No, not the kind that you eat. The kind you see in someone's life. The kind that is a product of walking in step with the Spirit.We can produce a variety of different fruit. Galatians 5:22-23 says, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self control; against such things there is no law."

Last Time Out

Kayla Linkous and Deborah Gordon both produced double-doubles as the USA TODAY Division II #25 Lady Jackets downed Ohio Valley, 74-58, on Monday night to clinch the top seed in the G-MAC Tournament.

It took some time for the Jackets to pull away from an OVU side they had blown out by 40 at home in January. A 41-34 halftime lead dwindled to five points early in the second half.

Regina Hochstetler scored six points to fuel a 16-0 explosion resulting in a 61-40 bulge. Cedarville held the Fighting Scots without a point for more than eight minutes and without a field goal for more than nine.

Linkous finished with 22 points and a career-high 14 rebounds. Gordon's numbers consisted of 11 points and 10 boards.

Hochstetler came off the bench to flip in 14 points while Kaysie Brittenham had 10. The Jackets con-

trolled the rebounding, 55-27, but committed more turnovers, 28-12.

Numbers Game:

- Linkous has scored 20 or more points five times this season.
- Gordon's double-double was her first of the year and seventh in her career.
- Hochstetler scored in twin figures for the eighth time.
- The +28 rebound margin was the largest of the year. CU was +26 vs. Ohio Valley at home.
- · However, the -16 turnover difference was also a season-high.



The Lady Jackets will host the six-team 2015 Great Midwest Athletic Conference tournament from March 5-7. Final seeding is still to be determined but as the #1-seed, Cedarville has earned a bye to the Friday, Mar. 6 semifinal at 7:30 pm. The Lady Jackets will face the winner of the #4-seed vs #5-seed game.

The championship game is scheduled for Saturday, Mar. 7 with a 4:00 pm tip-off.

Kourtni Perry has been named the G-MAC Women's Basketball Athlete of the Week after helping her team to a pair of conference wins, one of which was a career night for the junior.

After a four point and four rebound performances against Ohio Valley on Thursday on the road, Perry scored 30 points on 14-21 shooting from the floor in a dominating win against Salem International in Wilberforce.

Perry's 25 rebounds established a new conference record, topping the previous record of 23, set last season by Kayla Parsely of Ohio Valley. Perry was tied with Amy Brooks of Ohio Valley for the season high in rebounds with 17, which she accomplished against Cedarville earlier this year.

Her 30 points - 25 rebound game is the first 30-20 game in league history. The previous best was a 22 point, 21 rebound performance by Jorden Lykes of Davis and Elkins last season.

Perry now leads the league in rebounds with 8.8 per game and moved into the top-20 in scoring with 11.3 points per game. She is second in the conference with a 55.4% shooting percentage.

Head Coach Kirk Martin

Kirk Martin has been the head women's basketball coach at Cedarville University since the 2001-02 season. After building the Lady Jackets into one of the top NAIA programs in the country, he has guided them to a successful transition in NCAA Division II.

Martin's teams have averaged 25.5 wins per season during his tenure. CU has amassed one NCCAA title, two NAIA Division II national runner-up finishes, and six conference championships.

Prior to Martin's arrival, the Lady Jackets had won 20 games in a season twice. He has accomplished the feat 11 times including back-to-back 35-win campaigns in 2004 and 2005.

Cedarville posted an 18-10 record last winter and was 13-3 in the Great Midwest Athletic Conference. The women were among the G-MAC leaders the entire season and advanced to the league tournament semifinals.

The Lady Jackets ended up 20-10 in their first active NCAA season in 2012-13 and posted a 24-8 mark during its NCAA provisional year in 2011-12. CU captured the NCCAA Midwest Region banner each year, was the 2012 NCCAA runner-up, and also claimed the 2012 Ohio Independent Championship title.

Cedarville made its eighth and final appearance at the 2011 NAIA Division II National Tournament which featured a surprising run to the quarterfinals. The Lady Jackets knocked off perennial powers Saint Francis (Ind.) and Ozarks before losing to unbeaten Davenport to finish the season 24-10.

Martin guided Cedarville to five straight NAIA national tournament appearances from 2003 through 2007 including back-to-back runner-up finishes in 2004 and 2005. The Jackets ended up with a 17-8 record at the event with a semifinals achievement in 2007, quarterfinals efforts in 2006 and 2011, and a pair of second round showings.

Martin's club owned American Mideast Conference titles from 2003 through 2007 assembling an 86-4 record during that timespan. CU ran off three straight undefeated league campaigns in the AMC South Division from 2004 through 2006 which included a conference-record 72-game winning streak.

Martin was able to lead a young Lady Jacket squad to a strong finish and the NCCAA national title in 2008. He was named the NCCAA National Coach of the Year. Martin took over the coaching reigns at his alma mater in 2001-02 and promptly guided Cedarville to a 23-10 record - at the time a school record for the most wins in a single season. The Jackets posted a 15-5 mark to finish fourth in the 19-team AMC. They were the only league school to beat the top three teams in the standings and all three were ranked in the NAIA Division II Top 25.

Martin came to Cedarville after developing Southeastern High School into one of Ohio's elite Division IV girls' basketball programs. He brought with him an impressive list of credentials produced at a school where he was employed since graduating



from Cedarville College in 1976. He earned his master's degree in Educational Administration from the University of Dayton in 1982.

Martin coached Southeastern, located just eight miles away in South Charleston, Ohio, to a 297-34 record for a .897 winning percentage during a coaching career that spanned 1986-97 and 1999-2001. He led the Trojans to the Ohio Division IV state championship in 1996, one state runner-up finish, and to 11 Kenton Trace Conference championships including ten straight. Southeastern assembled a 162-game KTC winning streak, won all 11 district title games they ever played in, and advanced to the Division IV Sweet 16 in 11 of his last 12 years.

Martin never had a losing season at Southeastern and earned numerous honors for his team's accomplishments. He was tabbed state Coach of the Year in 1989, was twice named Southwest District Coach of the Year, was a four-time District 9 Coach of the Year, and was a six-time Clark County Coach of the Year. He was inducted into the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998 for his coaching accomplishments.

Kirk and his wife, Vicki, reside in Springfield. The Martins have three children, who are all Cedarville graduates: older daughter, Amy Fourman, who is a former Lady Jacket volleyball and basketball player, resides in Worthington, Ohio with her husband, Aaron, and their three children; younger daughter, Kelly Mangin, lives in Fairborn, Ohio with her husband, Bryan, and their two children; and son, Brent, is a former member of the Yellow Jacket golf and tennis teams, resides in Springfield, Ohio.

Hall of Fame inducts three

Former soccer standout Kristen DeVinney Geyer, basketball All-American Julie Nourse Hudson, and distance running champion Sergio Reyes are the newest members of the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame.

The three were inducted during the 2015 Hall of Fame Brunch on Saturday morning, January 31 in the Stevens Student Center.

GEYER, a product of Perry, N.Y. who currently resides in Cary, N.C., was a member of the first Lady Jacket varsity soccer team. She produced an outstanding four-year career from 1997-2000 in which she was a two-time NCCAA All-American as one of CU's first two players to ever earn the honor her freshman season.

Geyer was a three-time NCCAA Midwest Region performer and was twice voted to the American Mideast Conference team. She still ranks among the Lady Jackets' top five all-time leaders in goals, assists, and points.

HUDSON, who still resides in her hometown of Springfield, Ohio, was a four-time NCCAA All-American during her career from 1997-2001. She was a four-time NCCAA Midwest Region First Team choice and four-time all-conference honoree.

Hudson was the 1998 Mid-Ohio Conference Freshman of the Year. She currently ranks 8th all-time in scoring (1,706) and 8th in rebounding (918).

REYES, a California native who lives in Palmdale, developed a long list of accomplishments during his brief two-year Yellow Jacket career from 2000-02. In cross country, he was a two-time NAIA and NCCAA All-American to go along with the 2002 NCCAA individual title.

On the track, Reyes was the 2002 NAIA outdoor 10,000 meter champion and was a six-time NAIA All-American. He was honored in 2002 as the NCCAA Outdoor Outstanding Performer of the Meet.
