

NEW LIBRARY IN 1965?



Pictured above is an artist's sketch of the new ultramodern library to be built on our campus. We are trusting that the Lord will supply the needed \$300,000 in gifts so that construction can start this year. Our present library was built over fifty years ago to house a student body of less than half the size we now have. The students look forward with anticipation to the new library which will provide over three times as much space as our present one.

We now have 22,000 volumes housed on the shelves of a library designed to accommodate 17,000. The new library will enable us to expand our collection to over 80,000 volumes.

An honor roll plaque will be erected inside the new library recording the names of churches and individuals that have given \$1,000 or more to the library before the end of 1965. Many churches and friends of the College have already responded to this need.

The quick response to our bond issue has involved many people investing in the cause of Christian education at Cedarville College. Dr. Jeremiah is presenting to Linda and Jeffrey the bonds that will be used by them to provide for their future education. Their investment also helps make possible facilities to train the students who are now attending Cedarville College.

Linda purchased her bond with money earned by baby sitting and Jeffrey from a paper route.

The basketball team under the direction of Coach Don Callan is off to its most successful season with the sparkling record of 17-2. Their only losses have been to Ohio Northern and Central State of Ohio, a team currently rated second nationally among small colleges by the Associated Press.

The Yellow Jackets are now 5-0 in the Mid-Ohio Conference with three conference games remaining.

Prospects are good for the first conference championship in the history of the school.

A first or second place finish in the conference will guarantee the Yellow Jackets a birth in the N. A. I. A. District 22 Championship play-off. Last year, Cedarville won the play-off and earned the right to go to Kansas City for the 32-team National Championship tourney.

The main scoring thrust was provided by 6' 5" Dozier Carter, 6' 7" Gary Walthall, and 6' 4" freshman sensation Al Knott. Carter recently scored 49 points against Spring Arbor to break the school's all-time one-game scoring record.
