to the many young people who are looking our way.

## NEW TEACHERS NEEDED

If the present enrollment rate continues, we shall need additional faculty members in the following areas when the fall semester begins in September of 1961:

Business. We shall need a person in this field who is able to teach shorthand, typing and elementary accounting. It is also preferred that this teacher be able to handle courses in business mathematics and business English. We must have one who has at least a master's degree in some area of business.

Biology. A person with at least a master's degree is needed, whose training is strong in botany. He should be able to teach such courses as general botany, systematic botany, ecology, physiology and bacteriology.

Physics - Mathematics. We are interested in strengthening these areas, and we are looking for someone with at least a master's degree in either area who could teach basic courses in the other area. Our present goals would be to offer fifteen to twenty semester hours in each area.

In each case above, we have stated the minimum requirements as a master's degree in the respective areas. The ideal, of course, would be new faculty members with Ph. D. degrees.

It is understood that any teachers coming to Cedarville must be in agreement with the doctrinal position and the spiritual objectives of the college.

If you are qualified in any of the areas mentioned, or you know someone who is, please contact the President of the college.

## PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS

The annual prospective students conference has been one of the highlights in the program at Cedarville College. A number of young people have enrolled in the college as a result of these conferences.

Because of the crowded condition of our dormitories we have been forced to discontinue these conferences. In addition to the present student body, we find it impossible to house and feed three to four hundred more who have been coming each year for "Prospective Students Day."

As a substitute for this program, we are urging the pastors to bring groups from the churches at a time convenient to them. We will be able to provide food and overnight entertainment for these smaller groups.
