# CEDARVILLE WINS MID-OHIO CONFERENCE



Coach Don Callan's Yellow Jackets captured the coveted Mid-Ohio championship trophy for the first time in the history of Cedar-ville College. Mr. Arthur R. Warren, personnel representative from Marathon Oil Company, who sponsors the trophies, is shown congratulating Coach Callan while cocaptains Dozier Carter and Mark Combs are admiring the latest addition to the trophy case.

This year's basketball team finished with a perfect record of 8-0 in the Mid-Ohio Conference and have an over-all record of 21 wins and 3 losses with one game remaining to be

played. As Mid-Ohio Conference champions, the team is entitled to play in the N.A.I.A. District tournament. The winner of this four-team tournament will travel to Kansas City to compete with 32 other teams for the national championship. This is the second straight year that Cedarville has been invited to play in the N.A.I.A. sectional tournament.

Dozier Carter and Al Knott were named to the N. A. I. A. All-District 22 team. Carter received more votes than any other player and was named to the first team and outstanding freshman Al Knott to the second 5. Gary Walthall was given honorable mention.

Cedarville College dominated the Mid-Ohio All-Conference team by having three players listed, Dozier Carter, Gary Walthall, and Mark Combs.

We are grateful for the honors the team has brought to Cedarville College. We are even more thankful for the many fine comments we have received from people concerning their fine Christian testimony.
