

CC Plans Gym

Cedarville College Trustees have approved preliminary plans for a new gymnasium to be located on the old campus football field, Rev. James T. Jeremiah, college president, announced today.

Plans approved by the trustees included a regulation-size basket-ball floor, book store, student union and room for holding banquets plus physical education classrooms.

Rev. Mr. Jeremiah said construction may possibly start this summer but will depend on funds available at the time. No monies will be borrowed or bonds sold to finance the project.

Bleachers will be provided for 800 people and there will be enough room to seat additional people in front of the stands, which would provide for 1,000 seating capacity. If more room is needed in the future the building will be constructed so additional seating can be added.

Four dressing rooms are included in the plans, and the floor plan will permit playing two games at the same time by playing cross court.

Front portion of the building will consist of a student union, including a lounge, game room, snack bar and a book store on the first floor, and on the second floor a 30 by 90 foot room will provide a classroom and banquet room.

Present plans call for a 125x 140 foot structure, but the plans are not definite, said Rev. Mr. Jeremiah.

The president said that if the building is constructed the present gym on campus will be turned into a chapel, the college chapel will become a classroom and the book store and snack bar, located in the men's dorm, will be used for additional dormitory rooms.



Certainly you as students can make a valuable contribution by continuing to pray for the leaders of Cedarville College, by encouraging individuals and your churches to contribute regularly to the college, and last, but not least, by living up to your own capabilities as a student, accepting your responsibility of doing the best work possible in keeping with your abilities.
