national tournament berth will be on the line when the #2 seed Yellow Jackets host #3 Roberts Wesleyan in the Callan Athletic Center this afternoon in the American Mideast Conference Tournament semifinal.

The winner earns the league's second automatic bid to the NAIA Division II National Tournament in Point Lookout, Mo. on March 9-15. The victor also travels to play at regular season champion and #2 ranked Walsh on March 1, the AMC's other automatic qualifier, in the tournament championship game.

Today's match-up features the two hottest teams in the league. Cedarville, 19-11 overall, has won six straight and nine of its last 10. That lone setback was to the Raiders, 77-68, at home on Feb.

Roberts Wesleyan, also 19-11, has won 10 in a row and 12 of its last 13. One of those victories during the streak was 72-63 over then unbeaten and #1 Walsh. The last time the Raiders stumbled was 81-76 in overtime at Mount Vernon Nazarene on Jan. 22.

Both teams got to this point by claiming opening round home games on Feb. 22. The Yellow Jackets solved #5 Point Park, 82-77, while Roberts defeated #4 Malone, 85-77.

This will be the third meeting between the two schools. Cedarville, who leads the all-time series 11-5, won in Rochester, N.Y. back on Dec. 11 by a 72-61 count. Neither team was at full strength at the time because of injuries.

The Yellow Jackets are attempting to make one final return trip to the Branson, Mo. area in this, their final year in the NAIA.

Cedarville has qualified for the Division II event in seven of the past eight years posting a 10-7 record with one Final Four appearance. Roberts Wesleyan made its only trip in 2001, losing in the first round, before it was a member of the AMC.

The Yellow Jackets are led on the offensive end by senior guard Matt Harner - averaging 18.5 points per game with a team-high 100 three-point field goals - a new school record for most three's in a single season. He has moved into second all-time at CU with 302 long-distance baskets. Harner tops the squad with a .415 mark from behind the arc and is second in the AMC at the charity stripe at .839.



Sophomore forward Brian Hecker is CU's second player in double figures with 11.8 ppg and is the team's second-leading rebounder at 5 boards per contest.

Senior point guard Derrick Hannon is hitting 11.2 points per contest and leads the Jackets and the AMC with 142 assists. He has a team-high 55 steals while grabbing 4.1 boards per game.

The Raider roster includes one of the league's leading scorers and rebounders in Jordan Heath. The 6-10 sophomore leads RWC with 14.5 ppg and 6.8 boards per contest. He has been hampered with a recent ankle injury.



Dan Foley, a 6-3 senior guard, is in the AMC's Top 10 in assists and steals. He adds 13.4 points per game with a team-high 32 three-point field goals.

Alif Bland, a 6-8 post, scores 11.7 ppg with 87 blocked shots.

Last Time Out



Brian Hecker pumped in 23 points to lead #2 seed Cedarville to an 82-77 victory over #5 Point Park in the first round of the American Mideast Conference Tournament in the Callan Athletic Center.

Cedarville finished the first period with a 12-3 run for a 48-30 lead and then increased the bulge to 19 with the first point of the second half. However, Point Park, who had rallied from a 24-point deficit to win its regular season finale just to get into the AMC post-season, had Cedarville squirming in the second half.

The Pioneers needed only five minutes to close the deficit to 58-54 after completing a string of 12 straight points. But, Hecker scored 10 of Cedarville's next 18 points to keep the visitors at arm's length in pushing the spread back to 76-65 at the 6:10 mark.

Point Park made one final push, got to within three points, and then CU committed a shot clock violation with 25 seconds left. The Pioneers rimmed out a three-pointer and Daniel Kohavi accounted for the final with a dunk at the buzzer.

Brian Grant was the only other Yellow Jacket to score in double figures with 13 points to go along with a team-high eight rebounds. Kohavi and Austin Foote came off the bench with nine points each.

Point Park ends its season at 15-12.

Kenny Reep's Blog

Disclaimer: The blog you are about to read (or skim) is maudlin and overly sentimental, has very little to do with basketball and may bore you to tears... but I don't care. Enjoy!

My college basketball career mostly happened by accident. I was not recruited in high school, and although I achieved a modicum of success in my senior year, I spent my first three years scratching for playing time. As I grew into my body and spent my afternoons in the off-seasons playing pick-up ball at the municipal field house, I always dreamt of playing basketball at the next level. This was mostly because my late-bloomer body was just starting to develop into a big-boy basketball frame and I finally started to feel like a legitimate player. Even then, I was tall but lacked next-level athleticism, a low-post scoring arsenal, and the killer instinct needed to be an impact player in any serious college program.

As I narrowed my college decision and decided to come to Cedarville, I decided to make a visit to campus. I had been somewhat familiar with the basketball program, as I had attended summer camps under current uncle and former head coach Jeff Reep and then-coach Ray Slagle. My cousin Ryan, a 2009 graduate, was also a sophomore member of the team at the time. Ryan planted the seedling of possibility in my mind that I could possibly play ball at CU and wanted me to come by and watch practice. As I was introduced to Ryan's teammates, I was immediately struck by their warmth and down-to-earth sensibilities. Every member of the team were genuine friends to one another and this made an immediate impact on me. I wanted to be a part of this.

To cut a long story short, I walked-on, made the JV team and at Christmas of my freshman year I was moved up and onto the varsity roster. For the first time in my life, I was the member of a team in which everyone got along, the coaches were likable, and both the players and coaching staff benefitted from a high level of mutual respect. This was a far cry from my high school experiences. I loved where I was at basketball-wise. Although I was just an undersized and under-skilled freshman cheering from the bench, I was happy to be a part of a great team and an even greater group of guys. Deep down I figured that if I continued to work hard and put in my time, soon I would find myself on the court making an impact. I looked at some of the upperclassmen that struggled for meaningful playing time and thought to myself, "I'll never be that guy. I'll quit basketball before I spend my afternoon hours toiling in practice just to sit on the bench on game nights."

As I spent more time with these guys though, I understood how well-respected these guys were amongst their teammates and how they played not only for the love of the game, but for the love of every other guy with a Yellow Jacket jersey.

As the years wore on, I continued to struggle and to learn and soon found myself in the very same position I always dreaded, that of the upperclassman bench-warmer. I found though, that quitting basketball was no longer an option as my freshman-self had once postulated. I loved this program too much, I had been through and seen too much and most of all, I loved my teammates too much to quit. I felt that it was still my job to encourage and be the best possible teammate I could, no matter how painful it may be. I learned to endure the disappointment with the faint hope that my coaches were not taking me for granted and that somehow I was making some small difference for my teammates.

Although I did not always feel taken seriously as a player, I was determined not to let it dampen my spirit. I resolved that I would play (or not play) for the benefit of others only and for the glory of my Creator. I have found that since I have adopted this view, I'm no longer angered or disappointed by the game of basketball. I play not to put the ball through



an orange rim, but to spend time with the guys who mean most to me. I ultimately hope that no matter how I may be perceived otherwise, by players or coaches, I want to be remembered as a guy who cared first and foremost about his teammates. To be honest, I have never been too concerned with wins or losses, ever. This may come as a shock to others and to some it may not but I just want to have fun with my teammates and I like to win because they like to win. I don't hate losing because I am afraid of a wrathful coach, but because I hate long faces and somber bus rides. I hate the disappointment in the faces of guys who just left their heart and soul on the court for 40 minutes. I love to win because nothing beats seeing the pure joy on the faces of my teammates after a solid victory. I love to win because nothing beats seeing them satisfied in their accomplishment at the end of the night.

Over the last five years, I have seen players come and go (myself included, which is the reason I'm a fifth-year senior). I have experienced elation and sorrow and I have ridden all the ups and downs that come with basketball and with life. When I made huge mistakes, my teammates were there to pick me up and the coaches were there to welcome me back into the fold. I have experienced redemption from both my God and my teammates. They have pushed and encouraged me to seek a higher relationship with the Most High. It is for this that I am most thankful.

My pride has taken some massive hits lately but I hope that I can use it as yet another learning experience in this grand adventure. I want to keep winning as we ride our momentum into the post-season and I would want nothing less than to finish on the ultimate high note - as National Champions.

However, when the buzzer sounds and the curtain finally closes on my college basketball career, I will shed no tears, for it has truly been a long, strange.... and (mostly) wonderful trip.

KANSAS CITY, Mo - Winners of 20-straight games, No. 1-ranked Northwood (Fla.) highlights the 10th regular-season edition of the NAIA Division II Men's Basketball Coaches' Top 25 Poll. The active winning streak is the nation's longest and has Northwood at 28-2 on the season. The Seahawks boast the top ranking for the second-straight week and earned 14 of the possible 15 first-place votes.

The final regular-season Coaches' Top 25 poll and 32-Championship qualifiers will be officially announced on March 2 by 3 p.m. CST. That announcement will be made on www.NAIA.org. The NAIA will partner with the Victory Sports Network (VSN) on the announcement of the 32-team National Championship bracket. VSN will be the exclusive home for the live, free video-streaming show to air on www.VictorySportsNetwork.com. The Division II women's show will run from 6-6:30 p.m., with the Division II men's show to follow from 7-7:30 p.m.

Two newcomers this week, No. 24 Indiana East and No. 25 Jamestown (N.D.), have both been mentioned in the Top 25 earlier this year. Indiana East was 25th back on Dec. 13 and Jamestown was No. 24 on Feb. 7. The Red Wolves have won 10 of their last 11 games, including a 101-96 victory against then-No. 17 Indiana-Southeast on Feb. 19. Jamestown is 7-3 in its last 10 games and moved into a tie for second-place in the Dakota Athletic Conference standings.

Northwood tallied 405 total points in the poll. The Seahawks enter The Sun Conference Tournament as the No. 1 seed. They will face the winner of Southeastern (Fla.) and Johnson & Wales (Fla.) on Tuesday in the Quarterfinals. During its 20-game winning streak, Northwood has won by double-digits in 18 of those games.

With a 28-1 overall record, second-ranked Walsh (Ohio) grabs the remaining first-place vote and 392 total points. The Cavs have already locked up their seventh-straight trip to the National Championship as the American Mideast Conference's regular-season winner. They also earned a spot in the AMC Championship game, to be played on March 1. Walsh won its 47th-straight home contest in the regular-season finale against Houghton (N.Y.), 95-66 on Feb. 19

Moving up one position to No. 3 is Oklahoma Wesleyan. The Eagles recorded 378 points in the poll and improved to 27-3 on the year after a 77-74 victory at Central Christian (Kan.) on Feb. 19. Marked as the No. 2 seed in the upcoming Midlands Collegiate Athletic Conference Tournament, Oklahoma Wesleyan will face No. 20 Ozarks (Mo.) on Friday in the semifinals.

No. 4 Cornerstone (Mich.) slips one position after a double-overtime loss at then-No. 11 Davenport (Mich.) on Feb. 19. This week, the Golden Eagles posted 356 total points in the poll. With a 26-4 overall record, Cornerstone won the Wolverine-Hoosier Athletic Conference regular-season championship with a 14-2 league mark.

Holding at the fifth spot is Black Hills State (S.D.). Winners of the Dakota Athletic Conference, the Yellow Jackets gathered 355 total points in the Top 25. Black Hills State won its sixth-straight game and improved to 23-5 on the year with a 67-56 victory against Dickinson State (N.D.) on Feb. 19.

Eleven conferences are represented this week, led by the four members from the Cascade Collegiate Conference (CCC), Mid-Central College Conference (MCC) and Great Plains Athletic Conference (GPAC). Coming out of the CCC are No. 8 Oregon Tech, No. 11 Eastern Oregon, No. 18 Warner Pacific (Ore.) and No. 23 Northwest (Wash.). The MCC claims No. 10 Indiana Wesleyan, No. 14 Grace (Ind.), No. 16 Saint Francis (Ind.) and No. 22 Huntington (Ind.). These four hail from the GPAC: No. 12 Northwestern (Iowa), No. 15 Sioux Falls (S.D.), No. 17 Dakota Wesleyan (S.D.) and No. 19 Briar Cliff (Iowa). The Midlands Collegiate Conference land a trio of teams.

The poll was voted upon by a panel of head coaches representing each of the conferences and independents.
