Today's Game Preview

Kayla Jenerette's Weekly Blog

The Cedarville University Lady Jackets host the Salem International University Tigers today in a Great Midwest Athletic Conference game in the Callan Athletic Center. Today's contest is the final regular season game of the 2013-14 campaign.

Cedarville, with a 16-9 record (12-3 G-MAC), got back on the winning trail with a 76-56 decision over visiting Ohio Valley on Thursday evening.

Salem International, 4-21 overall with an 0-15 mark in the G-MAC, has dropped 12 consecutive games including a 75-60 verdict at Central State on Thursday night.

Head Coach Kirk Martin, in his 13th year with the Cedarville program, is 329-95 (.776). He has posted eleven 20-win seasons with the Lady Jackets and could post one this year if CU can win today and run the table in the G-MAC Tournament next week.


Cedarville is averaging 76.4 points per game while allowing opponents 71 points per outing. The Lady Jackets continue to pace the G-MAC in FG pct. (.467), three-point FG pct. (375) and assists per game (18.2).

Senior Kayla Jenerette is one of four players hitting in double-digits for CU. The 5-4 guard leads Cedarville with a 15 ppg scoring average. Jenerette, with a fourth-best career .799 mark at the free throw line, is 63-of-81 this year for a .778 effort. She paces the team with 61 three-point field goals and ranks second all-time with 253 long-range shots. Jenerette, with 1,771 career points, is the #5 all-time scorer at Cedarville.



Kaya Linkous, a 5-10 sophomore forward, is Cedarville's second-leading scorer at 12 ppg and rebounder at 5.9 boards per game. She leads the league in field goal percentage at .587 - fourth-best all-time in a single-season at CU.

Junior guard Raegan Ryan is the team's thirdleading scorer at 11.8 points per contest. She paces the squad in assists (129) and steals (41). Ryan has hit a third-best 39 field goals from behind the arc. She tops the G-MAC with 5.4 assists per game and has dished out 34 assists in her last four contests (8.5 per game).





Kaysie Brittenham, a 5-8 sophomore guard, is averaging 7.7 points per game while hitting a second-best 40 three-point field goals with a .435 effort (40-92) - second-highest in the G-MAC.

Salem International, located in Salem, West Virginia, is under the direction of Head Coach Richard Marshall,

Salem is scoring 64.3 points per game while allowing opponents 76 points per contest. The Tigers are hitting .388 from the field including a .239 mark from behind the arc.

The Tigers are led in scoring by senior post player Porcha Davis with 14.8 ppg and a second-best 5.5 rebounds per game. Davis also tops the Tigers with 31 blocked shots and a .447 mark from the field.

The leading rebounder for Salem is junior Whitney McCargo with 6.1 boards per game.

The main deep threat is Marissa Carry with 22 field goals from the behind the three-point line.

Cedarville leads the all-time series with the Tigers by a 5-0 margin including an 84-52 verdict on February 18 in Salem, West Virginia.

CU shot 54 percent in the first half while ending up with a 37-25 lead at the intermission. The Jackets shot 52 percent in the final 20 minutes to stay in control over the Fighting Scots, who had only seven players in uniform.

Raegan Ryan tallied 14 points and seven assists while Kayla Linkous added 14 points. Kayla Jenerette and Lauryn Robinson had 11 points each.

Cedarville had the rebounding edge, 45-32. Deborah Gordon hauled in a game-high nine boards to go along with eight points.

Coach Martin commented, "This is just one of those games that's hard work. You have to feel sorry for OVU, they played hard, but they're down some players right now. We shot the ball pretty well. It just seemed like the whole game we didn't have that knock out punch, but we'll take the win."

Looking Ahead



The Great Midwest Athletic Conference (G-MAC) Tournament takes place next week from March 6-8 at the #1 seed. The host will either be Cedarville or Trevecca Nazarene.

The Lady Jackets must win against Salem International today to have an opportunity to host the tournament. If Ursuline can defeat Trevecca Nazarene this afternoon in Nashville, the Lady Jackets would host. A win by TNU secures the #1 seed for the Trojans.



Head Coach Kirk Martin

Kirk Martin has been the head women's basketball coach at Cedarville University since the 2001-02 season. After building the Lady Jackets into one of the top NAIA programs in the country, he has guided them to a successful transition in NCAA Division II.

Martin's teams have averaged 26 wins per season during his tenure. CU has amassed one NCCAA title, two NAIA Division II national runner-up finishes, and six conference championships.



Prior to Martin's arrival, the Lady Jackets had won 20 games in a season twice. He has accomplished the feat 11 times including back-to-back 35-win campaigns in 2004 and 2005.

Cedarville was 20-10 last winter in its first active NCAA season and posted a 24-8 mark during its NCAA provisional year in 2011-12. The Jackets captured the NCCAA Midwest Region banner each year, were the 2012 NCCAA runner-up, and also claimed the 2012 Ohio Independent Championship.

CU made its eighth and final appearance at the 2011 NAIA Division II National Tournament which featured a surprising run to the quarterfinals. The Lady Jackets knocked off perennial powers Saint Francis (Ind.) and Ozarks before losing to unbeaten Davenport to finish the season 24-10.

Martin guided Cedarville to five straight NAIA national tournament appearances from 2003 through 2007 including back-to-back runner-up finishes in 2004 and 2005. The Jackets ended up with a 17-8 record at the event with a semifinals achievement in 2007, quarterfinals efforts in 2006 and 2011, and two second round showings.

Martin's club owned American Mideast Conference titles from 2003 through 2007 assembling an 86-4 record during that timespan. CU ran off three straight undefeated league campaigns in the AMC South Division from 2004 through 2006 which included a conference-record 72-game winning streak.

Martin was able to lead a young Lady Jacket squad to a strong finish and the NCCAA national title in 2008. He was named the NCCAA National Coach of the Year.

Martin took over the coaching reigns at his alma mater in 2001-02 and promptly guided Cedarville to a 23-10 record - at the time a school record for the most wins in a single season. The Jackets posted a 15-5 mark to finish fourth in the 19-team AMC. They were the only league school to beat the top three teams in the standings and all three were ranked in the NAIA Division II Top 25.

Martin came to Cedarville after developing Southeastern High School into one of Ohio's elite Division IV girls' basketball programs. He brought with him an impressive list of credentials produced at a school where he was employed since graduating from Cedarville College in 1976. He earned his master's degree in Educational Administration from the University of Dayton in 1982.

Martin coached Southeastern, located just eight miles away in South Charleston, Ohio, to a 297-34 record for a .897 winning percentage during a coaching career that spanned 1986-97 and 1999-2001. He led the Trojans to the Ohio Division IV state championship in 1996, one state runner-up finish, and to 11 Kenton Trace Conference championships including ten straight. Southeastern assembled a 162-game KTC winning streak, won all 11 district title games they ever played in, and advanced to the Division IV Sweet 16 in 11 of his last 12 years.

Martin never had a losing season at Southeastern and earned numerous honors for his team's accomplishments. He was tabbed state Coach of the Year in 1989, was twice named Southwest District Coach of the Year, was a four-time District 9 Coach of the Year, and was a sixtime Clark County Coach of the Year. He was inducted into the Cedarville University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998 for his coaching accomplishments.

Kirk and his wife, Vicki, reside in Springfield. The Martins have three married children, who along with their spouses are all CU graduates, and five grandchildren.

Jorden Lykes has been named the G-MAC Women's Basketball Athlete of the Week for the second time this season and the second time in the last month (Feb. 3) after helping her team to

a win over Kentucky Wesleyan before falling to Trevecca Nazarene. In the weekend's first game, a double-overtime win over Kentucky Wesleyan, Lykes scored a game and career-high 31 points on 12-21 shooting. She also led the game with 15 rebounds. Trailing by two points with just seven seconds left, Lykes scored the game-tying bucket on a lay-up leaving just a second on the clock and forcing overtime. Despite not scoring in the first overtime, Lykes scored six of the team's nine points in the second overtime, securing the victory with a rebound and two free throws in the final seconds of a 99-94 win

In the teams loss to Trevecca Nazarene, Lykes totaled a game-high 20 points on 9-18 shooting. She also added seven rebounds and an assist. Here 51 points was the most scored in conference this past week, and her 25.5 points per game also led the G-MAC over the last week.

With her big scoring week, Lykes moved her scoring average to 14.3 points a game, and is now ranked in a tie for third for scoring, 1.1 points behind the league's top scorer. She is also tied for third in rebounding with 7.5 boards a game.




