Tonight's Game Preview

The Cedarville University Lady Jackets host the Central State University Marauders tonight in the Callan Athletic Center.

Cedarville enters the game with a record of 17-7 and winners of six straight. In their most recent action, the Lady Jackets held off Urbana University 72-67 in overtime Saturday afternoon - snapping the Blue Knights' eight-game home winning streak.

Central State University, an NCAA II institution and along with CU, charter member of the newly-approved G-MAC, enters tonight's game with a record of 13-10. The Marauders demolished visiting Knoxville College on Saturday by 55-9 final.

The 2011-12 Lady Jacket roster features two players hitting in double figures as well as four players with 77 or more assists.

Kayla Jenerette, a 5-foot-5 sophomore guard, leads the team at 16.4 points per game including a team-high 53 three-point field goals and a .449 mark from long range. Jenerette is tied for CU's second-best mark of 34 steals.

Deborah Gordon, a 5-foot-11 rookie forward, is adding a second-best 11 points per contest while pacing CU with 6.3 rebounds per game. Gordon leads the team with a .527 field goal percentage.

CU's third-leading scorer is 5-foot-5 freshman guard Raegan Ryan tossing in 9.6 points per game. Ryan is tied for second on the team with 34 steals. She is one of two players hitting over .900 from the charity stripe.

Senior Kara Cayton, a 5-foot-4 guard, continues raise the level of her game. She is averaging 7.6 ppg, while leading in steals (41) and assists (84).

Cayton is second on the team with 37 three-pointers and is tied for fourth all-time with 214 long-range baskets.

Sophomore forward Deborah Chandler tossed in a career-high 17 points last Tuesday against Wilberforce and is scoring 6.4 points per game to go with 3.8 rebounds per contest.

Post player Lauryn Robinson, a 6-foot-2 sophomore, is contributing a sixth-best 6.1 points and a third-best 4 boards per game. She has the team lead with 14 blocked shots on the year.

Sophomore guard Becky Orchard also adds 6.1 points and 4 rebounds per game. She has tallied a second-best 80 assists.

Sophomores Heidi Ansel and Danielle Spiliotis are giving solid performances off the bench. Ansel is scoring 4.3 points while grabbing 3.7 boards per game. Spiliotis adds 4 points per game and is the Lady Jackets' second-leading rebounder at 4.1 rebounds per game.

The Marauder roster also features two players scoring in double digits. Iniquia Snell, a 5-foot-7 sophomore guard, leads the way with 14.4 ppg.

Tanija Beasley, a 6-foot junior guard/forward, adds 10.3 points per game and is CSU's leading boarder at 8 rebounds per contest.

Shakeira Lang is Central State's deep threat hitting 28 three-pointers on the year.

Laura Longmire, a 5-foot-8 senior guard, is coming off a 20-point outing in Saturday's win over Knoxville.

Tajha Walker is the top shot blocker with 16 in 2011-12.

The Lady Jackets hold a narrow 17-16 lead in the all-time series with their Greene County. Cedarville dropped Central State earlier this season on January 24 by a score of 78-66 on the Marauders' home court.

Great Midwest Athletic Conference approved as NCAA Division II Conference

February 20, 2012

INDIANAPOLIS - The Great Midwest Athletic Conference (G-MAC) has received notice that the NCAA Division II Membership Committee has approved the G-MAC as a member conference of NCAA Division II effective September 1, 2012.

As a member conference, the G-MAC will now enter an educational assessment program for the 2012-13 academic year with the goal of beginning competition as the 24th active NCAA Division II member conference effective September 1, 2013. Charter members of the G-MAC include Cedarville University (Cedarville, Ohio), Central State University (Wilberforce, Ohio), Kentucky Wesleyan College (Owensboro, Ky.), Trevecca Nazarene University (Nashville, Tenn.), Urbana University (Urbana, Ohio), and Ursuline College (Pepper Pike, Ohio).

Dr. Bill Brown, Cedarville University President and chair of the G-MAC Presidents' Council said, "We are grateful that the NCAA recognizes the quality of the current membership and the potential for the development of an outstanding Division II conference. Every school contributed to achieving this recognition. Now we are ready to take off!"

The G-MAC will work to meet the active member and sport sponsorship requirements established by the membership by June 1, 2013. The Conference will achieve the benchmarks for the 2013-14 academic year with six active NCAA Division II members and by meeting sport sponsorship requirements for five men's sports and five women's sports or four men's sports and six women's sports.

At the point at which the requirements are met, the G-MAC will gain full privileges of NCAA Division II Conference membership, including conference grant distribution, voting rights and representation on the NCAA Management Council and Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.

"We are thankful to the NCAA Division II Membership Committee for



acceptance of the G-MAC as a member conference," said G-MAC Commissioner Tom Daeger. "The approval is a significant milestone in the development of our league and we look forward to advancing the growth of our membership."

"Additionally, the opportunity to complete the educational assessment program during the 2012-13 academic year will provide further support to our development as a model NCAA Division II conference and enable the league to prepare for competition as an active conference in 2013-14."

The G-MAC will begin sponsoring 12 championships in the 2012-13 academic year as it works through the requirements of the educational assessment program. Men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, women's volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf, women's tennis, baseball and softball conference championships will be held for member student-athletes.

"It is our goal to develop a conference that will provide the quality championship experiences and league administrative support expected of a model NCAA Division II conference from the outset," added Daeger. "The opportunity to develop these championships and procedures in advance of our first year as an active NCAA Division II conference will be tremendously beneficial to our office and league members."

The G-MAC, established in 2012, is a NCAA Division II Conference featuring active and reclassifying members in Ohio, Kentucky and Tennessee. Charter members of the G-MAC include Cedarville University, Central State University, Kentucky Wesleyan College, Trevecca Nazarene University, Urbana University and Ursuline College. The G-MAC, headquartered in Indianapolis, will sponsor 12 championships in 2012-13 with intention to begin competition as an active NCAA Division II member conference in 2013-14.

Last Time Out



URBANA, Ohio - Kayla Jenerette scored 20 points, including the last six in overtime, as Cedarville escaped Urbana with a 72-67 road victory to extend its winning streak to six straight.

Jenerette gave the Lady Jackets the lead for good, 68-67, by converting two free throws with 1:36 left. After the Blue Knights missed two charity tosses, the sophomore guard negotiated the paint for a lay-up and then sealed the outcome with two more freebies with 10 seconds on the clock.

Urbana was the last team to beat CU, 79-76, in the Callan Athletic Center on Jan. 28. The Jackets were poised to return the favor leading 36-30 at halftime and opening up a 51-41 spread with 12:45 to play.

The Blue Knights rallied to lead 59-57 at the 2:10 mark. Cedarville recovered and had the final possession in regulation, but a last-second three-pointer was blocked forcing OT.

Jenerette was 7-for-9 at the line and added four assists. Backcourt mate Kara Cayton tallied 14 points, four assists, and six steals for the Lady Jackets, 17-7 overall, who made 17-of-19 free throws as a team.

Urbana, 12-13, had its eight-game homecourt winning streak snapped.

The Lady Jackets will complete the 2011-12 regular season with a contest against the visiting Pioneers of Malone University this Saturday, Feb. 25 at 2:00 p.m. Seniors Kara Cayton and Kathy Jakucki will be honored.

CU is the #1-seed in the Ohio Independent Championship tournament and will host a semifinal game on Friday, Mar. 2 at 5:30 p.m.

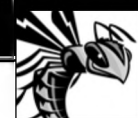

Head Coach Kirk Martin

Kirk Martin has been the head women's basketball coach at Cedarville University since the 2001-02 season and built the Lady Jackets into one of the top NAIA programs in the country. His teams have averaged 27 wins per season during his tenure.

Martin's team made its eighth and final appearance at the 2011 NAIA Division II National Tournament which featured a surprising run to the quarterfinals. CU knocked off perennial powers Saint Francis (Ind.) and Ozarks before losing to unbeaten Davenport to finish the season 24-10.

The Jackets won the school's fifth American Midwest Conference championship in 2009-10 and finished 27-6 overall and 17-2 AMC. The Jackets were ranked No. 5 in the final NAIA Division II poll and ultimately advanced to the second round of the national tournament.

It was the second straight NAIA appearance for the CU women. They also earned an automatic berth in 2009 by finishing second in the demanding AMC.

Martin was able to lead a young Lady Jacket squad to a strong finish and the NCCAA national title in 2008. He was named the NCCAA National Coach of the Year.

Martin guided CU to five straight NAIA Division II national tournament appearances from 2003 through 2007 including back-to-back runner-up finishes in 2004 and 2005. The Jackets sport a 17-8 record at the event with a semifinals achievement in 2007, quarterfinals efforts in 2006 and 2011, and two second round showings.

Martin's club owned the American Midwest Conference titles from 2003 through 2007 assembling an 86-4 record during that timespan. CU ran off three straight undefeated league campaigns in the AMC South Division from 2003 through 2006 which included a conference-record 72-game winning streak.

Cedarville was rated No. 5 in the final 2006-07 NAIA Division II national poll en route to a 27-7 record. They held down the No. 1 position in 2005-06 which was the second straight year that the Lady Jackets accomplished the feat. They rolled to a 29-4 record overall which included a 19-game winning streak.

The Lady Jackets nearly met their ultimate goal of a national title in 2004-05 while posting a 35-2 record. Other highlights that season included an NAIA No. 1 ranking for the final six weeks of the season, a 22-game winning streak, and a second straight 18-0 run through the AMC South Division.

Martin's 2003-04 ball club produced a memorable campaign while being ranked as high as No. 2 in NAIA Division II. Among the team's many achievements were setting a school record for the most wins in a season with a 35-3 record, rolling to a perfect 18-0 league mark, and assembling a school-record 23-game winning streak.

Cedarville had a 31-3 overall record in the 2002-03 season, posted a 21-game winning streak, claimed the AMC South Division with a 17-1 mark, and won the inaugural AMC championship game. The Jackets were ranked as high as No. 3 in the country and qualified for the NAIA Division II national tournament for the first time in school history where the team advanced to the second round.

Martin took over the coaching reigns at his alma mater in 2001-02 and promptly guided Cedarville to a 23-10 record - at the time a school record for the most wins in a single season. The Jackets posted a 15-5 mark to finish 4th in the 19-team AMC. They were the only league school to beat the top three teams in the standings and all three were ranked in the NAIA Division II Top 25. Cedarville qualified for the AMC Tournament and advanced to the semifinals.

Martin came to Cedarville after developing Southeastern High School into one of Ohio's elite Division IV girls' basketball programs. He brought with him an impressive list of credentials produced at a school where he was employed since graduating from Cedarville College in 1976. He earned his master's degree in Educational Administration from the University of Dayton in 1982.

He was inducted into the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998 for his coaching accomplishments.

Kirk and his wife, Vicki, reside in Springfield. The Martins have three married children: older daughter, Amy Fourman, who is a former Lady Jacket volleyball and basketball player, resides in Enon, Ohio with her husband, Aaron, along with their two children; younger daughter, Kelly Mangin, resides in Fairborn, Ohio with her husband, Bryan, and their son; and son, Brent, is a former member of the Yellow Jacket golf and tennis teams, lives in Dayton with his wife, Rachel.

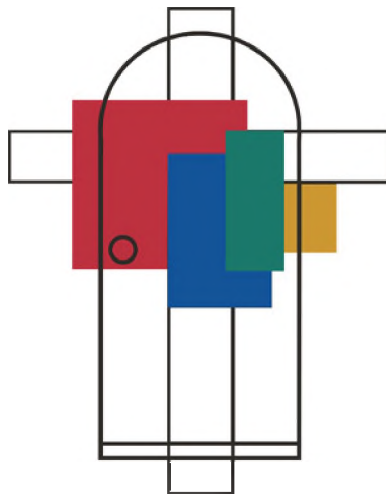

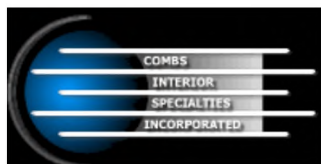
