

Nursing . . . Dentistry . . . Pharmacy . . . Medicine . . . The pre-requisites for these vital professions are now being offered at Cedarville College, and more students are taking advantage of the programs each year.


Since Cedarville College was accredited over a year ago, the excellent science and mathematics faculty, along with the well-equipped science building, have attracted students who want a solid Bible education at a Christian college while preparing for careers in the health professions.

Dr. Clifford Johnson, Academic Dean, feels that accreditation was the real impetus for the strengthening of the pre-health professions programs at Cedarville, and that there will be more pre-med and science majors in the next few years.

In order to support the programs at Cedarville and encourage students studying in health-related fields, Chi Theta Pi was organized in October 1975. The idea for the club was suggested to junior biology major Mike Nelson, by a visiting missionary doctor from the Chad. "I saw that unless someone took the initiative and started the club," Mike Nelson reported, "it would be something we should have, but nothing would ever be done about it."

Mike took the responsibility and did the ground work. He is now president of Chi Theta Pi, which boasts 30 members. Other officers are Kent Amstutz, vice president; Donna Radcliffe, Secretary Treasurer; and Dan Dunn, chaplain. Faculty advisor is Dr. Larry Helmick, Professor of Chemistry.

Two Cedarville College alumni have been guest speakers at Chi Theta Pi meetings: Dr. Ken Cole, M.D., who has finished his residency in pediatrics at Children's Hospital in Columbus, Ohio and attended ABWE candidate school this summer for the field of the Philippines; and Dr. Jim

Entner, M.D., missionary doctor to Rojas in the Philippines with the Association of Baptists for World Evangelism.

In an effort to provide practical experience for Cedarville students in health fields, Chi Theta Pi has arranged for teams to go to the Dayton mission clinic to help the volunteer staff. This not only gives students an opportunity to see medicine in action, but gives them a chance to share Christ with the people there. Teams will also be going with Dr. Entner on the weekends to observe the emergency wing of the Miami Valley Hospital and make morning rounds with a nurse. Other planned field trips include visiting Wright State's Medical School, and taking tours of other hospitals and medical schools.

Chi Theta Pi's biggest project this year was sponsoring a Science Fair for students in Christian high schools. This was held on Cedar Day and will be an annual activity for the club. Mike Nelson explained, "We hope

that the Science Fair will expand to the point that Christian schools will have their own elimination contests and the winners will come to Cedarville for the finals."

The Science Fair was developed because of a desire to promote science in the Christian schools and expose prospective students to Cedarville's facilities and programs. Chi Theta Pi has been organized to encourage the students of Cedarville College to consider the exciting field of medicine and allied professions.

The purposes of Chi Theta Pi are to keep students in touch with professionals in their medical fields, distribute information from medical and other professional schools, and to help students realize what God can do through people in various areas of medicine and missions. Club members plan to form a prayer band for medical missionaries.


