MEET THE COACHES

Coach Don Callan. . .

With five years maturity and progress behind him, Coach Callan states he is looking forward to this year of rebuilding. Over the past five years, Callan's record at Cedarville has been improving each year, with last year's 23-4 mark being tops. His overall record at Cedarville is 71 wins and 48 losses.

Mr. Callan attended Taylor University in Upland, Indiana. From 1952-55, he had the honor of being voted the most valuable player on the university football team three times. (This being quite a feat as he never participated in high school football). In the 1954-55 season, he was voted to the all-state and the all-Hoosier conference team. This same season he led all Indiana's colleges in scoring as he hung up a total of 86 points, which was good enough to be third in the nation in scoring for small colleges. He led the state of Indiana in rushing and set a Taylor scoring record and topped this fine season by being approached by the Los Angeles Rams of the N. F. L.

As a basketball player at Taylor, Callan played on two conference champs and was a member of the starting five for three years. In 1955 he made a whirl-wind tour of the Orient with Coach Don Odles' Venture for Victory team, playing some 80 games in Japan, Korea, Hawaii, Formosa, etc.

Upon graduation from Taylor University, Coach was chosen as the outstanding all-around athlete and as the athlete bringing the most honor to Taylor through athletics.

Call anticipates a rebuilding year, but will concede nothing until each game is played and either won or lost. He states that "these boys will give a good account of themselves before the year is out." Assistant Marc Combs. . . .

Marc has taken over the assistant position while finishing work toward his degree. Mark played basketball in high school at Fairmont West, Dayton, Ohio, under Coach John Stuckey.

After high school, Marc attended Sue Bennett Junior College in Kentucky for two years, then transferred to Cedarville. Upon coming to Cedarville, Marc found himself a starting position with the Yellow Jackets. His junior year found him usually defending the opponents' toughest man, yet Marc found time to throw in 13 points per game. He also holds a record of 15 steals in one game.

As captain, Marc led the Yellow Jackets to a N. A. I. A. district championship and a trip to the National tournament. As a senior, Marc again was captain and contributed greatly to Mid-Ohio Conference championship (8-C) and a season record of 23-4.

Marc is expected to be a great asset to Cedarville's basketball program.

AL KNOTT - 6'4", 210 lbs., Sophomore, East Moline, Illinois. A high school All-American, Al proved his worth last year as he contributed 19 points per game to the Jackets 23-4 cause. Al appears to be Cedarville's next All-American candidate. He has exceptional speed, agility, and good size; a good combination for any sport.

LARRY RICHARDSON - 6'1", 160 lbs., Senior, Livonia, Michigan. Larry is the Jackets' captain for the 1965-66 season. Larry contributed 8 points per game last year. He is known for his sharp passing and brilliant defense; this year's leader.
