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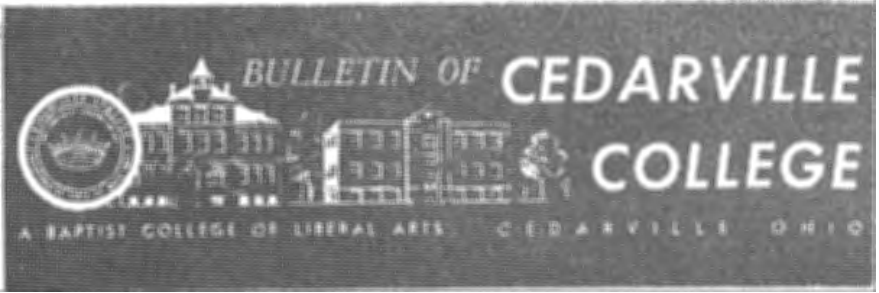


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"FOR THE WORD OF GOD AND THE TESTIMONY OF JESUS CHRIST"

My first trip to Cedarville was an extremely satisfying one. I had heard someone say, concerning our school in Cedarville, "We are going to have a school one of these days."

To me that was the "understatement of the year." I believe we already have a school down there in Ohio.

God has given an unparalleled leadership in Dr. Jeremiah; a distinguished scholarly stature in Dr. Maddox, the Academic Dean, and a sound mature approach to Bible Doctrine in Dr. Arthur Williams. Many other fine men and women have joined this team to give our Baptist cause a liberal arts college of which we may be justifiably proud.

MEET OUR FACULTY

Miss Jean Fisher teaches Christian Education at Cedarville. She graduated from the Baptist Bible Seminary in 1956 with the BRE degree and received the M. A. in Christian Education from Wheaton College in June, 1961. She taught "Methods of Bible Study" during the first term of the 1961 Wheaton College summer school. In relating her personal experience with Christ she states:



"At the age of fifteen I heard the gospel with spiritual understanding. It was then that God gave me the faith to accept His Son as my personal Saviour.

"Following nurse's training at Miami Valley Hospital School of Nursing in my hometown, Dayton, Ohio, the challenge of Christian service caused me to go to Baptist Bible Seminary. I considered seriously the possibilities of missionary service, but the Lord directed my interest and concern to the needs in the area of Christian Education.

"I was challenged by the ever-present need for improved teaching in the local church. Teaching must be improved if individuals are to grow

and mature in Christ. The Lord used needs such as this to direct my interest more and more to teaching Christian Education on the college level. My desire was to see workers trained in Christian Education going into churches to help the teachers improve their teaching methods.

"The Lord opened up the way before me and I was given the privilege and opportunity of teaching at Cedarville College. After teaching two years, I spent a year at Wheaton College completing graduate study towards a Master of Arts degree in Christian Education.

"Upon returning to Cedarville I found it was possible to enlarge the curriculum so that a major in Christian Education could be offered. Cedarville College is now sending out graduates trained to serve the Lord in many areas of Christian Education. Their desire as mine is, is to see individuals come "... unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ."

WHAT ABOUT THE STUDENT CENTER?

To date we have not been able to begin construction on the new gym and student center. Gifts totaling \$12,000 have been received and deposited in the gym account, but this is a long way from being enough to start this building.

The trustees will do everything possible to operate the college on money received from tuition, plus the gifts from the churches. Future development of college facilities, however, must be provided through special gifts.

If you are concerned about the future growth of your college, then give that it may provide better facilities for the many young people who deserve to become students here.
