1981-82 SBP Outlined

In a surprise move today, newly elected Student Body Project Chairman, Geoff "the Man in Black" Walker released plans for the 1981-82 Project. For the first time ever, Cedarville College will hold a die-a-thon.

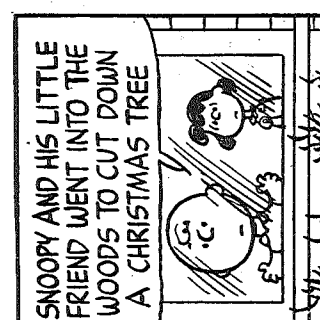
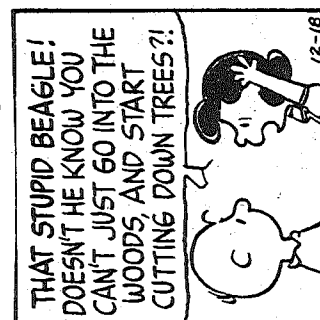

Eat all you want and not gain weight

The most perfect way imaginable to lose weight has been discovered at the University of Illinois. Imagine eating all the pastries, chocolate and pizza one wanted without gaining weight.

A drug called perfluorooctyl bromide can be used to coat the stomach so that food cannot be absorbed. The drug does not accumulate in body tissue because its molecular structure is too large to enter the tissue.

Sarfer Niazi, an Illinois pharmacologist, has been using the drug on rats, which lost weight after being given the treatment. The weight lost experienced by the rats is equal to humans losing eight pounds per week.
