

The new Art Department, under the direction of Mr. J. Emerson Russell, is going forward in a fine way already fulfilling some of the objectives which were projected last year.

The course in beginning drawing shows special promise. The front cover of this issue presents an ink sketch by Miriam Greiner, one of the students in drawing. Ink is one of the media employed in drawing, the others being pen-

cil and charcoal. Because of particular and gratifying effects that can only be achieved in ink, Mr. Russell is employing the medium in some special class exercises in the department.

The advanced students will be drawing from the costumed figure. The students will alternate by modeling each other. Starting with the full length figure, the artists will later draw vari-

ous details of the figure, such as head (portrait), features, etc.

The advanced painting students are now producing studies involving copywork, pure-creation or fantasie, and later on-the-spot landscape studies.

All who visit the college are invited to view the work of the students displayed in the art room.

George Lawlor

Mr. Dale Thomson has returned to Cedarville College this fall after a year's leave of absence, during which time he did graduate work at Ohio State University. While attending Ohio State on a Government Grant from the National Science Foundation, he was able to complete the necessary work for his Master's Degree in Embryology. The degree was granted on August 24, 1962.

Before coming to Cedarville, Mr. Thomson taught in the Miami Christian School in Florida. In 1957 he was called to Cedarville and he is now beginning his sixth year with the college.

Mr. Thomson views higher education as "a must in modern society." He goes on to say, "Higher education permeated with the Christian philosophy is desperately needed in this day and age. Cedarville College is helping to fulfill this need and because of this I am grateful for the opportunity to be associated with this institution."

Mr. George Lawlor, Assistant Professor of Bible, has returned to Cedarville College this fall after a year's leave of absence, during which time he worked on his Doctorate at Grace Theological Seminary. With his residence work now completed, he is working on his thesis and expects to receive his Doctor's Degree next summer.

Mr. Lawlor came to Cedarville in 1959 with 10 years teaching experience and 16 years pastoral experience. In the following paragraphs he tells what the Lord has meant to him.

"Through the years the grace and mercy of God have been something at which I shall never cease to marvel. The Lord's faithfulness to me has been unfailing and unchanging, and His Word continues to be a bulwark of comfort, assurance, and strength, as well as the one and only sound rule of faith and life.

"It is good to be back home again, and to be, once more, a part of the college family. It is my sincere and honest conviction that God has raised up Cedarville College for the training and equipping of Christian young people to contend earnestly for the faith in such a time as this. Hence it is indeed a great and inestimable privilege to serve on the faculty of Cedarville College, and to engage in a service that can only be the result of a definite call.

"I pray that Cedarville College shall remain true to the Word of God and the testimony of Jesus Christ, and that the young people who go from its halls shall be good soldiers of the Lord, remembering that their strength is in the grace that is in Christ Jesus."


