We were grieved to hear that Polly (Priscilla G.) Leunk, student of Cedarville College, drowned August 17 at James Lake near Westboro, Wisconsin, where she was spending the summer at a Christian young people's camp as a lifeguard and counselor.

Polly played intercollegiate girls' basketball and would have been a junior this fall majoring in education. Before going to camp, Polly had completed a six-week summer course at Cedarville College.

She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. Harold Leunk of Cleveland and the granddaughter of Mr. George S. Milner, Chairman of the Board of Trustees at Cedarville College.

At the request of the family, contributions are being made to establish a scholar ship fund at Cedarville College. The fund will be called the Priscilla G. Leunk Memorial Scholarship Fund. This perpetual scholarship fund will be used to help other deserving young people to receive a Christian education. As of Sept. 20, contributions to the fund totaled \$1,803.

We share the sentiments of Mr. Milner as expressed in an open letter to his employees, "With her death, the plans and aspirations of herself and her family for a life of Christian service come to an abrupt, tragic end. I can say, with Job: "The Lord giveth and the Lord hath taken away. Blessed be the name of the Lord."

He received his A. B. from Wabash College, Crawfordsville, Indiana, in 1932. In 1945 he attended Butler University as a special student in Greek.


Before coming to Cedarville, he served as a pastor for 28 years. He is beginning his fourth year of teaching biology at Cedarville College.
