Tonight's Game Preview

The Cedarville University Yellow Jackets host the Saginaw Valley State University Cardinals tonight in the Callan Athletic Center in the last of a three-game season-opening homestand.

Cedarville is 0-2 on the year after dropping both games last weekend during the Don Callan Classic. The Jackets suffered a 74-72 double-overtime loss to Holy Family on Friday before losing to NCAA II #1 West Liberty by a 105-92 final on Saturday afternoon.

The Cardinals (1-0), NCAA II members of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Association (GLIAC), opened their 2012-13 campaign with an 82-43 thumping of Marygrove on Sunday.

Head Coach Pat Estepp, who is 96-37 in five years at his alma mater, welcomes back all five starters and the team's top eight scorers from a club that was 23-9 last winter during its NCAA provisional year. CU ended the season by winning its first-ever National Christian College Athletic Association banner.

"I believe as long as we can stay healthy we can play with anyone," Estepp remarked. "We have six seniors so we have a lot of experience. Our goal is to make the NCAA tournament and I like to have a tough early schedule to see where we fit in."

Senior Zimmy Nwogbo, a 6-foot-7 forward, returns to guide CU's balanced attack. He averaged team-highs of 13.9 points and 7.5 rebounds last season.

Senior guard Austin Foote (13.0 ppg), junior center Brian Grant (11.7), and senior point guard Zach Brown (10.9) also averaged in double figures. Sophomore forward Bryan Redic developed into the fifth starter and contributed 6.0 points.

No team likes an 0-2 start. No senior likes an 0-2 start. It is difficult to comprehend that as a senior, there is no "next year". Almost every senior that has graduated before me always tells me, "Foote, get it next year" or "You got another year...come back stronger". Well there is no next year for almost half our team. This is it and it hurts. It hurts seeing guys broken and disappointed in that locker room. I have found that after years and years of spilling guts, sweat, and blood on that gym floor, a loss never gets easier. The passion and competitiveness on that floor doesn't allow an "easy" win. However, that same passion and competitiveness doesn't allow for an athlete to dwell on the past. We have no choice but to keep our chin high, our arms still swinging, and our spirits never failing. If we let that happen, we would not deserve to be in that uniform, on that gym, and in that locker room.

This is the bittersweet truth about sports. It builds character at a cost sometimes. I like to ask myself, "Where would I be if failure wasn't part of my life?" It is difficult to say what it would be like, but I do know a few things. I wouldn't know what perseverance entails. I wouldn't know what encouragement sounds like. I wouldn't know what unity feels like. Sure, basketball is only a game and many of these same characteristics can be learned through other experiences in life; however, sports brings these to light in a way that many instances cannot.

As a senior, I am beginning to relish everything. Pointing a finger at your teammate to give them credit for an assist, the hands that pull you off the floor after taking a charge, the fist pump after a big shot, the hard breathing from giving it your all, the pressure at a free throw line, the cheers from your bench after making a stellar play, the approving nod from your coach, the guys who get in your face to make sure you don't give up, the sweat on the floor from diving on that hardwood, the swish of the net, the tears of joy and frustration, the blessing of having a gift that only God can bestow; these are what I will remember and keep close to Hecker, Daniel Hickman and Caleb Maxwell as well as sophomores Marcus Reineke and Leighton Smith all saw action in at least 24 games apiece.

The top newcomer is Jason Cuffee, a sophomore transfer from Division I Wright State. Redshirt freshmen Jason Reep and Mike Woods round out the roster.

Cedarville begins play in the Great Midwest Athletic Conference with home-and-away dates with Central State, Trevecca Nazarene, and Urbana. The schedule also features a mid-December trip to Hawaii to play Brigham Young-Hawaii and Chaminade.

The Cardinals, picked to finish seventh in the North Division of the GLIAC, are led by senior Chris Webb. The 6-foot-1 guard led SVSU in scoring last season at 14.2 ppg and is closing in on 1,000 career points. He was selected to the 2012-13 Preseason All-GLIAC North First Team.



Last Time Out

CEDARVILLE, Ohio - NCAA Division II No. 1 ranked West Liberty made all the right shots in taking down the Yellow Jackets, 105-92, to wrap up the First Don Callan Classic on Saturday, Nov. 10.



The Hilltoppers, 2-0 and top ranked by the NABC, held CU at arms length for most of the contest and then pulled away at game's end to make it a 13-point difference.

A high-scoring affair was expected and that's exactly what the 1,624 fans in attendance got. West Liberty held a 58-52 lead at the intermission.

The margin grew to 11 points midway through the second half and it was still 93-82 at the 6:22 mark. However, the Yellow Jackets made a comeback and got as close as 93-89 with 4:48 left. WLU answered with 10 straight points to end it.

Zimmy Nwogbo exploded for a game-high 29 points for Cedarville, 0-2. Daniel Hickman and Caleb Maxwell both came off the bench with 11 points each.

While the Jackets shored up the field goal shooting overall (.508) and made 24-of-27 free throws for 89 percent, the accuracy from the three-point line was surprisingly low for the second straight night. CU hit on just 4-of-18 long balls for 22 percent.

West Liberty, on the other hand, converted on 57 percent of its shots including a 14-for-30 effort from long range.

The Yellow Jackets travel to NCAA II #8 University of Findlay on Saturday, Nov. 17 with a 3:00 p.m. tipoff. The Oilers fell to visiting #1 West Liberty on Wednesday night by a 90-74 final.

Cedarville returns home on Tuesday, Nov. 20 to host the University of Illinois-Springfield. The game is slated for a 7:30 p.m. start.

On Saturday, Nov. 24 the Jackets travel to Grand Valley State University in Allendale, Michigan for a 1:00 p.m. tangle with the Lakers.



Head Coach Pat Estepp

Pat Estepp has been the head men's basketball coach at Cedarville University since the 2008-09 campaign. He has guided his alma mater to an average of 24 victories per season and four consecutive national tournament appearances.

The Yellow Jackets are coming off of a 23-9 performance in what was their NCAA Division II provisional year. They won the school's first NCCAA Championship banner in convincing fashion after entering the 2012 tournament as the No. 1 seed and winning their three games by an average of 18 points. Estepp was tabbed NCCAA National Coach of the Year.



Cedarville finished strong again in 2010-11 by winning eight of their last nine regular season games including the last five in a row. The Jackets were ranked as high as 14th in the NAIA Division II poll and finished at 20-13.

Cedarville won 16 of its last 18 games in 2009-10 to finish 26-9 and 14-2 in the American Mideast Conference as the league runner-up. The Yellow Jackets, who were rated as high as 8th in the national poll, later won the AMC Tournament and advanced to the second round of the national tournament.

Estepp's inaugural campaign at the helm was full of memorable accomplishments. He guided the Yellow Jackets to a 27-4 overall record and a share of the AMC title with a 12-1 league mark. Cedarville was ranked as high as No. 1 in the country, finished in a tie for the No. 2 spot in the final poll, and advanced to the national tournament.

The Jackets assembled a number of school records which included a 14-game winning streak. They also wiped out all of the previous marks for defense.

Cedarville led the country in field goal percentage defense with opponents shooting just 37.9 percent. They also ranked second nationally by allowing a stingy 60 points per contest which was 10 points per game lower than the old school record.

Estepp's leadership did not go unnoticed. He was voted the AMC Coach of the Year as well as the NCCAA Midwest Region Coach of the Year.

Estepp took on his current position after serving as an assistant coach for eight years under former head coach Ray Slagle. He played a key role during Slagle's successful tenure with the Yellow Jackets from 2000 to 2008.

Cedarville won 177 games during that timespan, averaged 24.1 wins over the last seven seasons, won three American Mideast Conference titles, and two AMC Tournament championships.

The Yellow Jackets made five trips to the NAIA Division II National Tournament where they never lost in the first round. They advanced to the semifinals once, the guarterfinals twice, and to the second round twice.

This is the first head coaching position for Estepp. A 1997 graduate of Cedarville College with a degree in physical education, he was a student assistant at the school during his senior year and went on to acquire coaching experience at all levels of basketball.

Estepp was the 8th grade coach at Cedarville Junior High School in 1996-97. He spent the next year at Clark County Christian High School in Kentucky where he was the varsity assistant boys basketball coach and the head coach in golf and tennis.

Estepp spent the 1998-99 season as the junior varsity coach at Oak Hill (Ohio) High School. He held the same position in 1999-2000 at South Webster (Ohio) High School which is where he graduated from in 1993.

Estepp comes from a rich basketball coaching heritage. His father, Dale, spent 27 years in the profession at Fairfield Union and South Webster high schools.

Estepp also has a master's degree in education from Cedarville University that he earned in 2008. Pat and his wife, Melanie, reside in Cedarville with their three children: sons Isaiah, 11, and Grant, 8, as well as daughter, Merynn, 2.

The Great Midwest Athletic Conference (G-MAC), which was approved by the NCAA Division II Membership Committee in February of 2012 as a member conference effective September 1, 2012, will be working through an educational assessment program with the goal of beginning competition as the 24th active NCAA Division II conference by 2013-14.

The G-MAC features active and reclassifying members from Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia. Charter members of the G-MAC include Cedarville University, Central State University, Kentucky Wesleyan College, Trevecca Nazarene University, Urbana University and Ursuline College. The G-MAC expanded with the inclusion of Alderson-Broaddus College, Davis & Elkins College, and Ohio Valley University as active DII members in 2012.

The University of Virginia's College at Wise was approved as a Full Member, while Georgetown College was added as a Provisional Member in 2012 as well.

The G-MAC, headquartered in the Indianapolis metro area, will sponsor 12 championships in 2012-13 as a NCAA Division II member conference.
