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

FACULTY NEWS

We congratulate two of our faculty members who have earned higher degrees during the past year.

Dr. John Brumbaugh graduated from Cedarville College in 1958. He spent one year at the Grand Rapids Baptist Seminary and then returned to Cedarville to teach in the science department. Following this year of teaching he began graduate study at Iowa State University. On May 25th of this year he received the Ph.D. in Genetics from Iowa State. He has returned to Cedarville to become the head of the science department.

Dr. Brumbaugh has the following to say about God's leading in his life: "As a student here at Cedarville, I was influenced by the Christian atmosphere which permeates its activities. Through the ministry of this school I submitted my life to God's will. Since that time I have been compelled to follow His leading. Since He has returned me to Cedarville as a teacher, it is my prayer and desire that my ministry here will be used to influence young people to serve Him."

Mr. Kenneth St. Clair has been a member of our faculty since September 1959 and is the head of the business department. He received the B. S. degree from the University of Illinois in 1956 and became a C. P. A. in the State of Ohio in 1962. He received the M. S. degree from the University of Illinois in 1963.

Our readers will be interested in his testimony: "I was blessed with the opportunity to write my Master's thesis on local church accounting. It was the first thesis of its kind at the University of Illinois. It is interesting to note that very recently church laymen across the country have become extremely interested in accounting and financial matters of their churches. I trust that in the future I can be of assistance to many local churches in solving their financial problems."

We welcome three new members to our teaching staff.

Rev. Edward L. Greenwood has been pastor of the Calvary Baptist Church of Clendenin, W. Va. since 1955. He received the B. A. from Bryan College in 1951 and the B. D. from the Conservative Baptist Seminary in 1955. He is married and has two children, a daughter, Esther who is fourteen and an eleven year old son Timothy. Mr. Greenwood will be teaching English.

When he was invited to teach at Cedarville he said: "To experience happiness and peace of soul is indicative of being in the Lord's will. This is true in my case, especially when I see how the Lord has so graciously and definitely prepared the way for my coming to Cedarville by taking care of the many details involved. I am thankful and humbled when I consider the opportunity of having a part in the training of so many young people who must have adequate educational and spiritual foundations to meet the demands of present society.

Mr. Maurice J. Knudsen will be teaching in the music department. He received the B. M. E. degree from Northwestern College in Minneapolis in 1959 and the M. M. E. from Drake University in 1963. His wife, Dorothy, is a registered nurse and will serve as the college nurse this year. While completing his Master's degree, Mr. Knudser was the Minister of Music at the Ankeny Baptist Church in Ankeny, Iowa.

When asked about the Lord's leading in his life he said: "I accepted the Lord as my personal Saviour at the age of ten years. While attending the University of Omaha and teaching at the Omaha Baptist Bible College I felt the leading of the Lord into the teaching ministry. During this past summer, through prayer and correspondence with Cedarville College, I have felt the leading of the Lord, and had His peace in my heart in coming to this college to teach. The Lord has been very good to my wife and me!

Mr. Daniel E. Wetzel comes to Cedarville from the Batelle Memorial Institute in Columbus, Ohio. He will teach mathematics and physics. His B.S. degree was received in 1955 from Morehead State College and the M.S. in Nuclear Engineering was granted by the University of Cincinnati in 1963.

Mr. and Mrs. (Phyllis) Wetzel are the parents of four children, Philip 8, Danette 5, Mary 2, and Stephen 1. The Wetzels are members of the Immanuel Baptist Church, Columbus, Ohio where Rev. William Brock is the pastor. Mr. Wetzel has been active in the Jet Cadet program of the church and has served as president of his Sunday School class.

In referring to the Lord's leading in his life he gave this testimony: "I have known the Lord Jesus Christ as my Saviour for nine years, however, it is only in the last two that I have begun to yield my life to Him completely and to desire to know His perfect will in my life.
