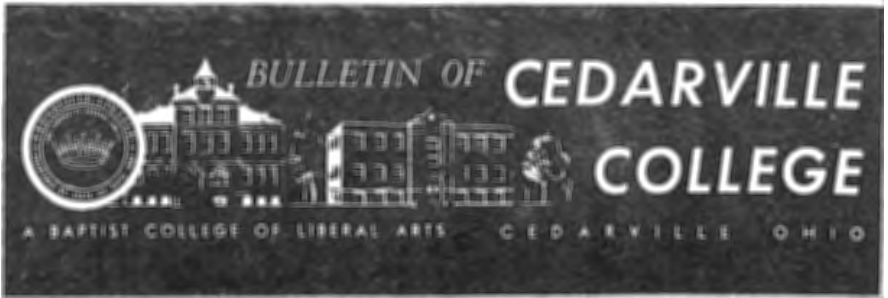

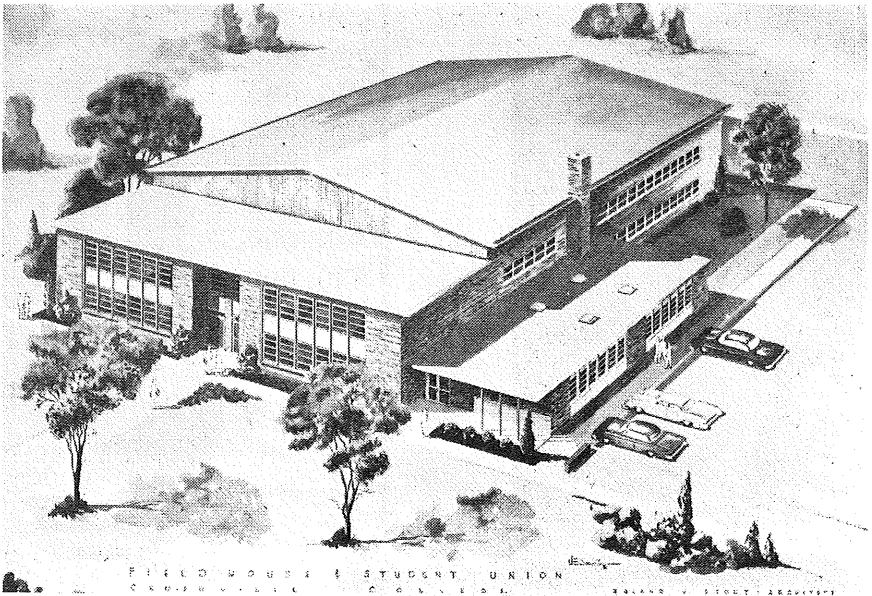

This is the artists conception of the next building authorized by the Cedarville College Board of Trustees. It will be more than a gymnasium.

When the college occupies the new student center, the building now being used as a gymnasium will then become the chapel and auditorium. The present chapel building will then be used for classrooms. The first floor of the new dormitory for men is now being used for a book store, snack bar and student lounge, but these facilities will be moved into the new building

when it is finished. A second floor room in this structure will serve as a banquet hall.

Yes, this new building will be much more than a gymnasium. It will actually provide a banquet hall, student lounge, game room, snack bar, book store, dormitory, chapel, auditorium and classrooms.

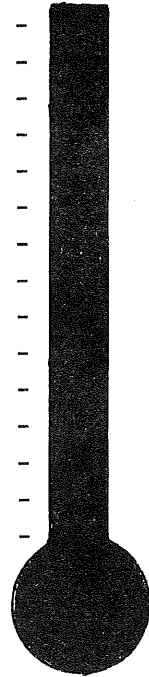

# Jackets Appear Set For Awhile

This report on our 1960-61 basketball team is a reprint from the Xenia Daily Gazette

National Association of Inter-collegiate Athletics (NAIA) received this week the annual report on Cedarville College basketball season which includes Xenia High graduate, Gary Walthall, only a freshman, setting a school record in rebounding with 36 against Ashland College.

Walthall, slowly developing into the ballplayer many fans predicted after watching him help Xenia compile a 22-1 record in 1959-60, averaged 19 rebounds a game for the Yellow Jackets. The 6-7 center played in all 23 games for Coach Don Callan and averaged 12.2 points a game.

Cedarville, although on the short end of a 10-13 record, experienced an exciting and somewhat unpredictable season. Callan's quintet lost eight games by a total of 15 points, including five by only two points. At one stretch, the Jackets were involved in seven consecutive games decided by two or fewer points. During that hectic period, Cedarville beat Findlay 70-68, but lost to Capital (63-62), Huntington

(94-92), Bluffton (72-70), Ashland (72-70), Ohio Northern (81-79) and Wilberforce (75-73).

The Yellow Jackets survived this oddity by winning five of their last eight games and made a gallant effort to reach third place in the Mid-Ohio League. After edging Wilmington for the second time by one point, Cedarville had the misfortune of dropping an 80-75 decision to Ashland and had to settle for fifth with a league mark of 5-7.

Highlight of the season was establishing one of the largest totals of all Ohio colleges during the 1960-61 season when defeating Ft. Wayne Bible, 132-64. In that contest, the Jackets hit 51 field goals and 30 free throws.

Sophomore Norris Smith, a deadly 5-11 shot, led the Jackets with 21.2 points per game. Smith compiled his fine record, playing all 23 games and hitting 45 per cent of his field goal attempts and nearly 80 per cent from the charity line.

Also seeing action in all 23 games were sophomores Dave

Jeremiah and Sam Canine and senior Jim Entner. Jeremiah placed second in team scoring with 392 for a 17 point-per-game average. Canine scored 302 points and Entner 203. Canine holds the team record with most foul shots in one game against Ashland, 11.

Others seeing action for Callan's club this season were John Bigelow, Tom Evans, John Justice, Rodney Lane, Dave Lewis, David Morganto and Ted Ocheltree.

As for the future, Cedarville has a large volume of varsity experienced men to draw upon. Only turnover will be Entner. In fact, if the squad can keep eligible scholastically, it can remain together for quite some time, for of those remaining, only two are juniors.

Cedarville, whose enrollment is near 350 students, has completed plans to build a new field-house next year and will be a serious threat to take the Mid-Ohio League.
