## SUMMER SCHOOL

## OPEN LETTER FROM COACH CALLAN



Dear Friends:

Cedarville College athletes are rapidly gaining recognition in this world of competition. Last year, while competing with schools much greater in size, our athletes won honors in basketball, baseball, and track. This year they are making their presence known by the caliber of their playing. These same boys, who have won and are winning athletic acclaim, are also making their marks in the areas of Christian service. We are proud of our 16-2 baseball champions last year, and our present 10-4 record in basketball, but this is not our total program. We have a vast number of students who participate each week in our intramural program and through this program they are developing the traits for a normal Christian life.

We all agree that the ideas of winning and participating are important, but the participation must end soon, and then what will the lasting results be? This question is the real challenge of our hearts.

Our athletes major in many courses of study here at Cedarville and these courses lead to varied avenues of service, but the avenue of service I am concerned with is Phys-

ical Education. This area is often misunderstood, neglected, and even looked down upon. Yet this is probably the most influential position, in respect to teaching, that exists in the public school.

My reason for writing this letter is to challenge young men and women to answer the call of working with young people in this area. Physical Education is not just a play time and it is not just a period to blow off steam. Instead, it is a time of self-realization, a time of developing leadership and courage, and finally, a time of learning to live.

This informal, yet vital program, lends itself to Christian service. We need men and women who are dedicated to serving Christ through the avenue of Physical Education. The message of a life lived and an example set may be accomplished by dedicated Christian Physical Education teachers.

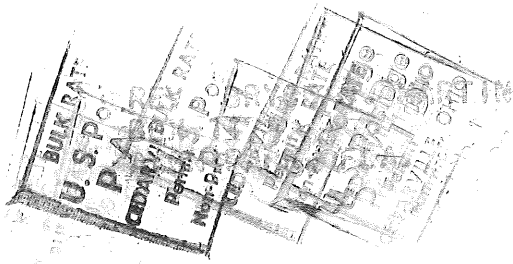
## PROGRESS REPORT ON ACCREDITATION

Just preceding the Christmas holidays, the college faculty met for two full days of concentrated study of college purposes, facilities, program, and plans for the future. These meetings were one of the necessary aspects of ultimate accreditation by the North Central Association, hopefully in 1966.

Cedarville College, an approved agency of the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches, is a member of the Council for the

Advancement of Small Colleges and has been granted recognition by the 50 member Ohio College Association and the State Board of Education.

The step toward full accreditation will enable the college to further serve our Baptist young people throughout the United States and Canada even though graduates and undergraduates have been accepted by major colleges and universities without accreditation.
