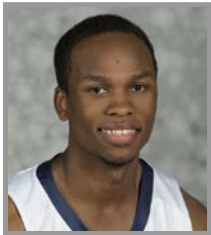

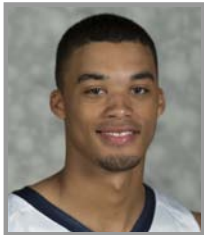

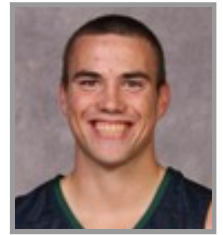

CEDARVILLE, Ohio - J.C. Faubion exploded for a career-high 35 points including 12 in overtime to lead Cedarville to a 90-81 victory over Cincinnati Christian.



J.C. Faubion

Faubion capped a late charge in regulation with a game-tying three-point basket with 4.5 seconds remaining. The Yellow Jackets erased a six-point deficit in the final two minutes to force the extra session.

Faubion banked in his first jumper of the OT to give Cedarville the lead for good. He followed with back-to-back three-pointers to complete a personal run of 11 consecutive points for an 80-72 bulge.



Easton Bazzoli

The junior guard grabbed 10 rebounds to tally a double-double. He finished 12-for-19 from the field overall, 3-for-5 outside the arc, and 8-for-11 at the free throw line.

Easton Bazzoli netted 11 points for the Yellow Jackets, 3-5, who won for the third straight time. Justice Montgomery had 10 points.

Numbers Game:

- Faubion had matched his previous career-high of 24 points four days earlier vs. Ohio Christian.
- CU went 8-for-8 from the free throw line in the overtime.
- The Jackets had the rebounding edge, 44-30.
- Cedarville leads the all-time series vs. Cincinnati Christian, 5-0.

Looking Ahead 

The Jackets play at Lake Erie College in Painesville, Ohio on Tuesday, Dec. 15 at 7:30 p.m. Cedarville visits Walsh University on Wednesday, Dec. 16 for 7:30 p.m. tip-off against the Cavs.

CU hosts Grand Valley State University on Saturday, Dec. 19 for a 4:00 p.m. game with the Lakers before the Christmas break.

The Yellow Jackets close out the 2015 portion of the schedule with an exhibition game at NCAA Division I Cleveland State on Tuesday, Dec. 29 with a 7:00 p.m. start against the Vikings.

GREENWOOD, Ind. - Davis & Elkins junior guard Kevin Bracy-Davis was named the fourth Great Midwest Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Athlete of the Week on Monday.

The Senators continued to surge under first-year head coach Nick Patella, racking up non-conference wins against West

Virginia Wesleyan and Chowan, two opponents with a combined 9-3 record prior to facing D&E.

Bracy-Davis, the G-MAC's current leading scoring king at 20.4 points per game, was electric in his latest exploits with averages of 21 points, 7 rebounds and 3.5 blocks per game while making a staggering 16 of 20 shots from the field.

After losing their first four to begin the 2015-16 campaign, Davis & Elkins is enjoying a three-game win streak, including its first under the Patella era in overtime vs. Urbana.

Bracy-Davis has been the team's leading scorer in five of his team's seven games and the talented combo guard has gotten it done on both ends of the floor.

At West Virginia Wesleyan, Bracy-Davis carved out 18 points along with four three-pointers and was a rebound shy of a double-double. In 37 minutes of court time, he also had three blocks, two assists and a pair of steals.

Bracy-Davis was 7-of-9 from the field and had four additional makes at the charity stripe.

On Saturday, his red-hot shooting continued with a near-perfect 9-of-11 mark with five more three-point baskets drained. He pulled down five more rebounds and swatted four more shots while playing the maximum 40 minutes.

In seven games, Bracy-Davis is first in the conference in scoring, tied for seventh in three-point field goal percentage and ranks fourth in blocks.

Head Coach Pat Estep

Pat Estep has been the head men's basketball coach at Cedarville University since the 2008-09 campaign. He has guided his alma mater to an average of 20 victories per season and five national tournament appearances.

The Yellow Jackets' first active season in NCAA Division II resulted in a 22-9 mark in 2012-13. Estep was voted the Great Midwest Athletic Conference Coach of the Year as his team claimed the G-MAC regular season title, the G-MAC Tournament trophy, and placed third in the NCCAA Championship.

Cedarville was 23-9 during its NCAA provisional year in 2011-12. They won the school's first NCCAA Championship banner in convincing fashion after entering the 2012 tournament as the No. 1 seed and winning their three games by an average of 18 points. Estep was tabbed NCCAA National Coach of the Year.

Cedarville finished strong again in 2010-11 by winning eight of their last nine regular season games including the last five in a row. The Jackets were ranked as high as 14th in the NAIA Division II poll and finished at 20-13.

Cedarville won 16 of its last 18 games in 2009-10 to finish 26-9 and 14-2 in the American Midwest Conference as the league runner-up. The Yellow Jackets, who were rated as high as 8th in the national poll, later won the AMC Tournament and advanced to the second round of the national tournament.

Estep's inaugural campaign at the helm was full of memorable accomplishments. He guided the Yellow Jackets to a 27-4 overall record and a share of the AMC title with a 12-1 league mark. Cedarville was ranked as high as No. 1 in the country, finished in a tie for the No. 2 spot in the final poll, and advanced to the national tournament.

The Jackets assembled a number of school records which included a 14-game winning streak. They also wiped out all of the previous marks for defense.

Cedarville led the country in field goal percentage defense with opponents shooting just 37.9 percent. They also ranked second nationally by allowing a stingy 60 points per contest which was 10 points per game lower than the old school record.

Estep's leadership did not go unnoticed. He was voted the AMC Coach of the Year as well as the NCCAA Midwest Region Coach of the Year.

Estep took on his current position after serving as an assistant coach for eight years under former head coach Ray Slagle. He played a key role during Slagle's successful tenure with the Yellow Jackets from 2000 to 2008.

Cedarville won 177 games during that time span, averaged 24.1 wins over the last seven seasons, won three American Midwest Conference titles, and two AMC Tournament championships.

The Yellow Jackets made five trips to the NAIA Division II National Tournament where they never lost in the first round. They advanced to the semifinals once, the quarterfinals twice, and to the second round twice.

This is the first head coaching position for Estep. A 1997 graduate of Cedarville College with a degree in physical education, he was a student assistant at the school during his senior year and went on to acquire coaching experience at all levels of basketball.

Estep was the 8th grade coach at Cedarville Junior High School in 1996-97. He spent the next year at Clark County Christian High School in Kentucky where he was the varsity assistant boys basketball coach and the head coach in golf and tennis.

Estep spent the 1998-99 season as the junior varsity coach at Oak Hill (Ohio) High School. He held the same position in 1999-2000 at South Webster (Ohio) High School which is where he graduated from in 1993.

Estep comes from a rich basketball coaching heritage. His father, Dale, spent 27 years in the profession at Fairfield Union and South Webster high schools.

Estep also has a master's degree in education from Cedarville University that he earned in 2008. Pat and his wife, Melanie, reside in Cedarville with their three children: sons Isaiah, 14, and Grant, 11, as well as daughter, Merynn, 5.

GREENWOOD, Ind. – The Great Midwest Athletic Conference announces that the basketball games between Cedarville and Trevecca Nazarene on Saturday, Feb. 6, 2016, will air on the American Sports Network as part of the NCAA Division II Game of the Week package.

The men's and women's games between the Yellow Jackets and Trojans in Nashville will represent the G-MAC's first American Sports Network broadcast in any sport.

"The Great Midwest Athletic Conference is thankful that two member institutions will be highlighted this season in the American Sports Network's Division II Basketball Showcase," said G-MAC Commissioner Tom Daeger.

"This contest will provide great attention to the talents of our student-athletes and offer exposure for conference rivals Trevecca Nazarene and Cedarville. It will be a great day of basketball in Nashville when these four teams square off on February 6."

The women's game is set for 2:00 p.m. EST and the men's game will start after around 4:15 p.m. EST inside the Trojan Fieldhouse. Nashville is located in the Central Time Zone.

This will be Cedarville and Trevecca Nazarene's second meeting of the regular season. Both teams are also scheduled to play each other on Saturday, Jan. 2, in Cedarville.

"First, we are honored to be the first G-MAC institution selected to host a Division II National Showcase broadcast," said Trevecca Nazarene Director of Athletics Mark Elliott. "It is an opportunity to represent our community, Trevecca and Nashville, but we realize along with that comes responsibility.

"Similar to when we made the move to NCAA Division II, we will lean on support from the greater Trevecca and Nashville community," Elliott added. "We'll look to our administration, marketing, faculty, Moore Maniacs, alums along with our great friends who are connected to Trevecca. To make this a great showcase, it will take the full support of the Trevecca and Nashville community. We are looking forward to the challenge."

The Cedarville and Trevecca Nazarene women's programs have battled it out and finished first and second in the G-MAC standings, respectively, in each of the past two years.

TNU has assembled back-to-back 14-2 league records in 2013-14 and 2014-15 while the Yellow Jackets marched to the conference's first NCAA Championship Midwest Regional at-large selection in 2014-15 with a 27-4 overall record.

After beating then-No. 19 Alabama-Huntsville, the Trojans' men made a name for themselves on a national level early this year. Cedarville's men have won three straight at the time of release and are quickly developing rising young talent.

Additional information will be made available at a later time about which markets will carry the games. For those outside the regional market, both games will also be streamed live on NCAA.com.

The American Sports Network has reached agreements to distribute its broadcasts to regional cable networks that will make it available in 94 million of the nation's 113 million TV homes.

Cedarville, Davis & Elkins Honored Again for Academic Success Rates



INDIANAPOLIS – Cedarville University and Davis & Elkins College headlined the Great Midwest Athletic Conference with Academic Success Rates of 90 percent or higher as released by the NCAA on Wednesday.

Cedarville and Davis & Elkins are among 27 NCAA Division II schools to be honored part of the Presidents' Award for Academic Excellence, now in its fifth year.

This is the third consecutive year that both Cedarville and D&E have received the Presidents' Award for Academic Excellence.

D&E had a reported ASR of 94 with UC-San Diego, Assumption and Seattle Pacific, while Cedarville's ASR of 91 tied four other schools.

For the first time, the University of the Sciences in Philadelphia led Division II with an Academic Success Rate of 99 percent, followed closely by Saint Michael's College, Point Loma Nazarene University and Bentley University, all of which achieved a 98 percent ASR.

For the second straight year, the Northeast-10 led Division II's 24 conferences in ASR rates, with five athletics programs posting scores of 90 percent or more.

The G-MAC ranked fifth among all 24 Division II conferences with ASR's of 90 percent or more.

"We are pleased by the increasing number of Division II schools whose student-athletes are earning Academic Success Rates of 90 percent or higher," said Judy Bense, president of the University of West Florida and chair of the Division II Presidents Council. "These schools and their students demonstrate the utmost dedication to success in the classroom and on the field, and we are proud of their efforts."

The Academic Success Rate is the percentage of student-athletes who graduate within six years of initial enrollment in college and includes virtually all Division II student-athletes, including transfers and those not receiving athletics scholarships.

The Division II ASR also captures about 51 percent more college athletes than the federal graduation rate. Unlike the federal graduation rate, the ASR also counts student-athletes who transfer to a school after initial enrollment elsewhere and removes from the rate student-athletes who leave school while academically eligible. The national ASR is 71 percent for student-athletes who entered college from 2005 through 2008.

Regardless of which measure is used, Division II college athletes graduate at a higher rate than the general student body. The federal rate for the 2008 entering class of student-athletes was 55 percent, compared to 49 percent for the general student body.
